# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

## MINISTRY UPDATE: EXCITING THINGS HAPPENING AT TMC!

**Easter** – We had a very meaningful Holy Week this year! It began with a Spirit filled celebration and remembrance of Jesus' love for us on Palm Sunday and Good Friday. Those services are always meaningful to me, and we could all feel God's Spirit moving, reminding us of his great love for us. Then Easter Sunday was powerful! We had over 600 people in attendance in person to experience the promise of new life that is possible because of Jesus' resurrection. I am especially thankful for those people who volunteered to share their cardboard testimonies! It never gets old witnessing the transformation Jesus brings to everyday people's lives! And another shout out to those who lived out our mission by inviting friends, family, coworkers, or neighbors to worship with you! We had many guests with us! What a great Easter Sunday!



**Loan Paid Off** – If you worshiped with us on Palm Sunday you heard some amazing news. Two years ago, our congregation took out a \$524,000 loan to pay the required fees to leave our former denomination. By doing so, our local church was then free to join the Global Methodist Church, and we also became the official owners of all our properties and assets (previously, we held them in trust for the denomination). It seemed like an overwhelming amount of money two years ago, and we were fortunate to find a lender. But the exciting news is that last month we paid that loan off in its entirety! Everyone contributed to make that possible, but significant progress was made with last year's sale of our Saint Jacob site and the hoped for but unexpected income from the Employee Retention Tax Credit we were eligible for from the government. Take a moment to thank God for providing!

**Adaptive Leadership Team** – Our team continues to meet for a full day each month. We continue to grow together in spiritual leadership and mutual trust as we work together to develop a Ministry Action Plan (MAP) for our church. Thus far in 5 meetings we've read a book together and started another one, developed a team covenant, articulated our mission, studied demographic reports, conducted our own research to understand our community context, and begun to identify our core values. Keep praying for our team as we work together to discern God's leading for our church!

**Young People Coming to Christ** – I've saved the best for last. Our student ministry continues to grow both in numbers and spiritual depth. From this time last year to this year, our student ministry has grown from a weekly average of 39 students to 51 (30% growth) including one week in March with 68 in attendance! Even more exciting is the move of God's Spirit amongst our youth. In the last couple of months at least 8 of our students have made first time professions of faith. Pray that this spiritual momentum is carried over to our various camps and mission trips this summer where students typically take even deeper steps of faith!

We have so much to praise God for, don't we?!



### PENNY DRIVE IN HONOR AND REMEBRANCE OF SOLDIERS

The Veterans Honor Project is on a mission to place over one million pennies on veterans' graves across the country. Each penny carries a message of remembrance, respect, and gratitude—a small token with a big meaning.

Have you ever walked through a veteran's cemetery and noticed a coin on the grave? Here's what each coin left on a veteran's grave traditionally represents:

- Penny – Someone visited to show respect.
- Nickel – The visitor trained at boot camp with the veteran.
- Dime – The visitor served alongside the veteran.
- Quarter – The visitor was with the veteran when they died.



For our project, we are specifically collecting pennies—because each penny tells a story: You are not forgotten. Someone came. Someone cares. While we ask for pennies, we will gladly accept any coins or bills, which will be exchanged for pennies to carry out the mission. But this isn't just about remembering the fallen—it's also about helping the living. On average, 22 veterans die by suicide each day. Our goal is to raise awareness and funds for mental health support, so fewer veterans end up in a grave too soon.

We invite you to be part of this simple but powerful mission. Together, we can honor the legacy of those who served—and work to protect those who still do.

Would you help us collect pennies to honor America's veterans? Starting on Sunday, May 4, we will have boxes out for you to grab and take home with you. The goal is to fill your box with as many pennies as possible and bring your box back by Sunday, May 25. **Let's be on mission together!**

## UPWARD – MINISTRY IMPACT REPORT

Now that the Upward Basketball and Cheerleading season is over and as we look forward to preparing for a new season in the next few months, it's a good time to evaluate the impact of this important outreach ministry of our church!

Here are some significant statistics. Of the 286 participating athletes (49 more than last year), 163 were first time participants in our program (33 more than last year). Furthermore 54% (155, 30 more than last year) come from a family with no church home! That represents over 7,000 touchpoints of ministry to people without church homes which our Upward program and our faithful volunteers made possible. Thank you for investing in such a great outreach ministry!
