FBB1-5-2-00: The Landmark Covenants - Introduction to Biblical Covenants

Covenant: (Merriam Webster); a usually formal, solemn, and binding agreement:

Covenant: (Hebrew 1285: *Genesis 6:18*) **a compact** (because made by passing between pieces of flesh):--**confederacy**, (con-)feder(-ate), **covenant**, league.

Genesis 6:17-18 And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein *is* the breath of life, from under heaven; *and* every thing that *is* in the earth shall die. 18 But with thee will I establish my covenant; and thou shalt come into the ark, thou, and thy sons, and thy wife, and thy sons' wives with thee.

Types of Covenants:

There are mainly two types of covenants described in the Old Testament: *Covenant of Promise* (Grant) and a *Covenant of Law* (a Suzerain-vassel or Treaty).

Promise: (Merriam Webster); *a*. a declaration that one will do or refrain from doing something specified; *b*. a legally binding declaration that gives the person to whom it is made a right to expect or to claim the performance or forbearance of a specified act.

Law: (Merriam Webster) a binding custom or practice of a community: a rule of conduct or action prescribed or formally recognized as binding or enforced by a controlling authority.

Suzerain: (Merriam Webster); a superior lord to whom faithfulness is obligated to.

Master: (Merriam Webster); one having authority over another.

Vassal: (Merriam Webster); one in a subservient or subordinate position.

Comparison of Covenant Attributes	
Promise	Law
The covenant giver makes a commitment to the vassal	The vassal is under obligation to the master
The master is obligated to his vassal	The vassal is obligated to his master
Primarily the rights of the vassal are safeguarded	Primarily the rights of the master are safeguarded
