FCS1-3-14: What is Prayer?

Prayer: (Greek 4335 – as used in *Philippians 4:6*) proseuche pros-yoo-khay' from 4336; prayer (worship); by implication, **an oratory** (chapel):--X **pray earnestly, prayer**.

Prayer is a reverent communication to God. Prayer is the manner in which we communicate with God. There are no phone lines, cell towers, or Internet connections needed. It is through prayer that we connect our souls with God our Creator.

However, prayer is more than just mere words. It is how we can openly and honestly communicate our heart's intentions to God. Prayer goes beyond repeating phrases or printed lines on a page.

Jesus taught his disciples how to pray:

Matthew 6:7-8 But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking. 8 Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him.

God wants people to communicate with Him; and He wants them to communicate to Him with their hearts.

Luke 6:45 A good man out of the good treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is evil: for of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaketh.

Philippians 4:6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.

Prayer is more than words than mere words; it is the communication of a person's heart, in words, unto God.

Psalms 19:14 Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O LORD, my strength, and my redeemer.
