FCS1-3-16: Effects of Prayer

God hears all prayers and answers them according to His will for our lives. We pray to God in faith, knowing that He will answer our prayers according to what is spiritually best for us.

James 5:15-18 And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. 16 Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. 17 Elias was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months. 18 And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth brought forth her fruit.

When we ask God to save our loved ones, friends and neighbors, He will touch their heart; but it is up to them how they will respond to His touch.

2 Timothy 2:25-26 In meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of the truth; 26 And that they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken captive by him at his will.

We have to remember that God knows what He has in store for our lives and the lives of our loved ones. He may be waiting for the right time to answer our prayers or He may have other plans that we have not yet considered. The answer we are seeking may not be what He wants for us.

Proverbs 3:5-7 Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. 6 In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths. 7 Be not wise in thine own eyes: fear the LORD, and depart from evil.

When we ask God to bless and direct our lives in His ministry, He will do it. He will answer abundantly because we asked Him to.
