A message from Ben Cole, Senior Minister

It is Monday, April 21st, just one day removed from Easter Sunday. As I sit in my office writing this newsletter, I am in awe of God and humbled to be part of the Body of Christ. I cannot fully express the gratitude I feel for what took place over the weekend. It began with our Good Friday worship service and by Sunday at noon it was all over. In those three days nearly 3,000 people came together to worship our risen Savior.

Now a different emotion sets in. Or maybe it is better described as a burden. The burden is this. The weekend ended, and I did not want it to. I wanted to stay in that same spirit of worship. What stood out to me most was that there were no complaints, even with so many different things going on. No one seemed bothered by the challenges or the little things that maybe did not go as planned. Instead, there was encouragement, unity, and a deep focus on Jesus.

Paul writes in Ephesians about the armor of God. One of the pieces is the helmet. A helmet protects a soldier's head in battle. Then in 2 Corinthians he writes,

"For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ."

The helmet we wear is the helmet of salvation. It guards our minds and when our focus is on the salvation we have in Christ, atmospheres like what we experienced last weekend are produced.

Here is the point. We do not take off the helmet just because Easter is over. In fact, we cannot. Because Easter is not over. Jesus has risen and He has not returned yet. So, we keep the helmet on. We stay focused on Him and when we do, everything changes. Our perspective shifts. Peace replaces anxiety. Joy overcomes frustration. Hope silences fear. When our minds are set on Christ, we see the world and our circumstances through the lens of His grace, power, and love.

Easter is not just a weekend. It is a reality we get to live in every day. So let us keep our eyes on Jesus and let the spirit of worship that filled the weekend continue to guide our hearts in the days to come.

BCCC Bicentennial Minute

As part of our 200th Anniversary Celebration, here is this month's 'Look Back'.

When looking at the origin of Boones Creek Christian Church, one story stands out.

In the Spring of 1825, there was a certain elder of the Christian Church, a disciple of Barton Stone, who had purchased land in the Boones Creek area and was preaching and baptizing those who came to know Christ under his ministry. This elder was Jeriel T. Dodge, who had moved into the area in the early 1820's.

Jeriel Dodge and those who had been baptized under his teaching approached the Sinking Creek Baptist Church asking for membership. When they were refused membership, church member James Miller was upset and asked for his dismissal from the Sinking Creek Church. On April 16, 1825, James Miller received a letter of dismissal from the Sinking Creek Baptist Church.

This incident was the catalyst for the revival meeting in the summer of 1825 known as the 'Great Meeting on Boones Creek'. From this 'Great Meeting', Boones Creek Church of Christ was born.

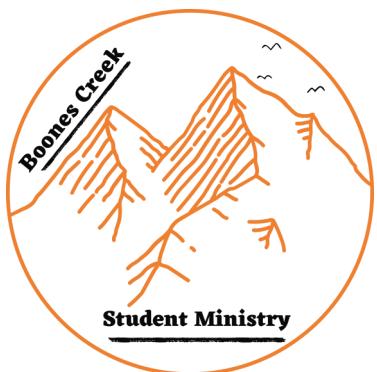

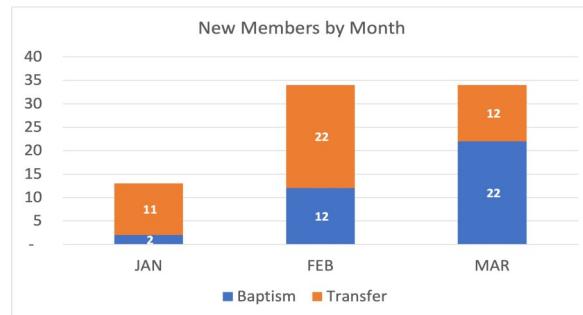
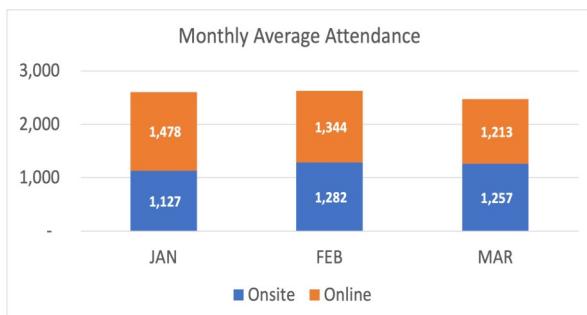

Stress Awareness

God actually designed our human bodies to handle a certain amount of stress, and He equipped us with what's called the "Fight or Flight" response. When this is activated, the brain sends messages to different parts of the body to be ready for quick action, whether that means standing up against a threat or retreating from it. This function was very effective in keeping mankind alert and alive back in ancient times. Our stressors are of a different variety now compared to the ancient times. We seem to live with a more constant undercurrent of anxiety either within us or around us, and because our bodies still function like those of our ancestors', that fight or flight response is constantly activated. Therefore, many of us live with a higher level of stress most of the time.

Being stuck in this fight or flight mode can cause our body to flood with cortisol continuously which causes inflammation, and the inflammation is what makes us vulnerable to chronic disease.



5 Ideas for Immediate Stress Relief

Through God's strength, we can break the hold stress has on us when it hits. And sometimes the simplest things are the most effective.

Reading God's word

This gives us His perspective on how to handle life.

"Trouble and distress have come upon me, but your commands are my delight (Psalms 119:143).

Sharing your burden with a friend

This reminds us that He provides the support we need to release stress.

"An anxious heart weighs a man down, but a kind word cheers him up" (Proverbs 12:25).

Spending some time in nature

This reminds us of His goodness and His ability to make a way through troubles.

"How many are your works, O Lord! In wisdom you made them all; the earth is full of your creatures...May the glory of the Lord endure forever: may the Lord rejoice in his works..." (Psalms 104:24, 31).

Lifting up in prayer

This connects us to our Heavenly Father and all His grace to go through stresses.

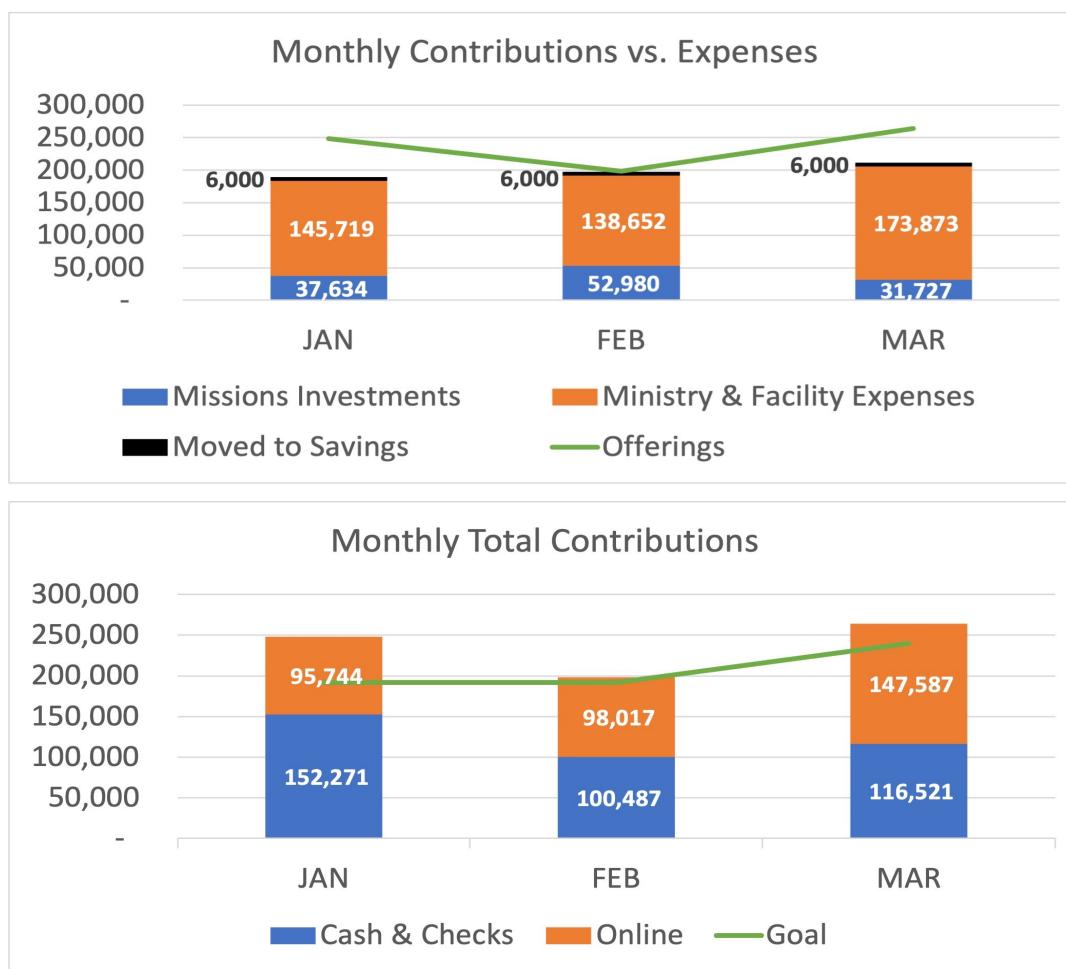
"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God" (Philippians 4:6).

Helping someone else

This helps us to see His bigger plan and to reach beyond ourself.

"For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10).
