Annual Meeting of the Congregation

The date for the 2022 Annual Meeting has been set for Sunday, November 13th, with the time yet to be determined.

According to our church constitution, in order to be considered eligible to vote at the meeting, members must have:

1. partaken of Holy Communion; and
2. contributed to the congregational treasury according to the congregation's record.



Both 1. & 2. must have occurred in the 12 months preceding the meeting and at least 30 days prior to the meeting. Be sure you have met the above requirements by October 14th (30 days prior to the meeting) to be eligible to vote on November 13th. Members' attendance and contributions are recorded weekly.

Check the list of current eligible voters, which is hanging in the back of the sanctuary next to the lay ministry sign-up. If you do not find your name on the list and believe that is an error, please contact Lynne in the church office.

First Lutheran Church Council Minutes September 12, 2022

The regular meeting of First Lutheran Council was called to order at 6:01 P.M.

Members present: Pastor Ede, Sarah Maurer, Troy Askeland, Tanya Burnett, Larry Richmond, Karen Nieman, Cheri Orcutt, Mitch Orcutt, Jen Cassutt, & Vicki Zietlow. Absent: Brenda Saunders.

Opening devotions were provided by Larry.

Church Growth Moment by Pastor Ede on the “Five Habits of a Healthy Church” from Church Fuel.

Reading of Constitution: Chapter 7 – Property Ownership

Approval of August Council Minutes: Motion to approve minutes made by Sarah; seconded by Cheri. Motion carried.

Approval of August Treasurer’s Report: Reports presented by Sarah; moved by Larry; seconded by Cheri to approve the treasurer’s report. Motion carried.

August Monthly Treasurer’s Report:

- **Income:** We were behind budget by \$6800 for income for the month. We were also down compared to August 2021. Income for the year is above where we were at this time last year; however, it is still almost \$23,000 behind where we had budgeted to be.
- **Expenses:** Total expenses for the month were less than budgeted and less than August 2021. Year to date we have spent less than we had anticipated in the budget by about \$11,000.
- **Net Income:** For the month we spent almost \$3800 more than we took in, which is similar to last year. Year to date we are at -\$11,760, which is higher than this time last year.
- **Notes:**
 - The copier fee came out twice this month – September will not have an expense for the copier.
 - We still have some large expenses coming up yet this year that include insurance.
 - We will begin paying Kathy M. and Dulcie S. for choir starting in September, which is an expense we have not had for a while. Kathy will start receiving her pay on the 23rd with regular payroll. We will divide her annual salary by 26 (there are 26 pay periods per year). Dulcie will be paid \$25 per rehearsal and will include on her normal accompanist compensation form. I will be creating a new line item for choir accompanist to differentiate between regular worship and choir.
 - I did figure out why Pastor Tony’s pension line item was larger than budgeted. It was due to coding an automatic payment incorrectly. This was his supplemental insurance that should have been coming out of the medical expense line item. For 2023, this particular expense will have its own line item. This should help clarify any issues.
 - The power point/radio/audio fund has \$38,887.40. This will cover the initial project for the sound system which will hopefully start this month.

- Discussion was had about Black Hills Energy and Alliant Energy bills being higher than normal. Sarah will investigate this and let the council know what she finds.
- Heaven Bound has requested a debit card for their account. At this time, the council felt it is not something we want to allow.

President's Report – Troy Askeland:

- A discussion was had on when to have the annual meeting of the church. The annual meeting will be Sunday, November 13th. Time to be determined.
- Offices up for election at the annual meeting include: President-Elect, Stewardship, Christian Ed, Social Ministry, and Treasurer. We will need to find someone to run for President-Elect and Stewardship.
- Everyone needs to have their budgets turned into Cheri by October 1st.

President-Elect – Cheri Orcutt:

- Last month Cheri led a class on dementia education. She plans to do another class, which is open to the public, in October.
- Financial Peace University starts Sunday, Sept. 18th. Currently have 4 individuals signed up.

Pastor Ede's Report:

- The youth had a great mission trip in July – our youth were wonderful.
- Pastor helped prepare the Virtual Convocation in Philadelphia. He was not elected to the NALC Council.
- First Lutheran Church was once again the top donor the past year of the 36 congregations in the Iowa Mission District.
- Pastor continues to visit and commune congregation members in the Good Neighbor Home, Meadows, and Marietta's Place as the facilities allow.
- The Triple R surveys have been gathered and the group will meet this week to put together a way to present to the congregation. The consensus of the survey's is there is no urgency to do anything, which is frustrating.
- Technology issues continue with services. Pastor has created a step-by-step guide to follow when running the audio board, PowerPoint, and Facebook Live.

Christian Ed – Tanya Burnett:

- Thank you to the council and Pastor for their continued support of Christian Education. It was great to have Troy and Cheri assisting in the classrooms and coming to the opening, and great to have Pastor walk through. Teachers, children, and parents like to see that support and encouragement.
- Elementary: Preschool-6th grade
 - Sunday School began on Sunday, August 21st. Held the same day as Back-to-School Backpack Blessing so everyone was excited about the first days of school.
 - We have had on average 12-15 children/week attending and hope to see that number grow. We are taking attendance and have attendance posters in the classrooms.
 - Lessons were on Psalms in August, and in September we are focusing on the Prophets.
 - We moved the opening room from the Sanctuary to the Inspiration Room.
 - Each week we have had a student come to Sunday School and tell the whole group the memory verse of the month; in turn they get to pick a treat from our goodie basket.
 - The Sunday School Team signs up each month for the weeks that they are able to serve. We have a great mix of adults and youth serving together.

- Pastor Tony led the teachers in a time of devotion and discussion about the upcoming lessons. Will continue this on the last Sunday of the month from 10:00 to 10:15 A.M. for anyone who will teach or help the following month.
- SS year is planned out with the *Grow Curriculum* including other events to engage families and the congregation. Check out the bulletin board in the Christian Ed office.
- Youth: 7th-12th grade
 - Youth Group presented their Mission Trip to the congregation.
 - Discussion and preliminary planning for a retreat for youth with the other congregations that they served with on the Mission Trip.
 - Confirmation Student/Parent Rally was held on Wednesday, August 31st.
 - “Grow Program” for the youth has begun on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 P.M. for high school, led by Alana DeMoss. The year is planned out for the youth with a good balance of fun and service activities and Grow for Christian Education.
- Adults
 - Sunday School continues with Larry Richmond during the SS/Fellowship hour
 - Midweek Bible study continues with Leah Beaman Wednesdays at 7:00 P.M.
 - The church library is still undergoing reorganization, led by Jean Conrad. Hoping to have that completed and ready soon.
- Upcoming Activities and Important Dates
 - September 18th, noon to 2:00 P.M. - “Trick Shots and Treats” family event
 - September 25th, noon to 2:00 P.M. - God Squad Ice Cream and Games
 - C3 Youth and Family Meeting - working on a date/time to meet again
 - October 2nd - Sunday School “Sing and Serve” at 10:30 worship
 - October 9th - Parent Workshop/Intro to Bible Buddies - Lisa Guetzko will be facilitating
 - National Sunday School Teacher Appreciation Day is October 16th. We will recognize teachers and helpers during worship.

Evangelism – Jen Cassutt:

- We hosted a back-to-school tailgate on Wednesday, August 17th. The weather was great to have it outside, and about 25 people came and enjoyed bacon cheeseburgers.
- Our committee met last week and tentatively planned out events for the rest of 2022.
 - For October, we will send out gift cards to college and military members and have a spot for the trunk trick or treat at Sherman's Pumpkin Patch on Sun., Oct. 30th, 1-4 P.M.
 - For November, we are hoping to have a trivia night; looking into dates and locations.
 - We will start “Touch of Christmas Love” in November, with wrapping taking place on Sat., December 10th at 9:00 A.M.
 - In December, we will be participating in the Window Walk (Thurs., Dec. 1st?); still thinking about ideas, so let one of us know if you have thoughts!

Lay Ministry – Karen Nieman:

- It was motioned and seconded to approve the updated Altar Guild booklet. The booklet in the Friendship Room will be put in a plastic sleeve to keep it dry.
- The Altar Guild trainings had 6 members attend on Wednesday and 2 attend on Sunday.
- It was moved by Jodi and seconded by Bev to pay Dulcie \$25.00 per Sunday to be the accompanist for choir. Motion carried.
- Reformation Sunday is October 30th.
- Discussion on the date for the All Saints Day service. Tabled discussion until October mtg.
- Hymn selection is complete until the start of Advent.

Properties – Mitch Orcutt:

- All leaky faucets have been replaced by Max Andrews. Special thanks to Max!
- Larry and Troy cleared whatever was in the bell tower out – thinking it was a bird's nest.
- Sarah has brought the donated cappuccino and coffee machines to the church. We will see if and where they are able to be used.

New Business:


- Mission in Christ Strawberry Point transition discussion

First Evangelical Lutheran Church Facilities Use Policy (adopted 6/2018)

Purpose: First Evangelical Lutheran Church is committed to making its facilities available for use by individuals and organizations involved with activities and ministries that benefit and serve the surrounding community. Church-sponsored events/functions will have priority over non-church sponsored activities.



Procedures for Requests:

- The request for facilities use must be made in writing using the form "Application for Facilities Use", available in the office.
- A check in the amount of \$50 (member)/\$100 (non-member) shall be submitted at the time of application as a deposit. This deposit is refundable once the event is complete and the building has been inspected. Damage to the property, violation of this agreement results in the forfeiture of the deposit. Payment of all fees is due at least one week prior to the event.
- The request must be made with sufficient advance notice (usually 6 weeks) for it to be scheduled on the church calendar. Requests are reviewed by the Pastor and/or Church Council which is responsible for all facilities use decisions, including those which fall outside of the categories of this policy.
- Submission of the "Application for Facilities Use" signifies the group or individual is agreeing to the terms, fees, and conditions set forth in this policy and those specified on the completed application.
- When the facilities use has been approved, the event will be added to the church calendar maintained in the church office. All approved applications will be kept on file in the church office.

(This is a summary of the First Lutheran Facilities Use Policy. You may pick up a form with the entire policy from the office to submit a request for use of the church facilities.)
