A message from Ben Cole, Senior Minister

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Pretty sure I have never started a newsletter with those words. But as we have been walking through the book of James on Sunday mornings, I was struck by how James uses that exact phrase three times in the first chapter alone (verses 2, 16, and 19).

When something like that stands out to me in Scripture, I like to dig a little deeper, so I did a quick word search. The phrase *brothers and sisters* appears 107 times in the epistles alone. (Feel free to double check me. I only counted once, but it is certainly over 100.)

What is my takeaway? What is the point I am making? Simply this: the early Christians did not just talk about the church as family, they truly saw it that way.

Someone came up to Jesus one day and told Him, “Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you.” His reply was classic Jesus. He answered a question with another question. “Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?” Then, without missing a beat, He answered His own question: “Whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother” (Matthew 12:47–50).

That leads me to a question I have been pondering myself: **Do I really see the church as my family?**

My first response was, “Of course I do.” I mean, I have said it plenty of times, “my brother in Christ,” “my sister in Christ,” and I know in my head that the church is meant to be a family. But then came conviction. Deep conviction. Are those just words? Or am I actually living that out? (Insert last Sunday’s sermon here: Be doers of the Word, not hearers only.)

Who is your brother? Who is your sister? According to the words of Jesus, it is whoever is doing the will of our Father in heaven. So, maybe the better question is this: To whom am I being a brother? To whom am I being a sister? What would Boones Creek Christian Church look like if everyone who came was doing the will of the Father?

Four words: The Body of Christ.
Who we are called to be.

BCCC Bicentennial Minute

As part of our 200th Anniversary Celebration, here is this month's 'Look Back'.

Boones Creek Christian Church has a rich history dating back to its beginning in 1825. We pick up our story in 1842 when the congregation received pledges for donations to complete the 'Meeting House'. By 1844, membership had grown to 250 and in 1846 the church ordained 4 Elders and 2 Deacons.

In 1850, the "Brick Church" was constructed with two front doors, separating men and women. It served the congregation for 102 years. By 1865, membership dropped, possibly due to political divisions from the Civil War and black member loss due to new congregations. In 1866, Bethel Christian Church was planted in Jonesborough with Hezekiah Hankal as minister.

In 1867, W.C. Maupin was ordained, earning the nickname "The Old War Horse." In 1870, the church purchased 1-3/8 acres for \$103 to create a "Hitching Ground" and a house for changing baptismal clothes. Baptisms took place across the road in the waters of Boones Creek until 1952. An additional 5/16 acre was purchased in 1905 for \$15.00, and in 1936 a committee was formed to explore digging a basement below the church building for Sunday School classrooms.

Our missions offering was outstanding! We gave you a hard goal - \$7,500 to go to New Hope Christian Mission in Zimbabwe and you showed up in a BIG WAY! Over \$8,700 later saw me have to don some hideous Tennessee Volunteer orange gear for both VBS and the following Sunday at church. It was horrible, but well worth it!

New Hope Christian Mission in Zimbabwe will be holding Holiday Bible School in August. They are estimating at least 1,000 kids to attend- possibly even upwards of 1,500! They house and feed the kids across the event, need supplies and curriculum, and more, so the costs add up quickly. This money you’ve given will be going to cover those costs and give all those kids a better opportunity to learn about the love of Jesus. Thank you so much for your generosity and help spreading the Gospel!

We are already looking forward to next year! Until then, we are excited about the hundreds of kids we have come through our doors every single week. If you are looking to be a part of something special, Mandy and I would love to chat with you about joining our teams of volunteers!

Boones Creek- you are simply amazing. I’m blessed to be a part of what God is doing here and am so excited to see what’s coming next!

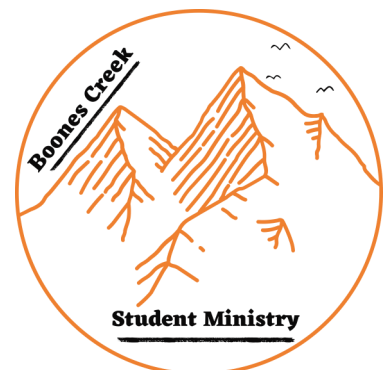

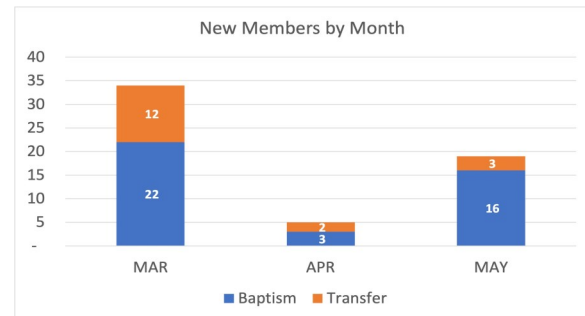
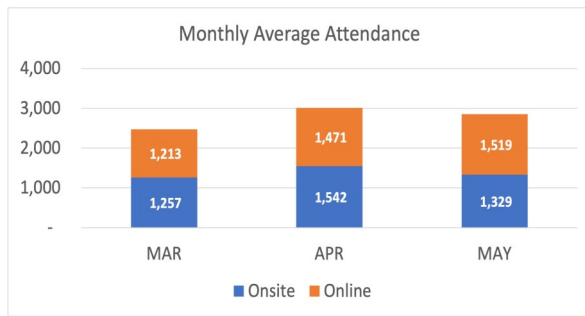

Men's Health

Some of the cancers that most often affect men are prostate, colorectal, lung, and skin cancers. Knowing about these cancers and what you can do to help prevent them or find them early (when they are small, haven't spread, and might be easier to treat) may help save your life.

Prostate cancer

Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men in the US, other than skin cancer. It's also the second-leading cause of cancer death (after lung cancer). About 1 in 8 men will get prostate cancer in their lifetime.

It can happen at any age, but the chances go up as a man gets older. Most prostate cancers are found in men over the age of 65. Prostate cancer happens more often in Black men than in men of other races and ethnicities. And when Black men get it, they are often younger. Having one or more close relatives with prostate cancer also increases a man's risk of having prostate cancer.

What you can do

Talk to a health care provider about screening.

The American Cancer Society recommends that men have a chance to make an informed decision with their health care provider about whether to be screened for prostate cancer. The decision should be made after getting information about the risks and potential benefits of prostate cancer screening. The discussion about screening should take place at:

- **Age 50 for men at average risk** of prostate cancer who are expected to live at least 10 more years
- **Age 45 for men at high risk** of prostate cancer, including all Black men and any man with a father or brother diagnosed with prostate cancer before age 65
- **Age 40 for men at even higher risk**, including any men with more than one brother or both a father and brother who had prostate cancer, and men who carry any *BRCA* gene mutations

If you decide to get screened for prostate cancer

Men who decide to get screened should be tested with the prostate-specific antigen (PSA) blood test. A digital rectal exam (DRE) may also be done as a part of screening. How often you are tested will depend on your PSA level, health, family history, and preferences. 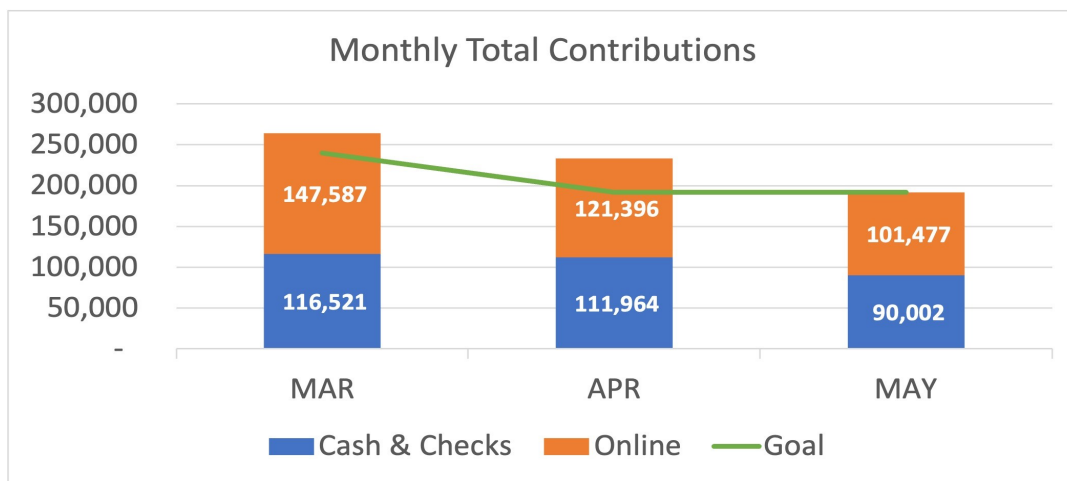
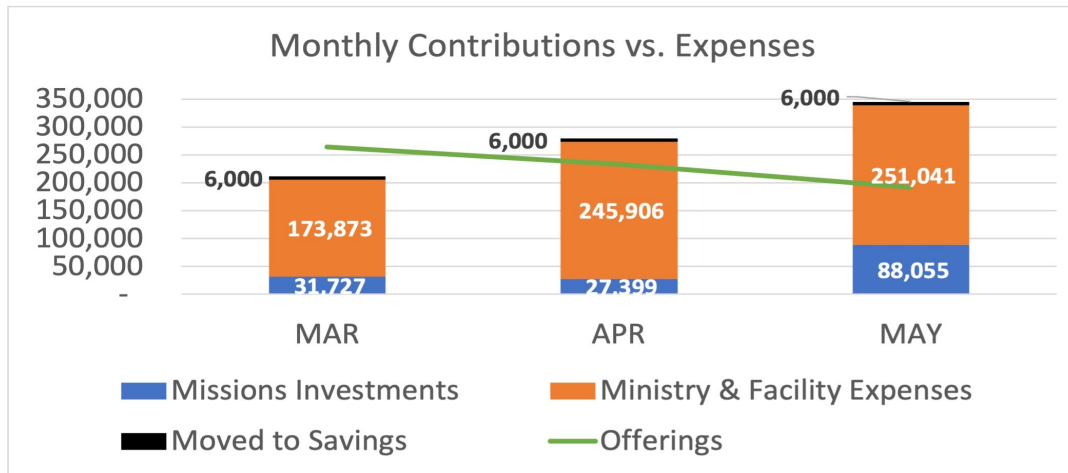


Widow2Widow
