A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

HEARING GOD'S VOICE

When I really think about it, what I long for most is to hear the voice of God. Jesus said, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. (John 10:27) It is possible to hear God's voice! When you surrender your heart to Christ by repenting of your sin and believing the good news of Jesus' atoning sacrifice on your behalf, he fills you with the Holy Spirit. Learning to listen to the voice of the indwelling Holy Spirit is a vitally important part of being a Christian. Because if you can't hear the voice of God, how can you possibly follow God? Since my heart longs to have Jesus know me and to follow him, I long to hear his voice in my everyday life.



In April I briefly taught how to hear the Holy Spirit's voice. I highlighted the clearest way to hear the Holy Spirit is through the Bible because the Holy Spirit is the author! But that isn't the only way to hear the Holy Spirit's voice. Prayer and other spiritual disciplines help tune us to the Spirit's voice. Oftentimes, the Holy Spirit will speak to us through others – especially through godly counsel. And there are also times when the Holy Spirit will speak through dreams and visions and other supernatural manifestations.

For a while now, I've been specifically asking the Holy Spirit to speak to me in ways that would minister to others. Often, I will pray and fast in advance of a time of ministry (like we experience at several prayer and worship services or on special ministry Sundays). I ask God to reveal to me whatever he wants for the benefit of the church and for his glory. Then I will try to listen and pay attention for whatever impressions he places on my heart. Occasionally God will give me an image or a word or a conviction on my heart. I'm not always confident that I've heard God clearly. But I rely on the Holy Spirit's leading in the moment about whether to share the impressions I have. Sometimes they don't seem to hit the mark. But sometimes they do, and the results have been miraculous healing, supernatural encouragement, or some other timely word to the church. God also uses these instances to build our faith! It has brought me great joy recently seeing other church members led by the Spirit to minister to others too! Keep praying to hear the Spirit's voice and then be willing to step out in faith where he leads.

This month I will have some time away for vacation and our Great Lakes GMC Annual Conference session in Marion, Indiana. It will be good to relax with my family and then join with colleagues for worship and encouragement. But before I return to the office, I've planned a week away to listen for God's voice during a silent retreat to Saint Meinrad Archabbey. Please pray for me to quiet my mind and heart to slow down enough to hear what I most long for – God's voice.


We will not be meeting this June or July to allow more freedom for members to participate in family vacations and youth activities.

CARE NOTES FROM PASTOR DAN How the Whole Church Becomes a Caring Church

Caring ministries may vary when it comes to the local church. There are innumerable ways to help families and individuals in their time of need and truly be the "hands and feet" of God. Here are some ideas:

CARING FOR CHURCH FAMILY'S FACING SERIOUS ILLNESS.

- Send cards and encouragement often.
- Plan to clean the house or do yard maintenance.
- Help make hospital or home visits to brighten a person's day!
- Create a basket of small individually wrapped gifts so the recipient will have a basket of cheer they can go to whenever they need a lift.
- Kids could write scripture or encouragement in sidewalk chalk on member's driveway or sidewalk.

CARING THROUGH PRAYER.

- Hold a prayer vigil for those church families who need extra support.
- Organize a 24 Hours of Prayer event!
- Email a daily/weekly prayer and ask others to join you.
- Communicate specific prayer needs regularly.

CARING FOR THOSE RECOVERING.

- Participate in organized meal schedule.
- Plan some fun outings or plan one at their home.
- Coordinate friends to drive a church member to appointments/treatments.
- Help stock church member's pantry/refrigerator.

CARING FOR THOSE WHO ARE GRIEVING.

- Encourage those who are grieving to attend GriefShare.
- Send cards to families who are grieving.
- Schedule a fundraiser to benefit a cause that means a lot to the family.

But let's not forget to make time for what really matters in the midst of all the excitement: our relationship with Jesus.

Here are ten ways to stay engaged with your family to have a Christ-Centered Summer:

1. Try to make it to church more often, even when things get crazy. If you're out of town, research a great place to attend church that week.
2. Pitch in together at church events - there are tons of ways to help out! Here are just two specific ways: Summer Lunch Program (*contact Bonnie for more information*) or help with light general cleaning at church (*see page four of this newsletter for upcoming "Serve Saturdays" opportunities*).
3. Join the fun at Vacation Bible School (VBS). Plan to attend or even volunteer before the event!
4. Commit to learning a new Bible verse each week. Even toddlers can learn a simple verse!
5. Reconnect with your family at lunch or dinner. Chat about the cool stuff (Glory Sightings) you noticed God doing each day.
6. Keep a family prayer list on the fridge and mark it when God answers your prayers. We can make it a habit to pray for each other and give God the praise in the waiting moments and when He shows up!
7. Spread some kindness by doing something nice for someone. Write a letter to a grandparent. Have your kids pick out three toys in great shape that they want to give to someone in need. Pass out water to the homeless on a hot day. There are endless ways to spread kindness!
8. Bring a new friend along to church with you. Then, take it a step further and invite them over for a meal!
9. Grab some items for your local food pantry next time you're at the store. Involve the kids and have them help pick them out.
10. Plan a low-tech "staycation" or vacation for some quality time together. Go on a walk or a hike, go to a splash pad, or even work on a family project together.

As parents, we often yearn for more time to prioritize what truly matters. Perhaps we can utilize the suggestions on this list over the next two and a half months to deepen our children's connection to God. Embrace a summer filled with the presence of God!
