


Start Now

As you walk, move with purpose: connect with loved ones, meet your neighbors, and make yourself available to serve and pray with those around you.

UNPLUG

The aim is to step back from technology and reconnect with God, loved ones, and our neighborhood. Instead of turning on a podcast or audio book, notice your surroundings, connect with a friend, and commune with the Lord.

WALK

Studies show that walking is one of the healthiest activities for us. If you're able, throw on your sneakers and put some miles on those treads. If walking physically isn't possible, that's not a problem. Much of the same connection can happen on your front porch, balcony, or even in a quiet room. The key is to unplug from the chaos of life and plug into God's heart for your neighborhood.

PRAY

As you walk, pray circles around your neighborhoods, schools, and local businesses. Prayer is powerful, and we believe God is calling His church to boldly step into the many neighborhoods HNW represents; and to pray for healing, justice, and spiritual awakening in Cypress, Tomball, Spring, Klein, Magnolia, and Northwest Houston.

ENGAGE

This ministry season's success depends on each of us being interruptible as we traverse our neighborhoods. The goal isn't to kick down doors, but to walk through the doors God opens for us. We believe God is already at work in the homes, schools, apartments, and businesses nearby.
