



FCS1-2-CT Chapter Two: The Christian Spirit

This test is for those seeking ministry accreditation, and is not a requirement for students that are freely seeking knowledge and understanding of the Gospel of Christ. If you have been told that you are required to obtain this ministry accreditation for this course, you are required to successfully complete this test with the minimum grade listed in your ministry accreditation prerequisite.

This is a test covering the contents of Chapter Two – The Christian Spirit. All questions below have been already asked within each lesson. This is considered to be an open-book test that requires no time limits or proxy. The person taking this test is welcome to use any resource that is available to them.

For those that are using the online campus, this test will be graded immediately and the tracking system will automatically assign your grade. You will have only one try to complete this test, so take your time and provide the best answers.

For those that are taking this test by other-than online means, you will be graded manually by the designated proxy of Advancing Education (or church representative) in your area. A copy of your test (PDF or paper version) will be sent to your ministry leader (or their representative), and forwarded to the Director of Advancing Education for official recognition and any awarded certification(s). The Director of Advancing Education shall deliver the appropriate certification(s) to the requesting person or ministry representative.

It is expected that a person should correctly score and accumulate at least 90 percent of the possible points. If a person were to answer every question perfectly they would accumulate 100 points. To achieve a minimum of 90 percent, a person would need at least 90 of the possible 100 points. *(The campus platform automatically declares a score percentage of 70% a passing score that will allow a student to continue to the next lesson. Therefore, even if the platform declares a passing score at 70/100, Ministry Accreditation requires at least 90/100).*
