Lesson 20

FIRST DAY: Review and Overview

1. What do you recall from last week's study on Jochebed that you have applied to your life this week?
Exodus 2:1-10

2. As a child did you ever daydream about being a king's daughter? If you have been born again, you are a daughter of the King. This week's lesson will reveal what the Bible has to say about a King's daughter. Write what you learn about a *king's daughter* from Psalm 45:13.

3. It is important that we recognize who we are in the kingdom of God. As a King's daughter express your heart's desire concerning your study this week. Write your prayer here.

SECOND DAY: Read Psalm 45:13

1. Begin your lesson today by concentrating on Psalm 45:13a. The word *within* could refer to within the palace or within her herself. What qualities would you expect or desire in an earthly king's daughter?

- a. List a few of the qualities that would identify *the King's daughter* who is *all glorious within*.

(1.) In today's culture how does our outer appearance reflect what is *within*?

(2.) What does 1 Timothy 2:9a teach about how we are to dress? Selah.

2. Observe the phrase in Psalm 45: 13b *her clothing is of wrought gold* in relationship to Isaiah 61:10. What do you see?

- a. Write Isaiah 61:10a as your response to Isaiah 61:10b.

3. From what you have learned through your study of Psalm 45:13, write your description of the King's daughter.

THIRD DAY: Read Psalm 45:1-8

1. Today as daughters of the King we have the privilege of beholding the King of kings through Psalm 45:2-8. Behold Him by choosing phrases from the following verses as you write them here. Selah.

a. Psalm 45:2

b. Psalm 45:3-5

c. Psalm 45:6-8

(1.) What do these verses reveal about the character of our King?

(2.) Hebrews 1:8,9 quotes Psalm 45:6,7. How long will this righteous King reign?

2. Behold King Jesus as revealed in Revelation 19:11-16. Meditate on verse 16b as you print it here phrase by phrase.

3. Pause to reflect on what you observed today about your King. In response to this write a note of praise to Him.

*King of my life, I love You. Lord of my heart, I adore You.
You are Majesty, Royalty, Shepherd of my soul.
And I love You, God.*

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FOURTH DAY: Read Psalm 45:9-11

1. The knowledge and awareness of the glories of the King should stir within His daughters a deep desire to please Him. Think about this as you observe Psalm 45:9a,10,11b. What do these verses reveal about the character and conduct of King's daughters?
 - a. How does verse 10b stress the necessity of loyalty and commitment?
 - b. In what way do these verses speak to you today as a daughter of the King?
2. The word *beauty* in Psalm 45:11a does not refer to physical beauty. Our King delights in our beauty when it is not spoiled by worldliness. What should be our response to this? Psalm 45:11b
3. Concentrate on the phrase: *worship thou Him* Psalm 45:11b. (If you've been negligent in obeying this command, ask the Lord to help you to be faithful in your worship of Him.) Follow this command now by expressing in song your worship to your King. What song did you choose?

*O worship the King, all glorious above,
And gratefully sing His pow'r and His love;
Our Shield and Defender, the Ancient of Days,
Pavilioned in splendor, and girded with praise.*

FIFTH DAY: Read Psalm 45:(13)14,15

1. The believers' relationship with the Lord includes being welcomed into His family. It also includes being treasured as the bride of Christ. Psalm continues with the theme of the royal wedding awaiting the King and His bride. How are her garments described in verse 14a?
 - a. How does Revelation 19:(7)8 enhance this picture?

2. The bride is given garments that are clean and white. Until the day of this wedding, we have a responsibility. Record what you learn about this from James 1:27b.
 - a. Share practical ways you keep yourself *unspotted from the world*.

Advanced Students: Identify the *companions* in Psalm 45:14b.

3. Imagine what it will be like on that great wedding day! How does Psalm 45:15 describe this? Selah.
 - a. Read Revelation 19:7. How does the phrase: *His wife has made herself ready* speak to you?
4. Complete today's study by expressing your desire to live the life that pleases your Bridegroom.
