


Truth is this love thing isn't as easy as it seems. Jesus knew it. His 'Great Commandment' is all about love for God, others and ourselves. Love is hard, and it cannot flourish without forgiveness of others and for ourselves.

Scott Hunter, In his "Coaches Corner" writes: "*The more I study and understand the nature of life, the more I become convinced that the "formula" for having an amazing life is really quite simple: Totally release the past, ... forgive everyone for everything, including yourself, be grateful for everything, and focus only on being at peace with yourself and others.*" Sounds simple, but it isn't!

This is a tough one for most people. Consider the following: There is a forgiveness project at Stanford University. The results are disturbing but not surprising. **Most people don't want to forgive!** They actually cherish their negativity! Kindness and being a nice human being don't sell as well as anger and bitterness. People feel entitled to create enemies and somehow justify their right to do that. And people use the wounds they have received to justify wounding others. And the cycle goes on and on!

People just don't see the consequences of unforgiveness. Here's the reality: our grievances mean nothing. Do you think anyone cares about them except you? Bottom line: do you want to be right or happy? People all too often think they get to be happy by being right. It doesn't work that way. Those two choices are mutually exclusive. So, forgiveness means you give up your need to be right in favor of happiness and peace.

Not forgiving someone is like taking poison and waiting for the other person to die. So, give yourself a gift: forgive everyone for everything, including yourself! By the way, that is Jesus' idea, not mine! (Matt. 18:21-35)

So. Happy Valentine's Day! Don't waste another minute holding the self-destructive bitterness and unforgiveness that steals your joy, your peace and your health!

## MomCo Morning Group: Dreaming, Growing, and Doing Life Together



# A Letter From Stewardship

Dear Bethany Family,

Happy New Year! January brings forth the season of our refresh, our reflection on the past year. For some, it was the best year, with new hope, new love, and new adventures. For others, the past year may have brought struggles, disappointments, devastations. Yet all the while our God was there for us, whether we felt him in those moments or not.

Last year we reminded you all to remember your first love, the love of our father. This year we are asking you to “*TRUST*” our father. We are going to encourage you all through this new year to remember that as we focus on the world around us, we take a minute, and we remember that God has not forgotten about you and He never will. He hears our prayers and remembers our hearts desires, and struggles.

*In Genesis 18*, God made Abraham and Sarah a specific promise - one that did not make sense. Yet 13 years later when they were still waiting and feeling that God forgot his promise. *In Genesis 18:14*, God posed one important question to Abraham: “*Is anything too hard for the Lord?*” Abraham and Sarah lost trust in their faith and in their Lord. How many times have we asked for our prayers to be heard, and did not trust that they were? We didn’t feel like anyone was listening. We lost faith and lost trust in everything and everyone. It’s easy to doubt, but when we replace our doubt with faith, we give God something to work with. You allow God to do His part and release blessings. We are giving our trust to Him.

We apply this to our family here at Bethany Church, in our stewardship with our elders and deacons, session team members, teachers, and coaches. We have faith in those managing our resources (our time, talents, money, environment) to act responsibly as caretakers of our faithfulness. We put our trust in those around us to manage the gifts we have given.

*Proverbs 3:5-6* “*Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding: in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your path straight.*” So, as we reflect and start this new year, we are asking you to trust. Pray on it, read the Word, act in faith and humility. Take a deep breath and trust in those around you and in our Lord. Spread that trust and faith with others.

### New sound in the Sanctuary!




## A Note about Sound from Music Associate, Caleb Auldrige

Mike Segeleon and I worked together to upgrade the Bethany audio system in the Sanctuary. The wireless microphone units have been moved down to the stage in order to get a stronger radio signal connection which will help with unwanted interference noises. We also put in a new digital stage box that will allow us to plug in microphones from the stage while still being connected to the new console in the loft, as well as have monitor wedge mixes for our Bloom musicians. Additionally, new piano microphones have been added to assist the Bethany choir as well as adding piano to the livestream broadcast. We are very excited for these changes and will have more to come soon!
