FCS1-3-21: Personal Praise and Worship

God wants praise and worship from His children; at any time. He receives the sincere praises of those that worship Him, whether alone, or in a group.

Hebrews 13:15 By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of *our* lips giving thanks to his name.

Psalms 55:16-17 As for me, I will call upon God; and the LORD shall save me. 17 Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud: and he shall hear my voice.

1 Peter 2:9 But ye *are* a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light:

God hears and honors our personal prayer and the sacrifice of our worship; especially in hard times. Our praise and our worship mean more to Him then because it takes more strength to offer it.

Acts 16:25-26 And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them. 26 And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed.

God not only heard the prayers, the praises and the songs from Paul and Silas, it moved Him to take action.

Psalms 18:6-7 In my distress I called upon the LORD, and cried unto my God: he heard my voice out of his temple, and my cry came before him, *even* into his ears. 7 Then the earth shook and trembled; the foundations also of the hills moved and were shaken, because he was wroth.

Psalms 29:1-2 Give unto the LORD, O ye mighty, give unto the LORD glory and strength. 2 Give unto the LORD the glory due unto his name; worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness.

God hears the sincerity of our praise, our worship and our cries unto Him. Even in times of distress, it moves God when He sees the sincerity and the sacrifice of personal praise.
