Lesson Summary:

Tonight's lesson aims to debunk 3 popular myths about the accuracy of the Bible:

1. The Bible has changed over the centuries so you can't trust it.
2. The Bible was written so long after the events that you can't trust it.
3. The writers of the Bible were biased; they had their own agendas, and they wrote what they wanted readers to believe.

The Bible is historically reliable, and evidence supports the Bible as an accurate and trustworthy document.

6. How important is it to be able to fully trust the Bible when it comes to whether or not to believe the message of Jesus (that He died on the cross to pay for our sins)? Why?

7. Was there anything Pastor Adam shared that you found confusing or didn't make sense to you?
8. What is a question you still have or an issue you wrestle with about the accuracy and reliability of the Bible that was NOT answered in tonight's lesson?
