Are You a Thistle or Lily?

The other day, I was listening to Christian radio, and they were having an interesting discussion about Genesis 3:18. They were talking about how working the ground became harder after God made Adam and Eve leave the garden. The conversation turned to thorns and thistles, mentioned in 3:18. Then the man asks the lady an interesting question: Are you a thorn or thistle to someone? When I hear the word thistle, I go back to the days of working on the farm in Park City, Kentucky. My grandfather hated to see a thistle on the farm. The moment he saw one, he had to stop what he was doing and go dig up the thistle. If one ever got a chance to bloom and go to seed, he would be beyond upset. He even got mad when other farmers let thistles go to seed, saying that when they bloom, the wind might blow the seed onto his land.

I tell you the story about my grandfather because it reminds me how aggravating thorns and thistles can be. In contrast, there is *Solomon 2: "I'm a rose of the Sharon plain, a lily of the valleys. 2 Like a lily among thornbushes, so is my dearest among the young women."* In the Song of Solomon, the writer describes the beauty of a lily and how it is so admired among the thorns. These verses got me thinking. Am I a thistle or a lily in the life of the people around me, who love me? Do I bring joy and beauty to their life or aggravation? At the office: Am I a thistle or a lily? I suspect Lori might say a little of both on some days. But it is a good question that we, as children of God, should ask ourselves. Do we bring joy into the lives of the people who know us and are around us? Do we make their days better? Are they glad to see us coming? As children of God, we should always put our best foot forward. We should strive to be a presence of peace and calm. Because, like a thistle that has gone to seed, someone in a bad mood, being hyper-critical, or always condemning and criticizing others, will spread their attitude and behavior well beyond the one thistle. Will we always be a lily? No! I have never met a perpetual lily. But it doesn't mean we have to accept being a thistle without trying to do better.
