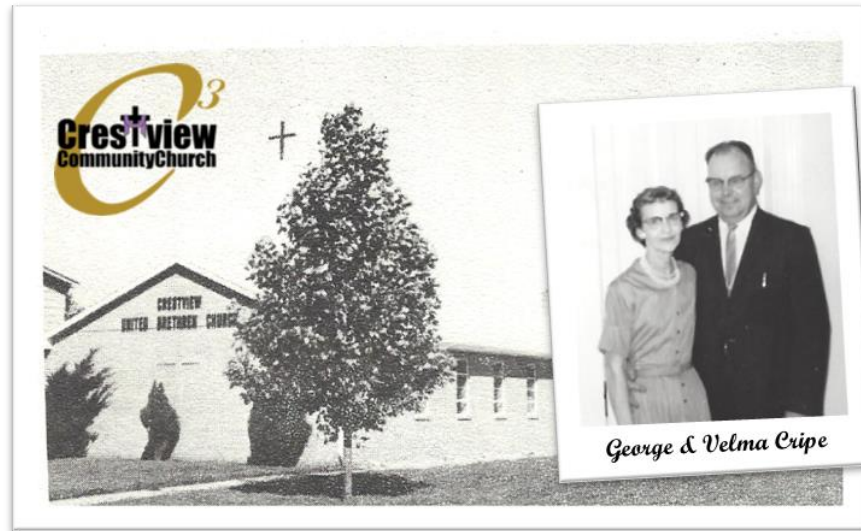
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The C3 Story

Crestview Community Church History:



Crestview Community Church, formerly Crestview United Brethren Church, held its first church service on September 3, 1956, in the basement of Reverend George Cripe's home located at 2416 Lafayette Drive near Crestview Ct. in Lafayette, Indiana. The new church was officially organized on December 29, 1956, with six charter members. The church moved into a new building located at 2417 South Ninth Street, on August 15, 1958, and remained in that location for nearly 15 years. In February of 1973, the original church building on 9th street was sold, while a new building was being constructed on roughly 14 acres located at 1400 Ortman Lane in Lafayette. The church met temporarily at Central Catholic High School and moved into the new facility on February 2, 1975. Crestview Preschool was also established as a weekday ministry of the church in 1975. Crestview United Brethren Church continued in operation until July 21, 2014. At that time, the Board of Governance and the members of Crestview United Brethren Church elected to become an independent, non-denominational church. The Church was renamed Crestview Community Church and at that time also became known as C3. In 2008 the church initiated a generosity campaign to add the community room, as well as additional office and classroom spaces. In 2011 the church acquired two portable buildings to provide additional classroom space for youth ministry. 2018 was a marked moment as the church launched another generosity campaign to add additional parking, remodel the sanctuary, build additional office space, create a café-classroom space and remodel the foyer area and Sunday school classroom.

What does C3 stand for?

Many people assume that C3 stands for Crestview Community Church, and they would be right! However, the 3 C's are also there to remind us of our purpose as a church. At C3 we believe that a *great commitment to the Great _____* and the Great *_____* done with great *_____* will grow a great church.

Why Membership?

There are both _____ reasons why church membership is important.

Spiritual reasons for church membership:

In 1 Corinthians Paul doesn't say the church is *like* a body. He says the church *is* a body. The phrase he uses to describe the individual connectedness is that we are "members of the body". Therefore, the word "member" in the Bible is more closely related to the medical word for "member" than it is to the common cultural understanding of one who subscribes to a service or club.

As an example, some who has lost a finger in an accident, on that unfortunate day, they became a *dismembered* person. Similarly, and sadly, it is common for people to become separated (*dismembered*) from the body of believers. At C3 we are seeking to help every person connect and embrace the importance of their personal membership within the body of Christ (*the church*). We see membership not simply as an opportunity to be part of a club, rather it is a way for a believer in Christ to live in _____ to Christ and the church.

Below are three things that help us understand why church membership is biblical and important.

We find in Paul's letters to the church at Corinth that they were putting people *out* of the body. So, Scripture teaches that we can be a *part of* the body, and we can be *apart from* the body. It is difficult to get around Scripture when it talks about being brought into the body and also being put out of it. And yet for most churches there is no way to put somebody *out* because they are not even *in*. While there seems to be flexibility according to various bodies, there is no such thing in the New Testament as a church without some recognition of belonging (of membership) to the community. People need membership commitment because they need to be connected to a Christian community.

Membership in the church is a reflection of membership in God's family.

Membership is not just for the sake of the faith community; it is also for the sake of the individual. _____ Christianity is a myth and a damaging pursuit. A Christian without a church home is like a child without a family.

God makes us a part of His larger family when we are born again (John 3:3-5), therefore each of us should make a covenant connection within a local body and live in community with them as family. In the family we agree to live by certain established godly principles and standards. While membership doesn't save us, it does enable us to grow and become _____ in Christ.

Practical reasons for church membership:

Our church is a federally incorporated non-profit 501c3 organization, and its members vote and provide a layer of accountability regarding the church's budget and other major decisions. Membership, according to organizational by-laws, also serves as the pool from which our organizations officers are chosen for governance and legal purposes.

Membership Requirements

Below is a list of requirements or prerequisites for becoming a formal member of C3.

- Accept Christ as your _____ Savior and Lord.
- Water Baptism is a second requirement for membership at C3. Water Baptism and a public profession of faith in Jesus as Savior and Lord is an important step in the life of every person who believes in Jesus. Those who were baptized as infants, or before they were able to make an informed decision, will be required to be baptized as a way of demonstrating their individual _____ to follow Jesus and as their own profession of faith in Christ as Lord and Savior.
- To become a member of Crestview Community Church you must at least be ____ years old.
- Anyone desiring membership should be a regular attendee at C3 for at least ____ months before taking the membership class.
- All who seek membership will agree to and sign the C3 membership _____ and align with C3 Articles of Faith.
- To become a member, you must _____ a Membership Class.

Membership Affirmation by the Board of Elders

Each person who meets the requirements for membership, and signs the membership covenant, will be presented by name to the C3 board of elders for a simple vote of affirmation of acceptance to membership at the next board meeting beyond the attended membership class date. Membership by those who have signed the covenant will be considered provisional until the board affirmation vote of acceptance. New member names will be shared with the congregation at the annual church membership meeting.

Salvation Explained

Salvation and Baptism are two experiences of faith that are closely linked in the Bible. Let's look at each one individually and then we'll see how they go together! Below are is a simple explanation of salvation known as the A,B,C's of salvation. Let's walk through this simple way of understanding the Gospel (the good news about Jesus).

Admit what you have done wrong and ask forgiveness.

Romans 5:8 But God demonstrates His own love for us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

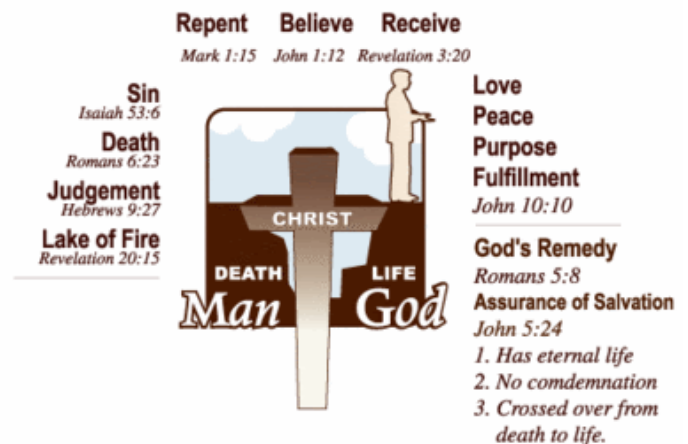

Understanding Baptism

At C3 we expect that all who accept Jesus as savior and Lord will seek an opportunity to be water baptized.

Baptism - An _____ expression of an _____ reality. Baptism is an ordinance of the church. An outward rite ordained by Jesus Christ symbolizing an inner spiritual condition that already exists.



What is symbolized in baptism?

At C3 we believe that baptism is an outward sign of an individual's personal faith commitment-the spiritual relationship that exists between the person and God through Jesus Christ. Romans 6:3,4 reminds us that the believer has _____ to their old way of life and has been resurrected as _____ in Jesus Christ. Baptism also symbolizes a moral cleansing. (Acts 22:16, 1Corinthians 16:11) Baptism is also an act of identification with the Body of Christ. (1Corinthians 12:13) Baptism has no saving power. It is a _____ of a salvation experience that has already taken place. When verses talk about baptism that saves you (1 Peter 3:21) it's referring to what baptism symbolizes - identification with Jesus. He has separated us from the lost and given us new life through His death and resurrection. We are justified by faith alone. (Romans 4, 5:1,2)

Why be baptized?

If baptism has no saving power then why do it? Simply put...because Jesus told us to and we are to be _____ to His instructions (Matthew 28:19,20). Jesus modeled obedience in baptism. (Matthew 3:13-17). Peter teaches the baptism response in Acts 2:38. The same with Paul in Acts 22:16. Baptism, the public declaration of our faith in Jesus, is of the utmost importance in the life of a believer.

Who should be baptized?

Baptism is an expression of an individual's faith commitment to Jesus Christ, therefore C3 baptizes _____. People that have already made a _____ decision to accept Jesus Christ as the Lord and Savior of their life. Baptism was the normal practice in the New Testament. People repented, entered into a relationship with Jesus, and were baptized as a _____ proclamation of that relationship (Acts 2:41; 8:12,12,37; 9:18).

Jesus said, "Go into the world...make disciples...and baptize them. There is no mention of babies being baptized in the Bible. The household passages don't mention children or infants being baptized. Infant baptism is a meaningful action on the part of a child's parents, but it is a decision that has been made on behalf of the child. Biblical baptism by immersion is a personal response to what God has done in a person's life. It is a decision that a person needs to make for _____ to proclaim what has taken place in their life because of the grace of God.

Here at C3 parents commit their infants and children to God's care and keeping through infant and child _____ experience. Baptism is reserved to celebrate the point when a child decides for themselves to personally enter into and publicly declare a relationship with Jesus.

How do we baptize?

The Greek word for baptize is baptidzo. The primary meaning is to dip or to _____. It was a word used by dyers of cloth. To baptize a fabric meant to dip it completely under the dye. There were different terms used for sprinkling or pouring. Our church baptizes believers by immersion because it is the method that matches what the Bible teaches.

The practice of believers in the New Testament church. (The first record of sprinkling was in 250 A.D. in a death bed experience. In 1311 the Catholic Church first made immersion or sprinkling acceptable.) Baptism by immersion also vividly portrays what has happened in the life of a believer. The death and burial of an old way of life and being raised to new life in Jesus (Romans 6:3,4).



How to grow as a member at C3

At C3 we encourage every member to grow spiritually and relationally with one another. As a matter of fact, we believe the two are closely related. Below are ways that you can do both!

1. Attend Sunday worship services.

How we reach our city (Jerusalem)

How we reach our nation (Judea & Samaria)

Youth Mission Trips *state side – our student ministry seeks to establish mission trips and mission-oriented outings for students during their summer break each year. The goal is to help students build a heart for serving others and sharing the gospel. Mission trip locations and signups are often established in the late fall for the next coming summer.

Adult Mission Trips *state side – our C3 Missions Team helps to connect adults with missions experiences they can participate in groups or as individuals. The missions team seeks to establish mission trip locations and involvement details each fall in advance of the summer when trips most often take place.

How we reach our world (to the ends of the earth)

Adult Foreign Missions Trips: One of the primary ways we reach our world is through sending teams from our church to work in specific areas of the world and through the support to foreign missionaries. Mission trip locations are established by our C3 Missions Team and teams are formed based on the type of mission trip and project they are setting out to accomplish.

Below are the missionary couples C3 supports as they reach the world by translating the Bible and Bible study tools into foreign (and sometimes unwritten) languages.



Mark & Patti Bean went to Peru in 1984 as Bible translators in the Andes mountains. In addition to Bible translation, they also encouraged worship music in Quechua, prepared basic discipleship materials for the Quechua church, and developed literacy materials. In 2003 they dedicated two New Testaments: one for Margos-Yarowilca-Lauricocha and the other for Huamalíes-Dos de Mayo Quechua speakers.

Since then, they have been translating the entire Bible for six related Quechua languages: the two above as well as Huaylas, South Conchucos, North Conchucos and Huacaybamba Quechuas. Pray for these six Bibles to make it safely through the final steps of layout, proofing, and publication. Pray for the local Quechua speaking church to be able to read and use the whole counsel of God.



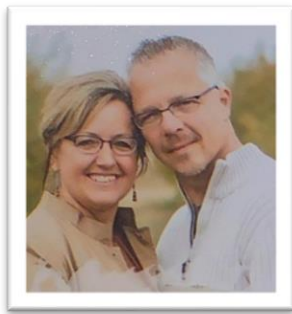
Curtis and Jennifer Campbell are starting their work with the people of Sabu who have been waiting over 10 years to relaunch Bible translation efforts for their language.

Curtis' linguistic and exegetical skills are needed to work with mother tongue translators on understanding the Bible passages and ensuring the Scriptures are translated accurately.

With God's help to relaunch the Bible translation project, Curtis and Jennifer have begun learning and documenting the local language, partnering with the

local church, and building a team to begin translating the scriptures. They are working with 4 teams to draft the books of Genesis, Ruth, and Jonah, as well as adapting the book of Mark to a local dialect.

With the addition of twins, their family has outgrown the motorcycle and are saving funds for a vehicle for Sabu. They look forward to engaging local partners, gathering field data, engaging in language immersion, culture learning experiences, and safely transporting their family on unpaved roads to facilitate Bible translation.



Dutch and Robin Honingh are the founders of Milk & Honey Ministries. Robin has authored a book titled “Walk With Yeshua”. In her book, Robin instructs her readers how to grow closer to Jesus through a method of studying the Bible known as the “inductive” study method. Her book has been translated into two languages other than English and is useful to them as they disciple people through their ongoing ministry work areas in and around Israel.

Our Missions Team (Mission C3):

Church Leadership

As you consider investing your time, talent, and treasure into the life of a church, it is important for you to feel _____ in church leadership. Our goal in sharing the details of C3's governance and leadership structure is that you will understand that our church is structured to support the values of spiritual authority and church accountability.

Our church government is made up of two groups of leaders.

The Pastoral Staff team is led by Pastor Thom Redmond and assisted by Associate Pastor Todd Hair. Our pastors, along with our part-time staff, oversee the day-to-day ministry and operations of the church. Our pastoral staff serve the congregation and are responsible for the ongoing development of ministries the church.

2. Protected by a _____

Our elder board is made up of men and women appointed from within the congregation with affirmation from our Sr. Pastor, current elder board and church body. This team of men and women serve to provide spiritual covering for the church, assist in establishing direction, and offering pastoral care to the church body. They also provide counsel to the Senior Pastor regarding the major financial commitments of the church.

Giving is one of the central themes in the Bible. Jesus talked more about this subject than Heaven, Hell, or prayer. To understand what it means to be a Christ-follower, it is important for each of us to understand what it means to be a _____ within the church.

1. Tithe

The tithe, or "first fruits" of our labor/income belong to God. We find this principle all through God's word. Tithing, giving God the _____ of our income to the local church, is the primary, practical way we acknowledge that God is first. (Proverbs 3:9-10)

2. Offerings

An offering is giving over and _____ the tithe. The Bible says that by giving generously, we are able to "take hold of the life that is truly life." You aren't really living unless you are freely giving. (1 Timothy 6:18-19)

3. The Spiritual Gift of Giving

The gift of giving is a spiritual gift that God gives to some people (Romans 12:8). It is a Spirit- given capacity and _____ to serve God by giving of your material resources, far beyond the tithe, to further the work of God.

Many people love to give to God and as they do, they want to feel confident in the organization through which they give. At C3, we want people to understand they are giving to God _____ the church, not to the church. As we openly share the honesty, integrity, and spiritual values that guide the financial practices of C3, we believe people can focus on what God is calling them to give and trust that He is leading our church to steward it well.

Discovering Your S.H.A.P.E.

Each of us is uniquely created by God and _____ by the Holy Spirit for ministry. At C3 we want to help you discover your S.H.A.P.E. and then help you connect with opportunities to be involved in the ministries and mission of C3. Spiritual gifts are special abilities distributed by the Holy Spirit to every believer according to God's design and grace for the common good of the body of Christ.

H = _____

What do you love to do? This section of your SHAPE discovery dives into your passions. In your heart are God-given desires that compel you to make a difference in a particular ministry. The fact that each of us cares deeply about certain things more than others is by God's design.

A = _____

What are your natural talents and abilities? What training, skills, and/or education do you have? We want to help you see how you can use these abilities to do ministry and bring glory to God.

P = _____

Better understanding your perspective, how you interact with others, and how you interact with the world around you can help you find your place and function in ministry. Knowing more about your own personality can help you discover the roles that are right for you to fulfill in the ministries here at C3.

E = _____

God can use your life experiences for His purposes. What experiences do you have that have molded you into who you are today? God can use both the good and the bad experience of your life as you serve in ministries to others!

C3 Articles of Faith

Our Beliefs

1. The Bible is the inspired word of God.

The Bible is the only written revelation from God to man. The Bible is infallible and trustworthy teaching us how to conduct our lives. "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and make us realize what is wrong in our lives." 2 Timothy 3:16 NLT. We also believe that the Bible is the one true authority in matters pertaining to the Christian faith. (Acts 17:11; Isaiah 8:20)

2. Jesus Christ is the Son of God.

Jesus Christ is the second person of the trinity, The scriptures teach he was born of a virgin (Matthew 1:18-23), that he led a sinless life, John 3:4-5, and that he performed miracles Acts 10:37-38., Acts 2:22). Jesus also died on the cross for our sins, I Peter 2:24 and was resurrected from the dead, John 20:5-10. And he now sits at the right hand of the Father (Acts 1: 9, 11.)

3. Jesus Christ is the only means of salvation.

Jesus Christ is the only way to God because of His death on the cross, which paid for our sins. (Acts 4:12; John 14:6). Because of this sacrifice we, are adopted into God's family. The Holy Spirit is given to us to guide, comfort, convict, and help us grow in our faith with Jesus Christ.

4. The Trinity

We believe there is only one true God who is both infinite and eternal (Matt 5:48; I King 8:27). But he has revealed himself in three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Matthew 28:19. God is neither limited by space or time and is eternally self-existent. (John 8:54-59)

5. Baptism

The Scripture teaches that all who repent and believe in Christ are to be baptized by being immersed in water (Matthew 28:19). Baptism is a public profession of faith in Christ. It is symbolic of the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ, and it is a declaration to the world that we have died to sin and have been raised with Christ to walk in newness of life (Romans 6:4).

6. Communion

The Lord's Table consists of two elements: the bread and cup. Those elements are symbolic of the body and blood of Christ. Communion is a memorial of Christ's sufferings on the cross and a celebration of our salvation. (Matthew 26:26-28) It is an opportunity for a believer to examine oneself and repent in order to experience the forgiveness granted to us in the cross.

7. The Church is the body of Christ.

The Church is the body of Christ (I Corinthians 12:12-27) and has a four-fold purpose: to Glorify God (Colossians 3:16, Ephesians 1:12, and Ephesians 5:16-19), make disciples (Matthew 28:19-20, 2 Timothy 2:2), make Jesus known to a lost world (Acts 1:8), and to meet human need (Luke 6:35-36, Acts 11:29, 1 John 3:17, James 1:27).

8. The Holy Spirit is an integral part of Christian life.

The Holy Spirit is given to every follower of Christ to guide, comfort, convict, and adopt us into the family of God. The nine fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) are by-products of a Spirit-filled life and spiritual maturity evidence. The nine gifts of the Spirit are different manifestations of the Spirit to build up the body (1 Corinthians 12:11). We are instructed to diligently seek the gifts (1 Corinthians 14:26-33) in the context of love (1 Corinthians 13:1-13).

9. The Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Crestview Community Church recognizes that there is One Holy Spirit but many gifts. Therefore, we realize *all the Spiritual gifts* as outlined by the Apostle Paul in I Corinthians 12. We also believe in maintaining proper order during our services (I Corinthians 14:40). Above all, we desire the gift of love to be present in all our worship activities (I Corinthians 13:1-7).

10. Marriage Gender and Sexuality

Crestview Community Church supports the Biblical teaching that marriage is both holy and sacred. And we believe in the biblical definition of marriage described in Genesis 1:27; 2:23-24; 5:1-2, and Matthew 19:2-5. Crestview Community Church respects the right of the Supreme Court's opinion, including same-sex marriage as a legal right. However, we find this opinion both contrary to the biblical teachings on marriage and homosexual behavior. (Romans 1:26-28, I Corinthians 6:9-11).

Thus, we respectfully decline participation in same-sex marriage unions. Crestview performs scripturally based marriages to its members who abide by and agree to our faith statement.

We believe that any form of sexual immorality (including adultery, fornication, homosexual behavior, bisexual conduct, bestiality, incest, or use of pornography) is sinful and offensive to God (Matt. 15:18-20; 1 Cor. 6:9-10).

We believe that to preserve the function and integrity of Crestview Community Church as the local Body of Christ, and to provide a biblical role model to Crestview Community Church members and the community; it is imperative that all persons employed by Crestview Community Church in any capacity, or who serve as volunteers, agree to and abide by this Statement on Marriage, Gender, and Sexuality (Matt 5:16; Phil 2:14-16; 1 Thess. 5:22).

We believe that God offers redemption and restoration to all who confess and forsake their sin, seeking His mercy and forgiveness through Jesus Christ (Acts 3:19-21; Rom 10:9-10; 1 Cor 6:9-11).

We believe that every person must be afforded compassion, love, kindness, respect, and dignity (Mark 12:28-31; Luke 6:31). Hateful and harassing behavior or attitudes directed toward any individual are to be repudiated and are not in accord with Scripture or Crestview Community Church's doctrines.

Creative Arts Teams

Graphic Design

Our team provides graphic arts support to the church office, pastors and others ministry teams and team leaders for the purpose of clear and inviting printed communication, sanctuary messaging and online promotions.

Photography

Our team visually captures images of C3 throughout weekend services, missions projects and special events in ways that help share and recall the heart of ministry moments and inspire involvement of others.

Video

Our team captures the testimonies and stories of God's faithfulness. The team seeks to film ministry moments, special events, and produce videos for services weekend worship, teaching and announcements.

Fusion Teams

Café / Kitchen

Our team hosts provide coffee and donuts before and between services and other special events.

Door Greeters & Ushers

Our team welcomes each person and provides an open door to all who enter.

Greeters are on-the-spot to answer questions regarding the morning ministries and C3 facilities. Our ushering team assists people in finding seats and helps to maintain a distraction-free service environment.

Welcome Center

Our team provides a warm welcome and gift to first time guests, as well as information to regular attenders who are seeking help connecting with ministries and special events.

Parking

Our team serves as the first impression for families as they drive onto the church campus. They greet and direct people to guest spaces, handicapped spaces and other open spaces in the parking areas.

Children and Youth Teams

(Background Check Required)

C3 Infant Nursery (0-2 years)

Our team provides a fun, safe, and nurturing environment for children 0-2 during both morning worship services at 9:00AM and 10:45AM.

C3 Kids (Pre-K)

Our team invests in the lives of Pre-K children including elements of worship, Biblical teaching, and Bible learning media.

C3 (K-4th Grade)

Our team invests in the lives of children K-4th grade including elements of worship, Biblical teaching, Bible learning media, as well as, friendship building activities and games.

EPIC Journey (4,5,6th Grade)

Our team serves by investing in preteen students through elements of worship, Biblical teaching, Bible learning media, friendship building large group activities and small group conversations.

EPIC Student Ministry (7-12 Grade)

Our team serves by investing into Junior High (7-8th Grades), High School (9-12 grades) students. We host gatherings each week including prayer, Bible study, large and small group conversations, as well as activities and games that build healthy friendships. Many special events are scheduled throughout the year to reach, connect and help spiritually grow our students.

Sanctuary & Service Production Teams

Sanctuary Tech Team

Our team consists of audio, lighting, camera crew, stage crew, creative media and producers who all serve in support of our weekend and mid-week corporate gatherings.

Worship Team

Our team exists to provide worship through music on Sunday mornings and at other special events. The Worship team is made up of people who have connected in formal membership with C3 and have the both the giftedness and availability to serve the church as part of the worship team vocal and instrumentalist rotation.

Special Teams

Small Groups Team

Our team is trained to facilitate Small Groups and equipped to build relationships while helping group members discover their next steps of spiritual growth and connection.

Prayer Team

Our prayer team meets each Sunday morning for the purpose of praying for the church services, pastoral staff and worship team, as well as the needs of the congregation. From time to time the prayer team will assemble for special prayer events.

Be The Church Project Managers

Our team members serve to spot and communicate the needs of church members, other local people and community organizations so that we can respond to each need by gathering resources and teams who will address and mitigate the needs on Be The Church Weed or special BTC project dates.

Security Team

Our security team includes health care professionals who are available during services to respond and providing basic medical assistance in the event of an accident or emergency. Our security team works to protect the church and help ensure a safe environment during church services and special events.

Annual Gift Shop Teams

Each year our gift shop teams for to prepare, display, and sell holiday items and bake sale goods in an effort to raise funds for local partner organizations and to help fund special C3 ministry related needs or projects. The Gift Shop event takes place on the second weekend of November each fall.

Fall Festival Team (Trunk or Treat)

Our fall festival team assembles early in the summer to brainstorm ideas and form plans for our C3 fall outreach event. Other teams from later in the summer based plans to carry out special tasks related to the event and special promotions.

C3 FAQ's

What does it mean to be “non-denominational”?

A non-denominational church is a Christian church that holds no formal affiliation with the recognized denominations and mainline churches such as the Baptist, Catholic, Presbyterian, Lutheran, or Methodist churches. Church denominations are larger organizations that hold a particular identity, set of beliefs, and traditions, and governing structures. C3, like many non-denominational Christian churches, believes that the Bible is the authority that dictates teaching, worship, and other aspects of church life.

How often do the members meet?

The C3 membership meeting takes place annually in the early part of each year (January or February). Member meetings are often hosted after the second service and last for about 1 hour. Membership meetings are a place where members hear reports regarding the ministries, finances and provide affirmation votes regarding eldership. Meetings will be announced well in advance through church email, bulletin and website.

How many members does C3 currently have?

C3 is a growing church, and we are excited when regular attenders take the step to become members. As of 6-7-21 we currently have _____ members.

Do members have special privileges regarding use of the church building?

Yes, membership has its privileges! Members can request use of the building. Building requests are processed through the church office administrator via our online request form found under the ministry resources tab on the church website.

Do you have to be a member to host a wedding at C3?

We are happy to perform officiate and / or host weddings for C3 regular attenders and members. We also expect the couple to attend pre-marriage counseling courses through C3 or another approved counseling experience.

Is my membership from another church transferable?

The transference of membership is mostly done between churches of the same denomination. Because C3 is a non-denominational church we do not accept or write up letters of transfer. We value your participation in our membership process as way for you to fully understand and embrace C3 as your spiritual home. We encourage you to share with your former church that you are formally leaving their fellowship and care as a part of your steps toward membership at C3.

Is it ok if I am a member of another church and a member of C3?

We recognize that some church traditions hold members for life while others only keep people on their membership roles so long as they are active in the ways we have outlined and described in our class. If you desire membership with C3 we ask that you share with your former church that you have formally left their fellowship and care.

How long do I need to attend at C3 before I can become a member?

We ask that you regularly attend C3 for at least 3 months before attending the membership class and making the choice to become a member. This gives you time to experience the church in worship and in fellowship, ask questions and explore the church ministries before making your decision to become a formal member.

Can I become a member even if my spouse chooses not to?

Yes, while we encourage couples to embrace membership together, we see membership as an individual choice to affirm and affiliate with the vision, mission, core values and believes of C3.

Do I have to be a member to join a ministry team?

We do not require you to be a member of the church to join a ministry team, however, because ministries are extensions and expressions of our church vision mission, core values and beliefs we seek to have each ministry directed and lead by formal members of C3.

Do I have to be a member to enroll a child into the Crestview Preschool?

We do not require you to be a member of the church to enroll your child the Crestview Preschool. However, members (and regular attenders) are offered early registration before the general public.
