Economic Security

Build our Economic Wealth

Over the year, we continued to build fiscal awareness and responsibility. The year-round monthly Money Monday\$ series featured topics of interest on financial matters. The series attracted the participation of up to and sometime more than **100** community members who were interested in how to build and expand their financial future. Topics included securing real estate, estate planning, saving, college planning, and investing.

We also supported a partnership with ***Dress for Success*** as they continue to work with women who are re-entering the workforce by providing clothing/wardrobe and workforce development workshops.




Economic Security

Childhood Hunger Initiative Power Pack(CHIPP)

Working with our long-time partner, Barnard Elementary School (ES), a Title 1 school located in Northwest Washington DC, we provided food insecurity support for **135 students** through the **Childhood Hunger Initiative Power Pack (CHIPP)** program. In anticipation of school breaks, extra food items are included in the weekly Power Packs distribution. Over longer breaks during the holiday season, family-size food items are included. More than **4,000** Power Packs were distributed during the school year of **37 weeks**.




CHIPP Student Recipients 2024



Education

Read at Home

In 2023, DC Pearls III Foundation President, Arnitra Duckett, introduced a NEW signature program called “Read at Home,” with the goal of expanding literacy by building home libraries. Each month, CHIPP students have the opportunity to receive a grade appropriate, culturally relevant book to take home, adding twelve (12) books to their home library annually. In 2024, over 1,200 books were given to our CHIPP students and at the end of the year, each of the **600** students at Barnard Elementary School (DC) also received a book for a total of over **1,800** books and increase of close to **300%** from the 2023 programming year



In 2024, our HBCU college scholarships provided vital financial assistance to academically excellent, civically engaged, and leadership-driven high school graduates from Washington, D.C. as they embarked on their journeys at Historically Black Colleges and Universities. We proudly champion these exceptional students, recognizing their immense potential and eagerly anticipating their future contributions as they shape our world as we awarded over **\$35,000** in education funds.

Our annual HBCU Scholarship application will open in February 2026 at dcpearlsiii.org. If you or someone you know will be a freshman at a Historically Black College or University in Fall 2026, we encourage you to apply for this life-changing opportunity.




Education

HBCU Tour

DC Pearls III continues to support the educational advancement of DC students. Over the last 28 years, the foundation has hosted an HBCU College Tour that exposes students to life beyond high school. In November 2024, **42** students traveled south to explore and tour eight (8) colleges/universities. The students learned about college life, were afforded the opportunity to submit on-the-spot applications, and speak with admissions counselors.



Education

Youth Leadership Institute (YLI)

Through the Youth Leadership Institute (YLI) **32** motivated young men and ladies participated in leadership development courses in three core modules: Foundations of Leadership, Exploration and Self-Expression, and Purpose-Driven Success. Through hands-on activities, thoughtful discussions, and taking on leadership roles, they built essential skills and took ownership of their growth.

From goal setting and business planning to tackling bullying and leading political discussions, they shaped every aspect of the program. Their final presentation captured the impact of their journey—earning **1st place** in the North Atlantic Region.



Environmental Equity

Enhance our Environment

As we continue to protect our environment, we focused on trees, gardens, and recycling. Members partnered with Casey Trees to plant 12 trees around the city, cleaned up garden beds at Barnard ES on Earth Day, and planted flowers at Sojourner Truth Public Charter School. During the Spring and Fall Shred Days, we diverted **6,000** pounds of paper and **3,000** pounds of recyclables from landfills. We also held two community clean-up days to help keep D.C. neighborhoods clean and green.




Advocacy

Advocate for Social Justice

2024 marked the year of a historic Presidential Election and the focus on civic engagement and advocacy to protect our democracy spanned across the district. Through community outreach, **79** new voters were registered, a polling site was adopted, and vital voting information helped to educate thousands of people. Locally, we partnered with DC AKA chapters to host City Council candidate forums and a community discussion with the DC Chief of Police. We also advocated for reauthorizing the Farm Bill, highlighting its anti-hunger and nutrition programs. In collaboration with YLI and partners like Union Wesley AME Zion Church and Win With Black Women, we hosted voter forums, a postcard campaigns, and an election night watch party. .

Townhall with Chief of Police: Did the event meet your expectations?




83.3% of Police Chief Town Hall participants found the event “more or much more than expected.” (denoted in blue)

Strategic Plan

Our strategic plan is more than a document—it's a forward-thinking roadmap that drives the vision and priorities of DC Pearls III. Through energizing and collaborative planning workshops, members took a deep dive into our work—celebrating what's thriving, challenging what needs improvement, and letting go of what no longer serves our mission.

The result? A powerful five-year strategic plan designed to guide smart decisions, fuel fundraising, and strengthen programs and operations. A recent assessment helped us refine our goals and sparked fresh ideas for new fundraising streams—ensuring we stay agile, focused, and ready for what's next.

Risk Management

DC Pearls III Foundation developed and implemented a comprehensive Risk Management Plan designed to evaluate and address potential risks that could affect our initiatives, programs, events, and overall operations. This strategic framework outlines the processes for identifying, assessing, managing, and continuously monitoring risk. It defines accountability by assigning responsibility for each area of risk and establishing regular review intervals. Our mitigation strategies encompass a broad spectrum of risk categories, including reputational, operational, financial, and event-related health and safety considerations—ensuring that we uphold the highest standards of integrity, preparedness, and organizational resilience.

Building Acquisition

In our pursuit of a lasting and impactful presence within the communities we serve, in 2021, DC Pearls III Foundation proudly launched a building campaign to establish a permanent home for our work. By December 2024, through a spirited fundraising effort, we surpassed **\$60,000** in contributions. To ensure this vision continues to evolve with purpose, we engaged our members through a comprehensive survey and are now thoughtfully exploring innovative funding avenues to transform our dream space into a vibrant reality.



Grants

With a steadfast commitment to advancing our mission, we are actively seeking grants that align with our core values and strategic priorities. These efforts are focused on supporting program implementation, capital development, and essential operational needs. To spearhead this endeavor, we have formed a dedicated grants committee charged with thoughtfully identifying and securing meaningful funding opportunities that will sustain and expand our impact. In 2024, the grants committee outlined three (3) goals that align with our operations in support of our mission:

- Identify a grant strategy for executing and securing external grants;
- Determine how to support the community through a micro-grant strategy;
- Secure a “grant-trolling tool” to identify funding opportunities.

Operational Effectiveness



Audit

In our ongoing commitment to transparency and fiscal accountability, DC Pearls III Foundation commissioned an independent external audit of its financial statements. This audit was conducted by Select Arc, LLC, who offered a Qualified Opinion of the 2022 finances. Conducted in accordance with rigorous professional standards, affirmed that as of December 31, 2022, our financial position, changes in net assets, and cash flows were in compliance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. This validation underscores our steadfast dedication to responsible stewardship and financial integrity. Internal audits for the 2023 and 2024 fiscal years are currently being conducted.

Upon full capitalization, the DC Pearls III Foundation Educational Scholarship Endowment will serve as a sustainable funding source for our annual scholarship awards, ensuring continued investment in the academic futures of deserving students.



Building Acquisition

A dedicated interest-bearing account has been established to support the future acquisition of property, enhancing our capacity to deliver impactful operations and community service programs.

Fundraising serves as the cornerstone of our nonprofit mission, fueling the financial resources that sustain our vital community programs and scholarship initiatives. The support we garner empowers us to broaden our impact and invest in innovative approaches to meet the evolving needs of those we serve. The fundraisers outlined below represent the primary sources of funding that make our work possible.



The Biennial **Pearl Ball Cotillion**, a signature program through which our debutantes engaged in a series of enriching workshops focused on social grace, personal development, career readiness, and educational advancement—all while raising critical funds to support their collegiate aspirations.



Our annual **Treasured Pearl Luxe Raffle** offers supporters an exciting opportunity to win one of three curated prize packages valued between \$1,000 and \$3,600—with each \$20 ticket purchase directly supporting our mission-driven work.



Our signature year-end fundraiser, the **Jazz Brunch Auction**, is a sophisticated afternoon brunch coupled with lively bidding on curated auction items, boutique-style shopping with local vendors, and vibrant entertainment by a live band and DJ.

Targeted giving day campaigns further diversify our income through social media postings by our members. We also provide donors with the opportunity to give to some of our specific programs.

DC Pearls III continues to maintain a strong financial position. Our financial stability results from strong financial management that positions us to not only fund our community service programs appropriately but it also affords us the opportunity to consider increasing our scholarship awards.



