Divine Hiddenness

The divine hiddenness of God has sparked much debate and concern in the philosophical and theological world for atheists and Christians alike. The problem of divine hiddenness can be explained in the lamest of terms as, “How can a personal God, be so hidden from His people.” Even within the realm of divine hiddenness, God is personal in His nature. Many Christians have left the faith because they no longer “feel God.” Faith can be defined as believing in God even though He cannot be seen physically. A part of the Christian faith is trusting beyond what one’s feelings and physical eyesight can comprehend. Gregory of Nyssa held the belief that people know God by participation in God. (1) Therefore, belief in God requires a person to take a step-in faith or belief in God. Furthermore, a relationship with God requires one to have a desire to have a relationship with God.(2) Throughout the Bible especially in the book of Psalms, God’s people are seen crying out to Him searching, seeking, and asking for help. The Psalmists at times are desperate for God to intervene in their circumstances. (3) If God was noticeably present 100% all of the time there would be no need for one to turn to Him, thus God’s divine hiddenness is for humanities benefit.(4)

The first example of hiddenness in the Bible is not God hiding from humanity, but humanity hiding from God.(5) Sin in the believer’s life can cause confusion and a disconnect in one’s relationship with God. Sin can account for some of the aspects of the hiddenness of God. Another important note of the divine hiddenness of God is the fact that God is God and humanity is not God. If one knew the exact nature and essence of God, then they would be on the level of the divine. The human mind was designed with the ability to detect God’s presence. (6) There are endless examples of believers having a sense of God’s presence.(7) God’s activity in the world is seen through the fruit of His people.(8) Ultimately, God physically and personally revealed Himself to His people through His Son Jesus Christ. God also personally revealed Himself and connects people though His Word and the Holy Spirit.(9) Another way that God personally reveled Himself is through His creation. In other words, God makes Himself known through the things He made.(10) Ultimately God’s revelation is defined as an encounter between persons, not abstract concepts, thus God’s revelation to humanity is personal time and time again and not hidden.(11)
