MAIN IDEA

In Genesis 15, God met a fearful and discouraged Abram with:

- *Gracious Assurance*
- *A Unilateral Promise*
 - *Patient Delay*

Through Abram's response, we see the Bible's first explanation of the doctrine of justification by faith.
