

TREASURY NOTES

We had another good month for income, collecting over \$19,000 for our offering. This is well above what is required for the budget. For the year, we are averaging over \$19,000 monthly, so we are doing well. Our apportionments have been paid in full, and we have a nice balance in our general fund account.

In addition to this, we collected a total of \$2,602 for our new chairs. The generous donors who had issued the match challenge contributed \$2,016, which is the cost of half of the chairs. So due to the generosity of those contributing for chairs, we actually collected \$586 more than the \$4,032 that was needed for the purchase.

The overage amount will be used for other equipment as needed. We still need to buy another chair dolly for moving the chairs, but that is unavailable at present. It looks like we will have to wait on that, just as we had to wait on the chairs to become available.

The lease on our printer/copier is due to expire soon, so we will be looking for one that is more user friendly. If there is anyone in the congregation who has expertise in office machines, and who would be willing to help in this process, please contact me.



Mobility Carts are three-wheeled, off-road wheelchairs operated by hand power. Built by a faith-based, non-profit, volunteer organization, **Mobility Carts** are delivered at no cost to people in developing countries who are unable to walk due to illness, disease, birth defects or injuries, including those caused by landmines.

Give Back session a blessing for worldwide recipients

Inspired by a presentation at the October Second Tuesday Lunch, a group from our church gathered for a Give Back Work Session November 14. Coordinated by Louise Stanley, the group spent several evening hours assisting in the creation of mobility carts at the founding center for Mobility Worldwide in Columbia.

A brief description of the organization is shown on the flyer cover at left. It was founded in Columbia in 1994 by Methodist Minister Mel West in association with a missionary and product designer in response to a tragic loss of mobility in Zaire due to land mines and polio.

A production shop was opened in 2000, and of the more than 90,000 carts deployed to over 100 countries, more than 29,000 of them have been deployed from Columbia. *(Continued on Page 8)*



Some jobs need describing to the volunteers, others can be handled by the skills brought to the job. All are equally important to the completion of a cart and getting it ready to be shipped to its future very proud and appreciative owner.





The Columbia facility recently announced a goal of making 50 carts a week in 2023, making the need for more volunteers even more critical. Please call them at 573-886-7877 if you are interested in helping.

According to the June newsletter, as of June 15, 750 carts have been built this year. For 2021, a total of 1,518 were built, and 21 shipments were made to nine countries. This was the result of 14,400 hours of work by over 200 volunteers, whose efforts were valued at \$431,280.

Executive Director Gary Moreau made the presentation at our church lunch, expressing the need for volunteers to handle the many steps in the production of a cart. He reports in his newsletter that production is down this year due to supply shortages and reduced volunteer participation. They have averaged 30 carts per week, and hope to average 50 per week in 2023.

As our Locust Grove team discovered, there are many small tasks required to build a cart, but until they are done, the rest of the process is at a stand still. If you are looking for a great way to spend an hour or two, nothing could reward you more.



Here is an alternative to serving turkey or ham. With prices going up at the grocery store a nice salmon filet can be a nice change. *Hope Burkart*

Spiced Salmon

1 - 2 lb salmon filet

Topping:

2 Tblsp packed brown sugar
1 Tblsp soy sauce
1 Tblsp melted butter
1 Tblsp olive oil
1/2 tsp garlic powder
1/2 tsp ground mustard
1/2 tsp paprika
1/2 tsp pepper
1/4 tsp dill weed
Dash salt

Mix topping ingredients and brush over salmon. Place salmon, skin side down on an oiled baking sheet. Grill, covered, over medium heat or broil 4 in. from heat until fish just begins to flake easily with fork, about 10-15 min.

If you attended the October Second Tuesday Lunch, you learned about these remarkable three-wheeled personal energy carts operated by hand power for those who have lost the use of their legs.

Inspired by Director Gary Moreau's presentation, our church decided to have a Give Back Work Day at the Columbia facility, sharing both professional and newfound skills in cart building.

When I finished taking photos of our crew at work in the various aspects of the building process, I put the camera aside and



began assembling some sort of bracket which required three bolts placed in a metal framework, an integral part of the cart.

After learning the most efficient technique for my job, I felt I was playing an important role in the many steps of producing a cart.

It was a simple, but very rewarding, task; but the greatest reward crept into my thoughts the next day, when I realized that those parts I was assembling would find their way to someone in a far-away land who otherwise would be crawling on their hands and knees wherever they wanted to go.

I was one small part of an enormous team effort which has created 90,000 carts since 1974, with more than 29,000 of those coming from the program's birthplace here in Columbia. Be proud, MLGUMC.
