FBB1-5-17: The Deity of the God of All Ages - God (Father) During the Flesh of Christ – God After the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ

God After the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ

New Testament references of the Father, or God, after the resurrection and ascension of Christ show proof that God is all and in all - in and through Christ.

God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Corinthians 1:3 Grace be unto you, and peace, from **God our Father, and from** the Lord Jesus Christ.

Galatians 1:1-4 Paul, an apostle, (not of men, neither by man, but by Jesus Christ, and God the Father, who raised him from the dead;) 2 And all the brethren which are with me, unto the churches of Galatia: 3 Grace be to you and peace **from God the Father, and from** our Lord Jesus Christ, 4 Who gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God and our Father:

As also says God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: 2 Corinthians 1:2; Ephesians 1:2; Ephesians 6:23; Philippians 1:2; Colossians 1:2; 1 Thessalonians 1:1; 2 Thessalonians 1:2; 1 Timothy 1:2; 2 Timothy 1:2; Titus 1:4; Philemon 1:3; 1 Peter 1:3; 2 John 1:3-4

Jesus did not assume God's identity but was given reign over God's Kingdom. The reign of Jesus Christ does indeed have an end. The Kingdom of God does not have an end. Jesus Christ is the intermediary between God and mankind and will bring many sons unto this glory.

1 Corinthians 15:23-28 But every man in his own order: Christ the firstfruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming. 24 Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom **to God, even the Father**; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power. 25 For he **must reign, till** he hath put all enemies under his feet. 26 The last enemy *that* shall be destroyed *is* death. 27 For he hath put all things under his feet. But when he saith all things are put under *him*, *it is* manifest that he is excepted which did put all things under him. 28 And when all things shall be subdued unto him, then shall the Son also himself be subject **unto him** that put all things under him, **that God may be all in all.**

1 Corinthians 15:57 But thanks be **to God**, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.



Hebrews 2:6-18 But one in a certain place testified, saying, What is man, that **thou** art mindful of him? or the son of man, that **thou** visitest him? 7 **Thou** madest him a little lower than the angels; **thou** crownedst him with glory and honour, and **didst set him** over the works of thy hands: 8 **Thou** hast put all things in subjection under his feet. For in that he put all in subjection under him, he left nothing *that is* not put under him. But now we see not yet all things put under him. 9 But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man. 10 For it became him, for whom *are* all things, and by whom *are* all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the **captain of their salvation** perfect through sufferings. 11 For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified *are* all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren, 12 Saying, I will declare thy name unto my brethren, in the midst of the church will I sing praise unto thee. 13 And again, I will put my trust in him. And again, Behold I and the children **which God hath given me**. 14 Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; 15 And deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage. 16 For verily he took not on *him the nature of* angels; but he took on *him* the seed of Abraham. 17 Wherefore in all things it behoved him to be made like unto *his* brethren, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest **in things pertaining to God**, to make reconciliation for the sins of the people. 18 For in that he himself hath suffered being tempted, he is able to succour them that are tempted.

Matthew 28:18 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power **is given unto me** in heaven and in earth.

All of the totality of God did not dwell within the confines of the fleshly body of Christ; however, all of the divine nature and purity of God did.

Colossians 2:8-10 Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ. 9 For in him **dwell**eth all the **fulness** of the **Godhead** bodily. 10 And ye are **complete** in him, which is the head of all principality and power:

Dwelleth: (Greek 2730: as used in *Colossians 2:9*) 2730 katoikeo kat-oy-keh'-o from 2596 and 3611; **to house permanently**, i.e. **reside** (literally or figuratively):--dwell(-er), inhabitant(-ter).

Fulness: (Greek 4138: as used in *Colossians 2:9*) pleroma play'-ro-mah from 4137; repletion or **completion**, i.e. (subjectively) **what fills** (as contents, supplement, copiousness, multitude), or (objectively) **what is filled** (as container, performance, period):--which is put in to fill up, piece that filled up, fulfilling, full, fulness.

Complete: (Greek 4137: as used in *Colossians 2:10*) plero play-ro'-o from 4134; **to make replete**, i.e. (literally) **to cram** (a net), **level up** (a hollow), or (figuratively)

to **furnish** (or imbue, diffuse, influence), satisfy, execute (an office), **finish** (a period or task), verify (or coincide with a prediction), etc.:--accomplish, X after, (be) complete, end, expire, fill (up), fulfil, (be, make) full (come), fully preach, perfect, supply.

Perfect: (Greek 5048: as used in *1 John 4:17*) teleioo tel-i-o'-o from 5046; to **complete**, i.e. (literally) **accomplish**, or (figuratively) **consummate** (in character):--consecrate, finish, fulfil, make) **perfect**.

1 John 4:11-14 Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another. 12 No man hath seen God at any time. If we love one another, **God dwelleth in us**, and his love is perfected in us. 13 Hereby know we that **we dwell in him**, and **he in us**, because **he hath given us of his Spirit**. 14 And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world. 15 Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, **God dwelleth in him, and he in God**. 16 And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love **dwelleth in God**, and **God in him**. 17 Herein is our love **made perfect**, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, **so are we in this world**.
