The Danny Coleman Memorial - Transformational Home

Last fall, our church received a generous donation of a house and 5 acres of land. As the donor and I discussed options of what the church might do with the property, one idea resonated with them. In this season in the life of our church, a season of transformation for us as a body of believers, it is the perfect time to move forward with our plans for the "Danny Coleman Memorial - Transformational Home."

This ministry will be unlike anything we have ever done. Working with Habitat for Humanity, Love Columbia, and others to gather a list of families who might be an excellent fit for us, we will interview and select a family experiencing housing instability. After choosing a family, we will enter a covenant relationship with them and provide stable housing for 18-24 months. Our goal is for the family to be in a great position to purchase or rent a permanent home of their own after their time with us ends.

The covenant is clear. While the family resides in our home, each member must attend our Sunday morning worship services regularly. All minors will be required to participate in Midway Kids or Midway Students. In addition to the Spiritual aspect, our church will serve the family in 3 other areas: Professional, Financial, and Educational. Our businesspeople will come alongside the adults to help create resumés, teach interview skills, and assist with the application process for solid, good-paying jobs with benefits. Our financial people will help the family build and maintain a monthly budget, open a savings account, and meet with them regularly for accountability in not taking on any new debt. Our educators will help every student in the home with tutoring, homework, studying for tests, and any other academic needs that arise. This holistic approach to serving a family in every area of their lives moves this ministry area from just another transitional house to a one-of-a-kind transformational home.

After all the stories I have heard about the character and qualities of Danny Coleman, it only fits that a one-of-a-kind ministry bears his name and keeps his legacy alive. It is our prayer that the Danny Coleman Memorial - Transformational Home will do just that for years to come!





I hear joy in


my husband's laughter as he tickles our youngest grandson who giggles with delight. I see joy as my older grandson gleefully





Gifted A-frame property gets cleanup for potential mission use



Green Jell-O Salad

- 1 (3 oz) box lime Jell-O
- 1 (3 oz) box lemon Jell-O
- 1 1/2 cup hot water
- 1 (16 oz) container cottage cheese
- 1 (20 oz) can crushed pineapple (drain well)
- 1 cup mayo
- 1/2 lemon, juiced *optional - recipe OK without this
- 1 cup chopped pecans

In large bowl, dissolve lime and lemon Jell-O in 1 1/2 cp hot water. Add remaining ingredients and stir, make sure to mix thoroughly. Spoon into mold or glass dish and refrigerate until firm.
