Snakes, flying, dinner parties with strangers, or maybe needles. What are you afraid of?

During a children's sermon, I asked a group of kids what they feared most. Some yelled “spiders,” while others talked about fear of the dark, struggling to make friends,

and nerves before a test. But one seven-year-old girl flatly said she wasn't afraid of anything! She insisted that she'd never felt afraid! To her, this was what it meant to be brave.

Many of us can relate. We all feel scared sometimes—it's part of our humanity. Fear is a gift from God for our protection and preservation. Whether we fear uncertainty or illness, failure, or loss, we all face that sense of vulnerability that leaves us wondering “what if.” And while God makes fear a vital part of your human nature, God does not want you to live in fear.

Psalm 56:3 says, “When I am afraid, I put my trust in you.” Notice that this verse doesn't say “IF” I am afraid, but “WHEN” I am afraid. If you never experience unease, you may not be fully alive. Throughout the Bible, God tells people not to be afraid. So, if our fear is a gift from God for noticing threats, maybe fearful situations become an opportunity to grow our trust in God.

Today, practice observing your fears and then turning to God. When you're afraid, make it your first step to say to God, “I'm afraid. What should I do?” You don't have to deny your fears. Instead, allow God to teach you and guide you through your fears.

Holy Communion is a sacred meal in which Christ comes to us in and through bread and wine. “This is my body given for you... This is my blood shed for you.”

We believe those words to be true. Christ is truly present in Holy Communion. When we receive the bread and wine of

this meal, we receive his body and blood.

All of God’s people are welcome to our Holy Communion. It is our Lord’s Table, and Jesus sends out the invitations — to everyone.

There is no minimum age for receiving this sacrament. There is no sense of understanding or mental capacity necessary to receive communion.

First Communion classes will be Saturdays, March 18 and March 25, from 10:00-12:00. One parent, grandparent, etc., is encouraged to attend with each student. Classes will be held in the Fellowship Hall (Doors 6 & 7).

First Communion will formally happen at worship on Thursday, April 6th at 7:30 pm. Students are not required to be present on April 6th.

If students cannot attend one of the classes, please let us know; we can make other arrangements for that student.

Last time we talked, we spoke of the many difficulties that people may be dealing with in their lives. Keep in mind that those difficulties were only a few examples – there can be many other situations where people find themselves hurting and in need of a confidential friend. They need the love of Christ to see them through. Stephen Ministry’s slogan is “Christ

caring for people through people,”

Stephen Ministers are confidential. A Stephen Minister meets privately, one to one, with a person who is in need. A Stephen Minister meets with a person every week for about 1 hour. Additionally, those 1-hour-a-week meetings last for as long as the person needs a confidential Stephen Minister to help them through their situation. The need for the services of a Stephen Minister is not determined by a clock or calendar. A Stephen Minister is there for as long as needed.

Where do the Stephen Ministers come from? Right here from our own congregation. People are called for this ministry by God: many times, God speaking through other people, letting you know that you have the talents of a Stephen Minister; other times by a nudging or a feeling that this is your call. When a person is called and they accept the call, they receive extensive training, which leads to commissioning by the pastor and congregation.

The training is done by the Stephen Leaders of our church, who are extensively instructed in Stephen Ministry. Stephen Leaders are instructed using resources from Stephen Ministries, St. Louis, Missouri – the international headquarters of the Stephen Ministries Organization.

Stephen Ministry training equips congregational members to provide a high level of emotional and spiritual care to individuals experiencing a life crisis. The training is practical, relational, and interactive, covering essential caregiving topics.

Stephen Ministry equips God’s People for Ministry.

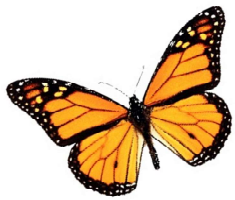
