## **BLESS: HOW TO ENGAGE OTHERS FOR CHRIST**



# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

## ASH WEDNESDAY—ONE OF MY FAVORITES!

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of “Lent” – a 40-day period (not including Sundays) which continues through the cross of Good Friday and ends on Easter morning. **This year, Ash Wednesday falls on February 18, and we will be having a special worship service in the Sanctuary at 6:30 p.m.** I hope you will join us for this meaningful time together. It is one of my favorite times of worship every year.

When you search your Bible, you will not find anything about Ash Wednesday or Lent. Because of that, some faith traditions never observe these seasons of the church calendar. Although not prescribed or practiced in the Bible, they are part of church tradition that helps focus God’s people on a journey to the cross with ashes. Why ashes? Because ashes are a symbol of repentance, and the journey of Lent is a journey of reflection and repentance.

Just as Advent (also not mentioned or prescribed in the Bible) is a time of reflective longing for the coming of Jesus our savior, Lent is also a time of reflective longing for our savior, but with a different twist. You see, Lent is a time of introspection where we come face to face with our failings. Ashes have historically been a symbol of grief. Our grief during Lent is grief over our own brokenness and sin. As we confront the reality that we are sinners who fall short of God’s call on our lives, it causes grief, and that kind of grief is meant to lead to repentance.

During Lent, as we “give up” those things that threaten to become idols in our lives (sweets, TV, social media, etc), we are repenting. We are turning from ourselves and our false idols and turning our heart back to God. Doing so reminds us of our desperate need for a savior, and as we struggle to fight the urge to turn back to those things that do not offer life, we again recognize the depth of our brokenness. That is the point of Lent – to recognize the depth of our brokenness and sin. These aren’t small issues that just need a little tweaking – they are big issues, and we need someone to save us.

So as individuals and as a church, Lent is the time to recognize our own guilt and consequently, our desperate need for a savior. The 40-day journey brings to mind the wandering of the Israelites in the wilderness after their failure to enter the Promised Land – a time that God used to cleanse and purify them from their sin. But it should also bring to mind Jesus’ 40-day journey in the wilderness after his baptism and before he began his ministry. You see, the time of lamenting our sin and recognizing our brokenness eventually becomes joyous celebration! Just as Jesus defeated the temptation of the devil in his 40-day journey, his grace gives us the power to overcome sin in our own lives. And we can be filled with great hope as we look toward the cross of Good Friday where Jesus saved us from our sin by paying its penalty for us and then rose from the grave victorious over sin and death to give us new life in him!

But it all begins with the recognition of our need. That begins on Ash Wednesday.







## TEACHING KIDS WHAT LOVE REALLY LOOKS LIKE

February is often called the month of love, but for kids, love needs to be experienced in ways that go far beyond cards, candy, or a single day. Scripture reminds us that love is not just something we say or celebrate, it is something we practice. Children learn what love means by watching how it is lived out in everyday moments.

One simple way to remember how kids experience love is the word **LOVE**.

### L – Listen well

Kids feel loved when they are truly heard. Eliminate distractions and really listen. Slowing down, making eye contact, and listening without rushing or correcting communicates that your kids matter.

### O – Offer encouragement and praise

Words shape a child's heart. Notice effort, kindness, and growth, not just results. Encouragement builds confidence and helps children understand their value.

### V – Value time together

Love grows through presence. What that looks like is a shared meal, car conversations, bedtime prayers, or maybe even a short check-in/text. It's not about the amount of time but the intention behind it.

### E – Extend kindness outward

Love is meant to be shared. Invite kids to serve others through simple acts of kindness, writing notes of encouragement, helping a neighbor, or praying for someone in need.

A few years ago, I introduced the idea of using the **GIFT test** when giving or doing something for others. It remains a helpful lens. We can ask whether what we offer builds **Gratitude, Insight or Intimacy, Fondness, and Trust**. Often, the most meaningful gifts are not things at all but moments of connection and care.

When families practice love in these simple, intentional ways, children begin to understand love not as a season or celebration but as a way of life. Love becomes believable when it is **predictable, personal, and practiced**. Through that steady, everyday love, children catch a clearer picture of how their Heavenly Father loves them.
