Exodus Study #19

Exodus 19:1-25

1. Verses 1-6

- a. What has God already done for Israel, and how do the titles “treasured possession” and “kingdom of priests” reveal His purpose for them?
- b. How does remembering God’s grace shape the way we understand and respond to obedience?

2. Verses 7-9

- a. How do the people respond to God’s covenant invitation, and why is it often easier to commit with our words than follow through?
- b. What role do leadership and community play in helping God’s people remain obedient?

3. Verses 10-15

- a. Why does God require preparation and boundaries before meeting with His people, and what does this teach us about His holiness?
- b. What might intentional preparation to meet God look like in our lives today?

4. Verses 16-25

- a. How is God’s presence described on Mount Sinai, and why does He reveal Himself with such power and awe?
- b. How should this passage shape the way we approach God today, especially in light of Christ? (Hebrews 12:18-24)

How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - Observation – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - Interpretation – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
 - Application – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
