2.5.25 & 2.12.25 *Psalm 78* *A Story Worth Sharing*

Lesson Summary:

Tonight's lesson focuses on Psalm 78, highlighting the importance of passing God's truth across generations. Written by Asaph, it's a call to remember God's deeds and pass them on to the next generation, especially as a guide to avoid repeating past mistakes.

The core message is about the responsibility we all have to share God's truth with others, especially younger generations. Psalm 78 emphasizes the importance of remembering God's greatness, teaching future generations, and avoiding the rebellion of previous generations. The illustration of a relay race is used to explain the passing of faith, where the handoff is critical for success.

Key Points:

The Point:

If we don't learn from the PAST, we won't change the FUTURE

The Problem:

We can't TEACH what we don't KNOW

4 Key Truths You Must Know to Teach the Next Generation:

1. The GREATNESS of GOD
2. The DANGER of DISOBEDIENCE
3. The SERIOUSNESS of God's RESPONSE
4. The GENEROSITY of God's GRACE

Discussion Questions:

1. How does Psalm 78 challenge us to remember and share God's greatness with the next generation?
2. What are some personal stories or experiences you've had that remind you of God's faithfulness?
3. Why is it so important to teach the next generation about the dangers of disobedience and rebellion?
4. In what ways have you seen God's grace at work in your life, even when you didn't deserve it?
5. How can we make sure we're not repeating the same mistakes as previous generations, as mentioned in Psalm 78?
6. How do you think we can model repentance and confession of sin to those around us, especially your peers, your siblings and those younger than you?
7. What does it look like to live authentically and share God's story with others in your daily life?
8. What is one thing that you can apply to your life from what you learned tonight?
