4. **IMPACT** King George and beyond as we build **BRIDGES** and shine the light of Christ in our **EVERYDAY** lives. (John 4:1-42, 10:1-18; Luke 19:10; Matthew 5:14-16; Philippians 4:5; 2 Timothy 4:2; Galatians 6:10; Colossians 4:5-6)
5. **VITALIZE AUTHENTIC**, close-knit **RELATIONSHIPS** in Christian community. (Acts 2:42-47; Philippians 2:1-2,15; 1 Samuel 20:1-4; Proverbs 27:17; 2 Samuel 12:7-13)
6. **EQUIP** others to grow and walk **VICTORIOUSLY** and **FRUITFULLY** in their relationships with Jesus. (John 1:29, 35-42, 3:3; 1 Corinthians 15:57; Romans 8:35-39; Matthew 4:18-22, 28:19-20; Mark 8:34-35; Luke 9:23-24; John 17:17; Ephesians 4:11-16, 5:1-2; 1 John 2:6; 2 Timothy 2:2; Hebrews 13:20-21)

1. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

2. Why do we so often relate worship to (only) singing songs? Warren Wiersbe said, "Worship is what we do with our lives, not our lips." How is worship so much more than a song? In what ways can we worship God?

3. When God employs us in Kingdom work, it is NOT merely about our natural abilities, skills, or talents, but the ability HE gives us. Read the following verses:
 1. Exodus 4:10-13 (Moses); Judges 6:11-16 (Gideon); Jeremiah 1:5-8 (Jeremiah).
 2. Discuss how each of these men felt when called by God. What were their reasons for doubting? In what ways have you felt (or responded) the same as them? Why do we often think we do not have what it takes to do what God calls us to? What Bible verse(s) do you cling to in times like this?

4. What does it take for us to move beyond a 'See-you-next-Sunday' kind of church? What are some obstacles to developing relationships with others? What do we learn about this from Acts 2:42-47?

5. Without depending on a 'ministry of the church', how can each of us actively engage in discipling others? What does it mean to disciple someone? What would be needed to start doing this? What are reasons (perhaps excuses) we don't do this?

6. What is a "victorious and fruitful" walk with Jesus? What is it not? How and why might we set expectations too high? Too low?
