In addition to the Chairpersons of the governance committees, the Council is made up of the Council Chairperson, the Lay Leader, and the Chairpersons of our non-governance committees: Worship Committee, Mission Committee, Cemetery Committee, as well as the Ministry Directors, and Pastor. October was a good month concerning gifts and contributions. We received \$27,712 for the general fund, which is very good. For the year, we have received \$226,417. This gives us a monthly average of \$22,641.

We are now at \$172,700 received and pledged for Firm Foundation, which is more than 75% of our goal. We still have a challenge to get to 100%. I know we are all enjoying our beautiful sanctuary, and we anticipate the completion of the Midway Students area and the new restrooms. I hope we will all get together to raise the remaining amount needed for this work.





Thanksgiving is here. Lots of turkey. . .what to do with the leftovers? Casseroles are always a good back up plan. Enjoy.

Hope Burkart
Turkey Noodle Casserole

12 oz. egg noodles
2 cups shredded turkey
1 tbsp. oil
1 small diced onion
2 diced celery stalks
Salt and pepper to taste
2 cans of cream of mushroom soup
2 cups of shredded cheddar cheese
1 cup frozen peas
Crushed potato chips

Prepare egg noodles per package instructions, reserving 1/2 cup of the water. Return noodles to pot, add canned soup and water a little at a time till desired consistency is achieved. Heat oil and cook onions and celery till soft. Add veggies, cheese and turkey to noodles. Stir to combine. Spread into 9x13 baking dish and top with crushed potato chips. Bake 15 to 20 minutes or until top is brown.
