Sharing God's Peace



I love that worship involves not just our minds, hearts, and spirits but also our bodies. Standing and sitting, the smell of Easter lilies, the taste of wine/grape juice, the use of our voices to speak and sing; many sights and sounds – all ways physically experience worship. With our understanding of the incarnation (God becoming human), I find it fascinating

that the most profound way to connect with God (and with one another) is through our bodies. Could it be that our hands are an extension of our hearts? The touching of one another a gesture of our inner spirits?

Maybe that's why sharing the peace on Sunday mornings is often a beautiful and long-lasting ritual. It is a recognition and a celebration of the family we have become and are becoming because, for every one of those empty seats among us, God has in mind a person who will someday be part of the sharing of the peace ritual as well.

How do we do this while still respecting the space between us? We do so with the utmost sensitivity to one another's space and needs.

We are bringing back the sharing of peace. Returning to this cherished tradition, we must understand that it will feel different. Today, some folks are uncomfortable touching or shaking hands. Our deep desire to welcome all means that, first and foremost, we respect where the other person is.

Maybe sharing of the peace means offering the words: "Peace be with you" with a hug or a handshake. Maybe it is a wave or a peace sign. Maybe you put your hand over your heart with the words "Peace be with you." What is most important is that you convey to the other person: You are a child of God. I am thankful for the gift of your presence. I love you, and God loves you. That is a lot to pack into eye-to-eye contact, a gesture, and the words peace be with you. But we can do it!

A group of ten people from St. John & St. Paul spent six days in Cuba with Cuba Connection Ministries. Each morning we ate and prayed together at our bed & breakfast in Santa Marta before hopping in our van with Juancito, our driver, and Yoel, and our translator and guide. We visited a ministry for handicapped persons



and their families; we made butterfly suncatchers with the children to celebrate new life, while parents and relatives shared with us the joys and struggles of being caregivers. We served a meal to elderly residents of a town called Jovellanos. We visited a state nursing home for men; the staff showed us the facility, and the residents spoke to us about their lives and their families.

We visited many churches. Most had humble beginnings as a cell group of five or six people meeting in a home, but they also had ambitious dreams for the future: renovated buildings and sanctuaries, expanded ministries, and new churches. We attended worship at a small Pentecostal church on Friday night. We heard testimonies from the congregation and a message about the faith of Abraham in Genesis 22.

On Saturday morning we worked at the farm, one ministry of Cuba Connection Ministries. We painted buildings and posts, and we cleared brush around mango trees, coconut trees, and guava trees. They told us of all their plans for the farm: to raise pigs, to house mission teams, to host retreats. We ate lunch here almost every day: fresh fruit juice, rice, beans, potatoes or plantains, pork or beef. We worshiped on Sunday morning in two churches and heard messages from Willie Santiago and Vicar Andrea. Afterwards, we traveled to a town called Julio Reyes to visit a church, one we had heard about in one of Vicar Andrea's sermons. The pastor shared with us her call story, then sent us home with fresh fruit.

When we had time, we visited Cuba's beautiful beaches in a town called Varadero. We walked in the sand and swam in the blue water—and we heard that it was snowing in Celina! We enjoyed watching the old American cars drive by, though many Cubans got around on buses, scooters, and even buggies. On Monday, we got to try out buggies ourselves when we delivered rice and beans to families through a ministry of the Presbyterian church in Varadero. Together we visited almost twenty homes in Santa Marta to deliver food. We sat with people, told them about our churches and our trip, and they shared with us their stories. Some people were struggling with illness or injury, lack of medicine or medical care, but others were struggling with lack of food and resources. All people told us that they still thanked God for God's blessings and had faith in God's everlasting love and care. We prayed together for their children, grandchildren, spouses, pets, and for all of Cuba.

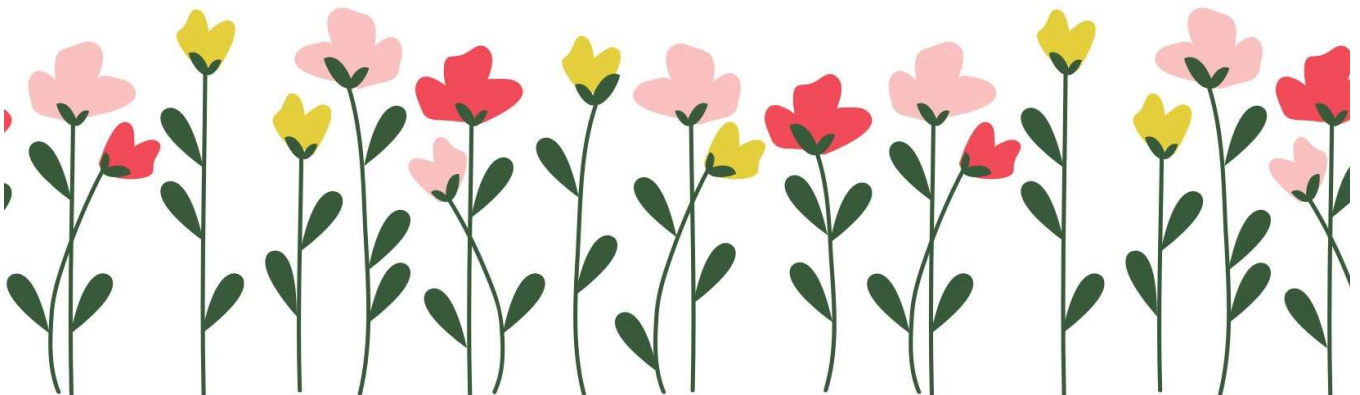

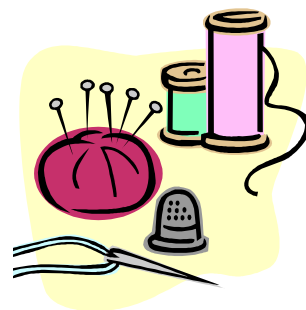
