Period 1	8:45 - 9:30	<u>2nd Grade Writers Workshop:</u> Teacher: Mrs. Sandy Description: This class is a beginning writing class for 2nd graders working on basic writing skills. We will cover sentence writing and several different genres of writing including narrative, informational writing and poetry. All lessons will be introduced and practiced using the Writing process. Cursive writing, journal writing and editing will also be included. Curriculum: BJU English 2 Homework: There will be take home work to be complete each week. All lessons will be introduced and practiced using the Writing process. Handwriting, journal writing and editing will also be included. Curriculum: BJU English 1 Homework: There will be take home work to be complete each week. Cost: \$216/year broken in 9 monthly payments of \$24 Supply Fee: \$60 one time yearly fee for materials, paid at registration.	<u>Kindergarten STEM & Science Explorers:</u> Teacher: Mrs. Heather Description: This hands-on course introduces students to the exciting world of science and how scientists study God's creation. Students will explore living things, plants, habitats, the earth and its features, the sun, moon, and stars, forces and motion, natural resources, and how the body works. They will develop important science process and inquiry skills through experiments, projects, and activities, learning to observe, ask questions, and communicate their discoveries. Along the way, students will learn to defend the truth that God created all things and sustains their existence, seeing His design in the patterns and systems of the natural world. Cost: \$216/year broken in 9 monthly payments of \$24 Supply Fee: \$60 one time yearly fee for materials, paid at registration.	<u>1st Grade STEM & Science Explorers:</u> Teacher: Mrs. Heather Description: In this class, students will explore the wonders of God's creation through hands-on activities and engaging lessons. They will learn about the basic concepts of life science, physical science, and earth science, discovering the beauty and order in nature that reflects God's design. Topics include understanding the properties of materials, identifying plants and animals, exploring weather patterns, and learning about simple machines—all while recognizing the intricacy and purpose behind everything in creation. The class encourages curiosity, observation, and experimentation, fostering a sense of awe and reverence for the world God has made. 		<u>8th-9th Grade Civics - The Foundation of Our Country</u> Teacher: Mrs. Kerry Description: Did you know that "the separation of church and state" is not in the US Constitution? Further, did you know that our "inalienable rights" are given by God and not the government? Students in this class will study our founding documents while looking at the historical context of the times(colonial history through the American Civil War). There is a student workbook that students will be asked to use for homework assignments as well as supplemental readings to assist in becoming scholarly in the documents our current culture says are irrelevant. Class discussion each week is expected in order to deepen understanding. Class is a repeat from class two years ago and is geared to 8th, 9th, and 10 grade. Curriculum: Freedom Civics & books/resources Homework: This class has required homework each week including reading from the Freedom Civics book (given as part of this class tuition) and other document study. No more than two hours per week should be required for homework. Cost: \$216/year broken in 9 monthly payments of \$24 Supply Fee: \$80 one time yearly fee for materials, paid at registration.	<u>4th & 5th Grade Beginning Choir</u> Teacher: Mrs. Kellie Description: Elementary Choir is a class that will focus on learning the basics of reading music and singing, and how to combine these two skills with other students to create a cohesive choir sound. Specifics of instruction in reading music will include note placement and rhythm elements, along with deciphering symbols and knowing what they mean. Students will learn how to sing melodies together, and learning the basics of successful singing including intonation, breath support, rhythm & posture, and blending voices. We will focus on singing one part together well, and throughout the school year we will work on a variety of other necessary skills. There will be an end of year production. Homework: Students will be assigned a new vocal skill to work on at home, and when we start working on songs, they will have a part to practice at home each day. Cost: \$216/year broken in 9 monthly payments of \$24 Supply Fee: \$80 one time yearly fee for materials, paid at registration.
		<u>8th-9th Grade Smart & Healthy Living:</u> Teacher: Mrs. Jessi Description: This course equips students with practical tools for maintaining a healthy lifestyle and making thoughtful decisions as they transition into their teenage years. Topics include physical and emotional wellness, nutrition, exercise, healthy friendships, conflict resolution, and stress management. Students will also develop essential life skills such as goal setting, time management, job readiness, and wise financial decision-making. Homework: Will vary week to week based on various projects. Cost: \$216/year broken in 9 monthly payments of \$24 Supply Fee: \$60 one time yearly fee for materials, paid at registration.	<u>6th/7th/8th Vocal Music Theory / Beginning Choir</u> Teacher: Mrs. Kellie Description: Vocal Music Theory is a class that will focus on developing knowledge and practical experience in the principles of music, with an emphasis on vocal understanding. Students will learn how to read music, the components of how to sing a melody or harmony, the basics of successful singing including intonation, breath support, rhythm & posture, and how to blend voices together to form a cohesive choir. Students will learn their vocal range (soprano, alto, tenor, baritone, bass) and throughout the school year we will work on a variety of skills necessary for singing with skill. There will be an end of year production. Homework: Students will be assigned a new vocal skill to work on at home, and when we start working on songs, they will have a part to practice at home each day. Cost: \$216/year broken in 9 monthly payments of \$24 Supply Fee: \$80 one time yearly fee for materials, paid at registration.
