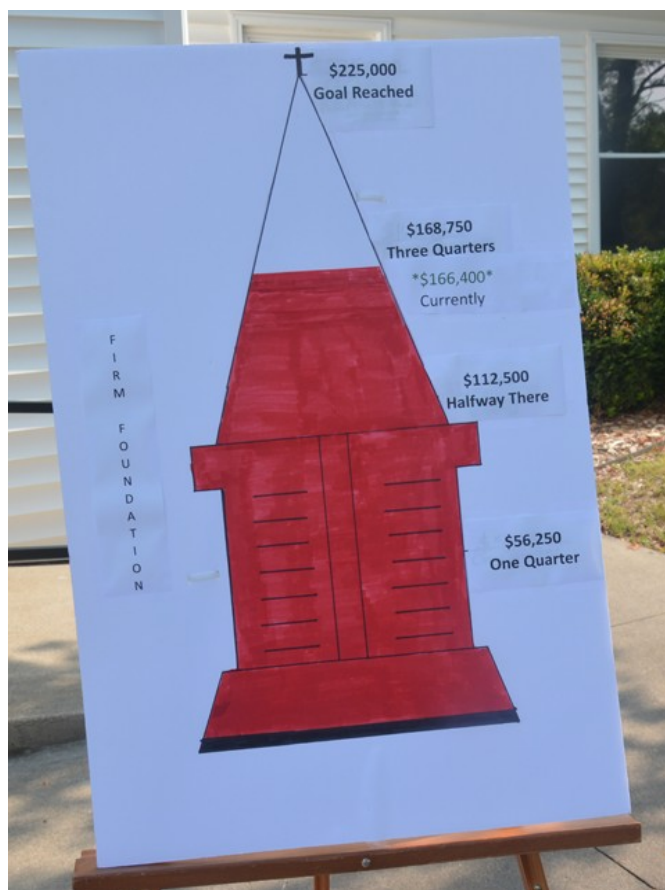
## TREASURY NOTES

Ticket prices: 1 = \$1, 5 = \$4, 20 = \$15, 50 = \$30.

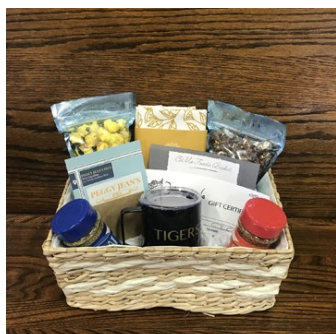

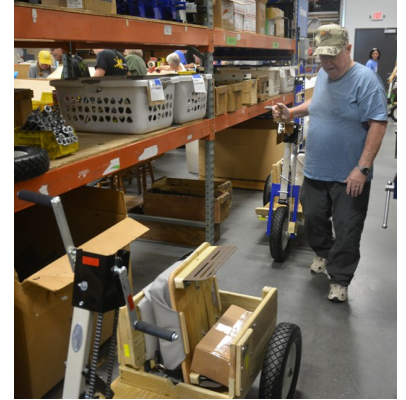
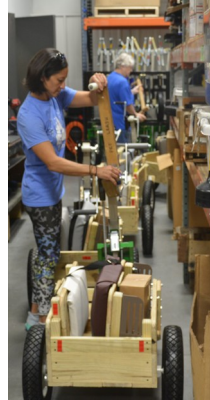




# Mobility Worldwide work day

## Bread Pudding

- 1 16oz loaf French bread
- 5 large eggs
- 1 (15 oz) can fruit cocktail -do not drain
- 3/4 cup golden raisins
- 2 1/2 cups sugar
- 4 cups milk
- 1/2 Tblsp cinnamon
- Pinch bread into bite size pieces - about 8 cups
- Spread in sprayed 9x13 pan
- Whisk eggs, add fruit cocktail, raisins, sugar, milk and cinnamon.
- Pour over bread and gently mix, making sure bread is submerged in milk.
- Let set for 15 -20 min.
- Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour
- Serve with Rum Sauce

## Rum Sauce

- 2 sticks unsalted butter Melt butter and add powdered sugar. Add
- 1-1/2 cups powdered sugar and stir well. Stir in rum and 1 tsp. vanilla
- 2 Tblsp rum
- Drizzle over warm bread pudding.

### The Back Row By Gene Baumann

Our current renovation projects are not our first experience with construction chaos interrupting our worship and activities. Below are some of the improvements reported in the 1997 history book. Many more have since been done leading up to the present improvements in the sanctuary, basement and restrooms.

1817 — Met in home of founder Reuben Hatton.  
1824 — Moved to larger home of William Douglas.  
1830 — Brick Chapel erected of locally made brick, with a row of cabins alongside for use at camp meetings.  
1870 — Present sanctuary built to replace the crumbling Brick Chapel.  
1909 — Sanctuary remodeled with addition

of bell tower and stained glass windows.  
1915 — Hanging gasoline lamps replaced with acetylene lights, and pews replaced pine benches.  
1926 — 12 by 15 addition of northside storeroom.  
1936 — Kitchen added to northwest corner.  
1938 — Electric lights replaced lamps.  
1945 — Bell purchased for steeple.  
1952 — Fellowship Hall built west of sanctuary.  
1956 — Cistern well dug and piped to kitchen.  
1961 — Improvements to sanctuary, new ceiling, crying room, wood paneling in pulpit area, sign on front lawn.  
1966 — Education wing of six classrooms added.  
1967 — First telephone, water heater, public water line, and modern restrooms.  
1982 — New roof on sanctuary, ramp to Fellowship Hall entry.  
1991 — Sanctuary remodeling, new furnace and central air conditioning.  
1997 — Locust Grove Church Road leveled, widened and paved. Church parking areas and the cemetery road also were paved.
