

SEVEN REASONS WE GET STUCK

1. You have not completely worked the previous principle

3. You have not accepted Jesus' work on the cross for your forgiveness.

But if we confess our sins to him, he can be depended on to forgive us . . . from every wrong. (1 John 1:9 LB)

So overflowing is his kindness towards us that he took away all our sins through the blood of his Son, by whom we are saved. (Ephesians 1:7 LB)

Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be white as snow, through they are as red as crimson, they shall be as wool. (Romans 8:1 NIV)

4. You have not forgiven others who have harmed you

After you have suffered a little while, our God, who is full of kindness through Christ, will give you his eternal glory. He personally will pick you up, and set you firmly in place and make you stronger than ever. (1 Peter 5:10–11 LB)
