The Weekly Words

I Did

Over a decade ago, I began a journey into the world of Christian Apologetics. My journey didn’t start out of fascination but necessity. I was searching for the truth and was willing to go wherever the evidence led me. My belief needed to make sense. Hoping and wishing were not good enough anymore. Could Christianity stand up to the evidence in history, science, and philosophy? I was not sure, but I was willing to find out. Along the way, I discovered Christianity’s beauty and, most importantly, its truth. That changed everything.

A decade later, I have had the opportunity to speak into the lives of thousands of students with the same questions I had. Despite my downfalls, I thank the Lord for every opportunity and pray He uses those encounters for His glory. The journey has been a white-knuckle ride of highs and lows; this week has been one of those low points. I lost a former student. The student’s passing was unexpected, and my feelings were even more surprising. I have logically walked through the problem of pain as many times as anyone on the planet. I have walked through it personally. I have taught on it. I have counseled people through it. I could write a book on its philosophy. I understand it deeply.

I don’t want you to think I have become some callused academic, because I haven’t. I am probably even a bigger softy now. I always try to put myself in the place of those hurting and genuinely grieve with them, but in the back of my mind I have a confident assurance that God is in total control.

However, in this moment, the pain became personal. I reminded myself of all the philosophy, all the scripture, all the promises, but it still hurt differently. It was almost a supernatural hurt.

As I worked through these feelings, I never became angry at God or questioned His Sovereignty, goodness, or existence, but I did have questions. The image burned in my mind was the moment the student passed. I knew God could have intervened at that moment, but He didn’t. That became the question. The question wasn’t meant to challenge God or question His actions or lack thereof. It was sincere. I wanted to know why He would choose not to act.

Why would He be silent in such a moment? I knew there was a good reason; there had to be. The last decade has taught me that God is good, reasonable, logical, full of grace, and just. He doesn’t change even in the darkest moments.

As I worked through this question, I received an unexpected response. It was simply, “I did.” What could that mean? How did He intervene? Then it hit me like a ton of bricks. He had intervened for this student on the cross 2,000 years earlier. He had intervened for you and me. We don’t suffer in vain. The promise is that every tear will be wiped from our eyes because of Him. I think J.R.R. Tolkien says it best, “The birth, death and resurrection of Jesus means that one day everything sad will come untrue.”
