Dear Ones of Revival For Our Day,

We greet you in the matchless name of Christ. We confess that we do not know anything, only by the grace of God.

As we begin this new year, we wanted to share a message with you that the Lord gave Rev. Helm at Parker City Christ Fellowship on New Year's Day in 1995.

I want to share with you some good news, some striking news, some amazing news. It is found in the sixth chapter of I Corinthians. Since the fall of man, this news has seldom been able to enter into the human heart. The more you know, the more you will have to die to get what is said in this message. The more you know, what you know will control you, will control your choices and decisions; it will dominate you.

This that I want to share with you is so simple; it is a declaration of simplicity. What I have to say in this good news, this stirring news, this everlasting news is never ending. The truth of it has seldom been heard since Adam fell. It has seldom been realized or appreciated. It is so simple that it has seldom been perceived by the most brilliant mind. The news is so simple that unless God reveals it to you, it will be hidden from you. Only a few have been able to break through the barrier.

This message is not to one segment of society, it is not to one locality, it is not to one nation, it is not just to those of certain creeds or ideas. This good news is for everyone! I have never preached this and I have never heard it preached. What I have to tell you is so simple and you will say to yourself, "This really is simplicity." It is just common truth. It has been walked right over many times. The closer you are to Jesus, the more it will strike you. If you are a distance from Jesus, it won't mean much. This news is far reaching and it is for everyone on the face of the earth. It is to the lowly and the sophisticated. It has seldom been heard in the heart of man.

I need to share another scripture with you first. This is not my text, it is just a "helper". It is in the second chapter of Philippians. It will help us understand something. How far can our understanding reach if we doubt, speculate or analyze? In verse 21 we read, "For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's." It says that all seek their own. Who is he talking about? It is all men in the flesh who have not given themselves over to Christ Jesus and doing God's will every moment of their lives. How many men and women is that?

The goal is to become nothing - that is the inner death and slaying. It is leaving and forsaking all - it is putting everything aside and doing God's will completely. How far is it from where you begin until you find out you are nothing? What is the distance and what is required to bring us to that place?

Are you still with me? I hope that this steak of truth is not so thick that you can't chew it up well, grind it to powder, and put it in your spiritual stomachs until it gives you a spring in your soul and a song in your heart!

It is possible to know all the things of philosophy, medicine and agriculture and not know anything about the text for this morning. Only those who approach nothing will appreciate my sermon this morning. The rest will be figurers. The more you know you are nothing, the greater you realize your need. If that is all you get out of this sermon, that will be so much to swallow that when you get it into your stomach, you will be like a spring. You will go out with living waters!

The message I am giving you today is never ending. Only a few through the ages have heard it or maintained it. I know it has taken a while to get to the text, but I thought you ought to know a few things before we started into it. If you can hold fast to your heart all the things I have said to you, we may be in the beginning of revival.

This message should be broadcast from the housetops all over the hemispheres. I have never heard it preached as a sermon nor have I ever tried to preach it in 62 years. This text is so alarming that it disturbs every carnal

heart, but is received with pleasure in the childlike spirit.

Here is my text for the morning. "And ye are not your own." You are not yours. Hardly anyone has heard this in order to perceive. Those who know it are lovers and followers of Jesus. "Ye are not your own. For ye are bought with a price . . ." (I Corinthians 6:19b-20).

If we are not our own, then we can't make our own plans or arrangements - we can't do anything, for we are utterly dependent upon God. You are not your own - you belong to the King of Kings and the Blood Washed One of Calvary who has brought us from the darkness into a marvelous light! You don't belong to yourself!

Loran Helm does not belong to himself. He belongs to God and must do what God tells him to do. This is true for all men who have been born since Adam. This is true for all races and all colors. "Ye are not your own."

You are not your own possession. Most all men and women think they belong to themselves and they can make their own choices - for every choice that you make that is not of the Lord, you will suffer a consequence. You have been bought with a price and that price is the blood of Jesus Christ and His death on the cross.

All clergy and ministers are not their own. God has been trying for centuries to find someone who would follow Him. "For as many as are led by the Holy Spirit, they are the sons of God." God wants us to maintain spiritual balance so that we are not radical or fanatical.

If any man or woman in this place can get this revelation it will be wonderful. If I were talking to a million and only a handful would get this, it would be something to be thankful for.

You are not your own; you have been bought by a great price. God himself came down to dwell in human flesh and He went to Calvary to purchase you and me. He wanted all men to follow Him, but He couldn't find hardly anyone. This hasn't changed, has it?

When you realize that you are not your own, how much love will flow through you? Until we realize that we are not our own, God's love is blocked. The self in us will dam

it up. Does this witness in your heart?

If mankind could learn this truth, our prisons would be empty. If every man and woman knew this text, there wouldn't be any stealing, adultery, fornication, gossip, judging, or hurting. There would be healing.

For ye are not your own. What kind of discovery is this? Could you classify this discovery among the greatest? We all depend upon the discovery of the wheel, but this is far greater than the discovery of the wheel.

When all men seek their own then God's revelation is crowded out. The more we know, the less revelation of God we have. We want to depend more upon what we know than upon the revelation of God.

This message has come by revelation. I have never preached this message; I don't have any notes with me.

Aren't you glad that Joseph found out that he didn't belong to himself? Did he find it out in the pit or before? It operates with me that Joseph found it out before the pit experience. That is why he could suffer in the pit and never complain. In the pit there was no escape or exit; there were no stairs or ladders to help him to get out.

How much does a person die in the pit experience? How much dying will it require before you perceive this message? How much inner death will be required for us to know that we are not our own? This is good news! We can look up and say, "Praise God for the good news that I don't belong to myself any longer!" God always gives the best to those who leave the choice to Him.

Where are you going? Are you going to this text to find out what it really means or are you going to exist in the city of self will? Are you going to live in the village of self want? Are you going to live in the community of self desire? Where are you going? We are all going somewhere - even when we are standing still. While you are sitting there, you are going somewhere. While you have listened to me in this message, you have made some plans. Wouldn't it be wonderful if this message could bring awakening to our minds?

We will never be able to love our neighbor as ourselves until we realize that we are not our own. That just came to me.

What would have to occur to bring man to the realization that he is not his own? Most


persons from the time of birth have been doing their own plan. When will you decide to believe that you are not your own?

If this message is being recorded on tape, which I think it is and should end up being used for a newsletter, you may have to read it six times and it will break through the barriers in us. He will open it to us little by little. I want you to know that all hell is against this message; all carnality and all flesh are against it. It is by the grace of God that we can die sufficiently to appreciate it and be thankful for it.

Didn't I tell you that this was a striking and alarming message? There is not a man or woman born that belongs to themselves. Jesus has been trying to find a people who will realize this. This is a straight message! How long will you be able to maintain it? How long will it be before you realize this revelation?

You are not your own for you have been bought by the price of the blood of Jesus Christ to do as He would lead us to do for His glory. In the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost. Amen.


He says "My yoke is easy and my burden is light." We are thankful that Jesus will take our burdens as we yield to Him what we have and what we are.

Dear Rev. Helm,

is that which comes from the heart as the heart is led by the Holy Spirit.



P.S. Rev. Helm asked to have the following letters included for God's glory and for your encouragement.

Dear Rev. Helm,

I thank God our Father for His mercy and love that is beyond all measure and understanding. That He would indeed give us this day, as the sun shines

bright in the blue Florida sky, to praise and worship Him and acknowledge Him in all things. And yet He remains still present even in the darkest night, the deepest pit, the most wretched circumstance.

I thank God our Father that He would restore you and provide you with renewed strength and calm, and enable you to respond to the further leading of the Holy Spirit. And I thank you for your continued and repeated demonstration of obedience. I thank you for your meeting in Palm Beach Gardens and I thank you for your visit last Sunday morning to Oasis Christ Fellowship. And I thank you for your kind, careful, patient, and repeated instruction.

When he learned of the Palm Beach Gardens Monday night meeting, our Pastor was prompted to call and invite my wife Nancy and I. He confessed initial hesitation, being aware of certain of my circumstances, and he was somewhat reluctant to extend an invitation that would require a "drop everything else we're leaving in three hours" response, but he obeyed. We accepted, and since we were unable (for the first time ever) to find anyone to baby-sit our 9 year old daughter, we had no choice but to bring her also. Our "choice" would not have been to bring a small child on such a long ride and then expect attentiveness, but we had no choice. It was not our choice.

As the service began, I cautioned our 9 year old daughter, Hannah, that the enemy would not only attempt to distract her, but would also attempt to use her to distract others. I shared with her my belief that if she would press in, God would reward her and she would hear and experience things that she would remember for the rest of her life. And she was attentive.

As the meeting progressed, you interrupted your teaching to speak of one present with a disorder in the lower back. My wife Nancy stood and received and gave glory and thanks to God for the healing of her back, which has not since caused her pain. All glory to God and His son our Lord Jesus Christ.

As the meeting neared end, Hannah began to experience increasingly severe pains in her toes, feet and ankles. For several years, more than 3 or 4, this unexplained pain has afflicted her at random moments, almost always at night and usually waking her from sleep. In response to her cries and calls, I have often rubbed her feet and manipulated her toes and ankles for 20, 30 or 40 minutes in order to bring relief. But on that Monday night in Palm Beach Gardens, the pain did not lessen in response to my efforts.

Nancy and I both sat with Hannah, comforting her and rubbing her feet and the congregation stood for dismissal. Then we withdrew to the foyer and I again sat with Hannah.

I have had the privilege of hearing you speak on more than several occasions. I thought it most uncharacteristic that you had tarried in the foyer after the service, but my focus was upon Hannah's need. Then you approached and asked me the cause

of her distress, and how long had she suffered with it. My first spoken words to you were, "I believe it is some form of circulation problem." You prayed for Hannah, you laid hands upon her, you prayed not only for her healing and relief of pain but for her sweet spirit. And then you asked her to walk and as she walked her tears of pain turned to tears of joy, her cries to cries of laughter and, I am told by friends who observed, her face was filled with joy indescribable. And what is that worth? Can we truly consider the cost?

It was quite late as we drove North to Ormond Beach. Hannah did not sleep. She had received more than what had been promised; we had all received so much more.

God is so good, so merciful, so loving. It was thought that you might visit Oasis Christ Fellowship the following Sunday. But you did not, and I considered that a further blessing. Surely God knew that my elder daughters (He has blessed us with 4) would not be returning, from the college where He had placed them, until the next weekend, Palm Sunday!

Surely I did not hear or receive every morsel that your teaching and instruction provided last Sunday morning. I have come to believe that not every message is addressed to me. Perhaps that is why we in attendance can each find a precious treasure, sometimes unique one from the other. But I listened to your words, your several brief references to the suffering young child that God had so lovingly healed, your instruction on John 16:13. My Bible margins reminded me that you had spoken on that verse when you visited Oasis in March, 1994; and again in Israel in April, 1994; and again in Chicago in July, 1994. But for the first time I heard the message on Sunday, March 23, 1997.

Dear Rev. Helm,

So thankful for how the Lord helped you to pray for me about 3 weeks ago. I had been suffering with this pregnancy for about three months. I was in my fourth month and wasn't getting any relief. Seven weeks of it were especially hard. I had a lot of vomiting and extreme fatigue. And if you know me, you know how hard it is to slow me down!

I would get up in the morning sometimes and in one hour go back to bed. Sometimes I would get winded just walking through the house. I lost almost all my appetite and couldn't keep much down - losing 8 pounds in four weeks. After about seven weeks of this, I was fighting discouragement. I know the Lord was helping to teach me some things about patience and trust. He was trying to teach me about not complaining - I hope I learned something about that too! Robert and Charles were such helpers and lights.

Two weeks before Robert and I were both scheduled to speak at White Harvest, that precious church started to pray for me. Their prayers lifted me out of the nausea and gave me enough strength to make it to Indiana. The time there was blessed of the Lord and God strengthened me just as I would need it. The day after, I went to my parents and was not recuperating very well. It seemed I was almost back to square one.

Tuesday morning while I was still in bed, you called my parents, who mentioned that I would probably not make it to the South Carolina meetings. After finding out my situation, you asked to pray for me. My mother ran up the stairs and said, "Get on the phone, Brother Helm wants to pray for you!" I

took the phone beside the bed and you started to pray. Within about 30 seconds the Lord showed you that something needed to move up or down - and the Lord witnessed on 'down'. You prayed for things to move down. Little did you know that the midwives had been telling me that my womb was high. We never thought it was connected to the symptoms, but evidently that was part of the problem, for after you prayed, things immediately improved.

The nausea lifted almost completely and my strength and appetite began to return. I remember eating well that night, and then even better the next night. It was three or four days later after arriving back home that I walked 2 miles and felt good.

Even though I still have to take it easy at times - I am now able to eat almost anything, can take walks outside, which I love to do, and can cook and teach some music. I want to thank the Lord for what a difference He made, and so suddenly. I have heard of people who had this kind of weakness and sickness for the whole nine months. That is something that I don't like to think about!

At my last appointment the midwife was checking the height of my womb and I was watching her face closely. "Let's see . . . you are right here . . . perfect! Great!" she said with a big smile. I was smiling too.

Dear Ones of Revival For Our Day,

During the meetings in South Carolina, I was speaking concerning the storm that Jesus and his disciples were involved in on the Sea of Galilee. When the severe winds and waves came, the boat was full of water. When they landed, Jesus came out of the boat and was met by a man possessed of devils. This man knew Jesus and called him. He knew that Jesus was the Son of God.

Jesus worked with this man, prayed for him and the man became a new creature. The other people were stirred up because this man was sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed, and in his right mind. Many of the people requested Jesus to leave.

As Jesus began to leave, this precious man, who had been made whole, wanted to go with Jesus. Jesus told the man to go back home and tell everyone what the Lord had done for him.

The man returned home and began to publish abroad what the Christ had done for him. The Holy Spirit began to work through the words of this man's testimony. His family and neighbors could see a change in this man. We read in the scripture that when Jesus came back all the people were waiting for Him. It doesn't say some - it says all.

God took one man who was willing to witness and willing to be obedient to testify and changed a whole community. This whole community was different because of one man.

I always marvel when I read that they were all waiting for Jesus. God can take one person and change a community, or a home, or a church, or a family.

Thank you praying for us. It is only through the mercy of God that we make it each day. Prayer changes things and helps us when the storms come. We need to persevere in prayer.

I want to share a few thoughts from a message that the Lord gave me a few months ago in a meeting at Palm Beach Gardens Christ Fellowship.

In Luke 19 we read about Zacchaeus. Verse three says, "And he sought to see Jesus who he was . . ." What is in the word sought?

In the word sought, we see the condition of Zacchaeus' heart, the vision of his soul, and the evaluation of the interior life. This little man, who was despised and distressed, sought to see who Jesus was.

The word sought tells of a condition of care. How much care is required to have "and he sought"? Some care, deep care, all care? If you don't have all care, there won't be any "and he sought".

This is too great for me to comprehend. I have been on the way and I feel that I need so much more of Jesus, God and the Holy Ghost. I feel like I am so little. Do you feel that way?

Do you feel like you are just a beginner? Do you feel like you don't know much of anything? I feel that I need more of the Holy Spirit, more of Jesus, more of the Word, more of wisdom, holiness, purity, and righteousness. Jesus said, "Blessed are the poor in spirit . . ." Who are the poor in spirit? The poor are beggars for the bread of life?

How much of that love, that earnestness that Zacchaeus had is in your heart? What is the maximum, in love, that such a heart can possess?

"And he sought to see who Jesus was". He couldn't see because he was too short. How short are you (spiritually speaking)? Are you a dwarf, spiritually, or are you a giant?

'Sought' contains love and vision. Vision flows from only one well, and that is the love of God, in Christ Jesus. "And he sought to see who Jesus was . . ." I am convinced that very few people, who have ever lived, have known who Jesus was. He had a lot of friends, a lot of followers, a lot of believers - but I think a great percent of them followed Him for the loaves and the fishes.

What governs my want to have sought until I find? The word 'sought' has eyes in

it. It has vision, it has care, it is full of love, it is full of effort and it is full of interest. How much interest is in the word 'sought'? How little interest can you have and still have "and he sought"?

There were four thousand with Jesus. I don't know how many hours they had been with him. I don't know how many people were healed or how many people were lifted.

The phrase, "and he sought" has borders - it has dimension. It has essence and value. What is the value that we find in the word 'sought'? How many of the our thousand had "and he sought"?

Jesus stopped under a tree, looked up and told Zacchaeus to make haste and come down. If you ever saw a surprised man, Zacchaeus was one. He was hidden in the branches of shyness. He was hidden in the branches of privacy.

Jesus told him to come down because there was love at the foot of the tree. Jesus knew that He was being sought by Zacchaeus and told him that He was going home with him.

When Zacchaeus came down from the tree, Jesus lost many followers. Actually, He had lost them before because the scripture says that they all murmured at Jesus. If they all murmured, they had it in their heart before Zacchaeus climbed the tree.

How much earnestness has to be in the human heart and mind to have "and he sought"? I am only hitting the edge of the fringe of this.



Dear Ones of Revival For Our Day,

We greet you in the matchless name of Christ. We confess that we do not know anything, only by the grace of God.

We have been having such a wonderful time here with Rev. and Mrs. Cox. We have had wonderful times around the table talking about the Kingdom of God.

I have had the opportunity to pray with several people around the country over the past few days and God has helped greatly. I have had some great meetings with dear ones on the telephone that have been beyond description. How in debt we are to Jesus for His goodness, mercy, love, and grace.

I was privileged to be able to pray for Kathryn Cox. She has had trouble for some time with her sciatic nerve and has had pain in the leg and hip. The doctors told her that there was nothing that could be done to help. But, after prayer, the Great Physician came and touched her and she has been able to rest and sleep through the night. Praise the Lord!

I have been meditating on a particular scripture that I have never heard mentioned, to my knowledge, from the pulpit in seventy years in the church. "And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force." (Matthew 11:12) I have never heard this preached, as far as I know.

"The weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds." (II Corinthians 10:4)

We need to seek first the Kingdom of God. I see that through prayer that is alive, we can enter into the Kingdom of Heaven. It is by prayer and by brokenness that we can press into the Kingdom. We can so easily stray. The flesh in us can do things so quickly that we miss our pursuing of the Kingdom of Heaven and we will pursue the mind of the flesh instead. God wants our pursuing to be in His Kingdom. We need to completely give over to prayer and self-denial.

Self-assertiveness is the very downfall of man. If Adam and Eve had denied self,

what would have occurred? If they had denied self, we would have averted what we are in. Self-denial is more important than we realize.

In pursuing the Kingdom of Heaven, the self in us needs to be cleansed and purged so that we are able, with a whole-heartedness, to seek first the Kingdom of God.

Child-likeness is an attribute of pursuing the Kingdom of Heaven. ". . . the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence and the violent take it by force." This occurs by brokenness, by yieldedness, by surrender, by waiting, by trusting with all our heart, by thoughtfulness, and by tenderness. What kind of a spirit do we have in our hearts? Do we have gentleness or carnality?

Jesus said that the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence and the violent take it by force. This is a spiritual force of preciousness, tenderness and of long suffering. Long suffering is the fruit of the cleansed heart, the heart that is sanctified. Long suffering is patience and endurance.

In the eighth chapter of Romans, verse fourteen says, "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God."

As I was meditating on this scripture, I was wondering how happy are we for the leading of the Holy Spirit in the heart, mind, and soul? As we read this scripture, how delighted are we in the fact that the Holy Spirit can lead us? This is a challenging and encouraging scripture. We know from this scripture that He will lead His children.

It is important that we all be led by the Holy Spirit. To have a church service without the leadership of the Holy Spirit is like trying to have rivers without water. It is like trying to have school without books. To just go through the motions of being led without really being led by the Holy Spirit is like trying to farm without soil.

It is not possible to be led by the Holy Spirit unless we are utterly dependent upon God, just as a little 15-18 month old baby is dependent upon its mother and father.

These requirements are simple, but they are profound. We do not merit being led by the Holy Spirit. It is only by the grace of God

that it can be. As I meditate on this scripture, I can see that this verse is of great importance.

There must be a complete compliance in my heart for His will at all times. We want to plan and we want to instigate. We cannot have any of man's planning in us and be led of the Holy Spirit.

Since Adam fell, the human race has done everything it can to work out what it wants. Hardly anyone has been willing to do only God's will.

If Lot had stayed home instead of going with Abraham, look at all the struggles, stress, troubles, and conflicts we would have missed from all over the world. His wife would not have turned into a pillar of salt. A lot of us have gone where we shouldn't have gone and we turn people into pillars of salt. We turn people into hard hearts because of our lack of wisdom or knowledge. We go where we shouldn't go and we cause people to look back at the circumstance and their hearts turn cold.

I am including the following message which the Lord helped me to share with the dear ones at Parker City Christ Fellowship a few weeks ago.

Blessed Jesus, we come with thanksgiving and praise to Thee for this service. We come to Thee concerning Thy Word and Thy Truth. May You be exalted and work in our hearts in this moment. We pray for souls. You said that if You would be lifted up, You would draw all men unto You. We pray for the new converts - that they will not get discouraged, but that they will be lifted up in their soul. We give Thee the glory and the praise, in Jesus' name. Amen.

Jesus said to two of his disciples, "Go your way into the village over against you: and as soon as ye be entered into it, ye shall find a colt tied, whereon never man sat; loose him, and bring him." (Mark 11:2)

What are we tied to? What will it take to be loosed from it? Many are tied to ideas, philosophies and ideologies. They are tied to these things and they can't get loose. What are we tied to that holds us and binds us so that we cannot witness, obey or follow as the Holy Spirit leads?

Many times we are tied to something and we are not aware of the attachment. This attachment may cause us great trial, test and struggle. Sometimes we are tied to ideas that come to us because of certain disappointments. We are so tied to the hurt that we are not able to be loosed from it in order to have real Holy Ghost victory.

It is easy for us to be tied up in education and think that it is the solution of all problems. If you do much reading, you will think that education will solve our ills and troubles. How can we be loosed from that which hinders us and causes us to live in bondage? What is holding you from

going to the Master and letting Him work through you?

What is the solution to being untied from that which keeps us and holds us? Many are tied to their desires. There are great numbers of people who have desires and they are bound to them. Consequently, they are not happy. They get what they want, but when they get it, they are sick of it!

We work so hard for what we think we want, that we fail to get what is really ours. What are we tied to that prevents us from revival? What are we attached to that prevents the Holy Spirit from being poured out? Is it things in our life - things that need to be confessed, restitutions that would set us free? Many would be set free if they would only make restitution. They are tied to stubbornness and resentment. This is worth the whole message!

We have so many things that are trying to tie us up. We are held captive to them and are not even aware of it. We are held captive to certain conditions because of our choices. The earthly choice always ties us to earthly purposes and prevents us from "walking in the light".

What holds us from waiting upon God? What holds us when we are to testify and we don't? Timidity? Stubbornness?


Many people are striving so hard to get what they want. When they get it, they are miserable. My father always was tied to the idea (since he was a boy) that if only he could get his father's farm, it would be one of the great joys of his life. One day that came to pass. What had tied him up in wants and desires finally came to him. Things began to happen after he purchased the farm that made him so miserable, that he said it was a great relief when we finally got rid of the farm. What he thought would bring him great joy, peace and rest actually brought him the reverse. What are we tied to that brings us into a life of reverse? Jesus said to first seek the Kingdom of God. What is holding us from seeking the Kingdom?

P.S. Rev. Helm asked that the following letters be included for the glory of God.

Rev. Helm asked me to write a little report on the booklet written by Esther Morey entitled, "The Lamb Will Rule, Not the Lion."

Esther wrote this essay in response to several heartbreaking situations she had observed. In her words, "This is just a sharing that was burning on my heart and that comes from experiences with the many children I teach, interact with, and of course, from experiences with our own son."

That burning in Esther's heart lasted for three days. When thoughts would come, she would rush to the computer and type them in. She kept pen and paper next to the bed for when she would receive thoughts in the night. After three days, the burden left her, and she was left with 13 pages of thoughts about the manner of raising small children.

She sent a copy to her father, Pastor Schultze. He, in turn, asked me to make and distributed copies to his congregation. Not wanting to just hand out 'copies' of FAX 'copies', I put it in booklet form. Esther decided she

wanted a few copies to share, so we printed 100 booklets.

As my wife, Karin, Esther's sister, read the booklet, she recalled hearing Elizabeth Elliot (wife of Jim Elliot, one of the five missionaries killed by the Auca Indians of South America some years ago) comment on the radio about Susannah Wesley's thoughts on teaching a baby to cry softly, wondering how that was accomplished. Karin sent "The Lamb..." to Mrs. Elliot, not telling anyone she had done so. Mrs. Elliot liked the booklet, shared part of it at a conference in California, and asked permission to print a section in her newsletter, later learning that its distribution is worldwide (A few copies are now in foreign lands, being used by missionaries). Since then, over 800 copies have been sent out.

A woman from Oklahoma read "The Lamb" and has been using it in her ministry to Chinese mothers. Jane Zhao, one of the mothers who received a book, lives in Michigan. Jane and her husband, both engineers, have only been in the States about four years and had found Christ since their arrival. In March, I received a call from Jane. In her foreign accent, Jane shared her thanks for the booklet, how it had encouraged her and her husband so much. She said that the material in "The Lamb" was everything they needed, even after having been to a number of very good seminars on child rearing. "Every sentence made an impact on us in our hearts. We could understand it entirely." As she spoke, I would at times weep. She continued to say that she and her husband "would like to make an offering of service," to invest their "lives with something of eternal value," and translate it into the Chinese language. She shared how helpful it would be to the mothers of China.

Esther and Jane began corresponding, and Jane began the translation. Through their letters, I could see not only the same vision for this message, but it was evident that Jane has the same spirit and creative personality as Esther. Only God could have made this connection.

Mid July, Esther called excitedly to say that the translation into Chinese was complete. Jane has shared how God has helped to make the translation possible. Already, He is opening up possibilities to get this booklet into China. Praise His Name!

What began as a burden upon Esther's heart has become a writing that Esther has described as "having a life of its own. It has sprouted wings and has taken off." To God's glory, we have not planned any of this, other than to just take the next simple step of obedience, often nothing more than a little impulse to do something, never realizing all that God had planned for this writing. Esther read somewhere that one should find a promoter, an agent, to help with the advertisement and distribution of a book. She said that God would do just fine!

We are rejoicing in what God has done, and we are waiting to see what He will do next. Please pray with us and for us that God's will be accomplished in this work that He has begun.

Dear Friend in Christ,

The Lord's blessings be upon you this day!

Rev. Helm has requested that we share a few thoughts about his visit to the Kokomo Christian Fellowship on Sunday morning, July 27th. It was truly a blessed event for our whole church.

Rev. Helm came very needy, trusting the Lord to help us. On his way there, the Lord began to give some guidance as to the music: our Men's Ensemble was to sing #7 and #15, the congregation was to sing #244 from a hymnal he rarely sees, and Tyler Garth was to sing #4 on his list. Rev. Helm did not know what these songs were. Other than these leadings, he was trusting God to lead in the service.

The Lord began to bless even before Rev. Helm had entered the building. Errol and Sandy Monroe, from Scott Depot, arrived at the church the same time as Rev. Helm, and they had wonderful fellowship out on the sidewalk.

As the service began, Rev. Helm shared how Errol's life had been changed during the Greenville meetings. There, Rev. Helm expounded on the story of the demoniac's deliverance and how he wanted to go with Jesus. Jesus, instead, told the man to go back home and tell all the people what God had done. At that point in the meeting, the Lord told Errol to do the same, to go back home to Scott Depot and tell the people what God had done for him. For 20 years, Errol had quietly sat in church, but when he returned this time, he was on fire. He has been faithful since April to testify in meetings (and out of meetings) about Jesus. His wife, Sandy, concurred that Errol is a changed man. That sharing began our meeting, and it was a wonderful beginning.

The Lord then led for the congregation to sing #244 in our hymnal: "Come every soul by sin oppressed, there's mercy with the Lord...Only trust Him now." Instead of singing stanzas one through four, Jesus guided us in singing stanza four first, followed by three, two, and one, with Rev. Helm sharing some in-between. Before stanza one, he said that God was calling. Eight to 12 persons came to the altar and received help, but while Rev. Helm prayed and the musicians played, one remained and continued praying. She remained, and Rev. Helm called for our men to sing #7 and #15. But when we prepared to sing, he said, "Sing 15 first." As we sang these words, "O Lord, you who hear our prayer; O Lord, you who listen to our cry," the lady at the altar later testified that that was when she received deliverance. She felt like huge semi-trucks had been lifted off her.

Tyler then sang #4: "Here Comes a Miracle." One phrase from the song talks about the demoniac finding his miracle in Jesus. And here on the front row sat Errol Monroe who had received his miracle from Jesus by following the same instruction that Jesus had given to the demoniac. We were pretty happy!

Following this, Rev. Helm began to share on Isaiah 53, "*Who hath believed our report?*" He commented, "The weakness in man is not to believe." That statement to me describes what most people in the church stumble from: unbelief, an unwillingness to hear and believe the Word of God and the men of God.

"...and to whom is the arm of the Lord revealed?" God reveals his truth to babes, to those who are humble

and meek, those who look only to Jesus and are not trying to work things out, analyze, or figure it out. It is the babes, the childlike, who truly believe. God's revelations come to those who trust in Jesus. That brought us back to the beginning song: "Only trust Him."

The insights that Rev. Helm shared from these few verses was wonderfully enlightening to my soul. The whole service was a testimony of God leading through testimony, song, and message. Praise the Lord!

The following are two reports, the first from my wife, Karin, and the other from Tyler Garth who accompanied Rev. Helm to Kokomo.

I Praise the Lord for His help with Rev. Helm at the Kokomo Christian Fellowship last Sunday morning.

The Lord led Rev. Helm to a hymn on trusting. Jesus directed that we were to sing the 4th verse first, then the 3rd, 2nd, and the 1st last. Even though I was at the piano, I could sense the Holy Spirit anointing and bringing out deeper meaning in the words as the congregation sang.

We were then prepared for an altar call, and several came forward to pray. There was a lady in our congregation who had several trials at that time, who stayed to pray longer. Jesus then led for several specials. She felt the burden lift during a specific phrase of the first special. Praise the Lord!

Rev. Helm preached from Isaiah 53:1-3 on believing the report. It was very timely for our church at this time and complemented wonderfully Don's message on the last Thursday evening. I trust God will help me to believe the report and not to be deceived.

We felt privileged and honored to have Rev. Helm with us again. What God has taught him regarding the witness of the Spirit and the life of self-denial is a real treasure.

"Who has believed our report?"

The weakness of all men is to not believe. Jesus helped Sunday morning in Kokomo to present before us an unlimited view of Himself from the first few verses of Isaiah 53. The Holy Spirit led in the service in such a way that if a committee had tried to put the service together, it would have fallen far short.

We sang hymn #244, "Come every soul by sin oppressed..." The Holy Ghost also led for the men's ensemble to sing numbers 7 and 15; Tyler Garth to sing #4, "Here Comes a Miracle," and for Pastor Don Litchfield to sing, "Content in God's Will." The Lord anointed so wonderfully the first part of service, Rev. Helm declared that if Jesus didn't help him and anoint him to preach, it would be an anti-climax! But we were not disappointed. Jesus helping, we soon found that all which had preceded the sermon led up to it, undergirded it, and support it. It fit like a hand in a glove and an eye in a socket.

Under the anointing and help of the Holy Spirit, Jesus had Rev. Helm begin to expound to us the first few verses of Isaiah 53. Now, I am only 30 years old, but I have had the privilege of being raised in church with many wonderful church and study opportunities to hear the Word of God. “For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant...” (v. 2). This shows the gentleness, tenderness, and sweetness of Jesus (His compassion).

“And as a root out of dry ground...” (v. 2) told us of Jesus breaking through the crust of sin. It (sin) was packed in hard around him. He was misunderstood, no one had compassion for him and who he was (is).

“He hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him” (v. 2). People could not really see who Jesus was (is). He is hidden from us (as is his beauty and majesty). But as soon as you see him, you’ll know him!

“He is despised and rejected of men...” (v. 3). This means he still is today. 1 John 4:17 says, *“As he is, so are we in this world.”*

This is a very general, very sketchy review of God working Sunday morning, as I meant it to be brief. The Lord bless it to you. Amen.

We are including the message given at the Pigeon Forge Fellowship on Sunday morning, September 14.

It has been 46 years since God told me that I couldn't stay at Maples Motel. My wife was very sick and needed a place to rest. The motel was a beautiful place. I even pulled back the covers of the bed, felt the sheets and pressed down on the mattress. I put it all back just like it was. Always leave everything just like it was. Take better care of that which is another mans than you would your own. Turn to the sixteenth chapter of Luke. In verse ten of the sixteenth chapter we read, "He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much."

What is least? Where is least on the scale of value? What is the reach and depth of it? My daughter Martha used to say to me when she was ten years old, "Father why are you so particular about all these little things?" Are there little things? How little does something have to be to be little? Isn't it a delight to think about this scripture - "He that is faithful in that which is least . . ."

The more we know Him, the more we are aware of our 'leastness' and our utter dependability upon Him. If He can trust us with the small things, the least things, then He might trust us with the true riches. The true riches are the Kingdom of God coming on earth as it is in heaven. The true riches are righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost.

"He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much." What is much? Where does much begin and where does it end?

When we are like little children, we are happy with very little. Most children are spoiled because we give them too much.

They become frustrated. Take as an example, a child from a poor home. All he has is a ball of twine to play with. He looks it over and finds out that it is much. He examines it and decides to make a project out of it. He takes one end of the twine and wraps it around a table leg. Then he takes it over to the other side of the table and runs it over to a chair. Then he takes it over to a dresser and brings it back over to some type of a knob. This then becomes his telephone and he has a great time with this piece of twine. It seems to be nothing and very little, but yet he makes it into a marvelous find and a great treasure.

I didn't realize I was going to get into all of this. All I was going to do was read this scripture and I got lost in it. Actually I didn't get lost - I guess I found some things here - in simplicity.

The verse goes on to say, "... and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much." If I were to take a pencil from a desk and think that it would be all right for me to have it - I might infringe upon the possession of someone else. It might be all he had.

There is a story about a visitor who came to visit a rich man. Instead of going into his own flocks, the rich man went over to a poor man and took his only ewe lamb. He entertained the visitor with something which was another man's. When Nathan finished the story, David said that the man who took the lamb should die. Nathan said, "Thou art the man!" For you see, David had Uriah put in the heat of the battle and took his precious one.

Be careful with that which is small. Are we thankful for the little things, or do we want big things or more things? Are we as happy with what seems to be nothing as we are with something vast and immense? Are we glad with a little bit of nothing?

We lived with my wife's father and mother for five years. There were five of us in one room that wasn't very big. By God's grace, I was as happy there as I have been in any large room all by myself.

All that I have shared with you is very elementary. I'm sure that Jesus could show us much more.

Verse eleven says, "If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches?" If I am driving Brother Schultze's car, I should take care of it as if it were my own, or better. I should care more about his car than mine because he has trusted me with his possession.

There is so much in these little verses that I will never get to the end of them. It is only by the Holy Spirit that we have insight into them.

Verse twelve says, "And if you have not been faithful in that which is another man's, who shall give you that which is your own?" These verses are worth more than gold or anything of earthly value. They go into the depth of the heart to see what we have in there. The only way to get out of the heart what should not be there is by the work of the cross. We are all carnal and need to be cleansed from the carnal spirit.

We constantly have to die to this sin principle. If we don't die to it, then part of it will take hold of our thoughts. This path which we are to walk in is so narrow that it excludes all sin, all unrighteousness and all self-assertiveness, but it is wide enough to include all true holiness, all purity and all godly wisdom. This is where humility dwells.


God wants us to follow Him. You can't follow what you want or what you like. Jesus said, "Follow Me." Humility comes by the Holy Spirit to the heart that is utterly dependent upon the Lord. How can humility live in a heart that isn't totally dependent upon God? That is worth the whole Sunday morning service. Humility can't live in me or you unless God's love has preeminence. That really gets in my heart.

"If my people which are called by my name shall humble themselves . . ." The verse doesn't say they will humble themselves. The shall depends upon the brokenness and the obedience of the heart to leave all to do only God's will. Whenever anyone is willing to do God's

will, they will have to die from morning to night. We have to die daily, through the blood of Jesus Christ purging us by the Holy Spirit.

I am having a wonderful time and I can't believe how fast the time has gone. We have been on an adventure of learning how to help and love others.

Revival For Our Day

Dear Ones in the Lord Jesus Christ,

We are so thankful for His presence and His direction. "For as many as are led by the Holy Spirit, they are the sons of God."

We see in our waiting before the Lord that the thing that prevents us from being led by the Holy Spirit is the carnality that we are born with. In the eighth chapter of Romans and the sixth verse we read, "For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace."

We are carnal until we are sanctified. The problem is the carnal mind. To be carnally minded is to be against God. Verse seven tells us that the carnal mind is enmity against God. People that are in the flesh cannot face God. The only way to be led by the Holy Spirit is to submit ourselves to God. We must die daily to this carnal nature. Carnality is cleansed out of us by the work of the Holy Spirit when Jesus sanctifies us.

I believe that the secret is to be cleansed of the carnal nature. All mortals are carnal until we are sanctified through the truth of God in Christ Jesus. I believe a requisite of becoming sanctified is to humble ourselves. Humbling ourselves is to confess our faults, our weaknesses and our criticizing.

The spiritual mind submits to the will of God by denying self and making all things right. We are sanctified by the truth. It is the disposition of the carnal mind to accomplish things, to know things and to understand things, but that is not in the teachings of Jesus. The carnal emphasis is to know, to have knowledge, to make arrangements, and to do things. This all seems good. The carnal

mind is constantly wanting to have dominance. The only way to be cleansed from this carnal nature is by the grace and truth of God as He brings us into the entire sanctification experience.

If we are willing to submit ourselves and be truly sanctified and cleansed from this carnal nature, then God can do something to help us. Jesus said that if we want to follow after Him, we must deny ourselves and take up the cross of Jesus daily. If we don't deny self continually, we will not assume the cross and be slain. Once the carnal nature is crucified and cleansed out of us, it will try to re-enter us. That is why we must deny and die to self every moment of every day.

I have been preaching about the urgency of sanctification for many years. The tendency of the flesh is to want miracles and gifts. Jesus didn't teach us to seek after these things, but rather to seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness.

The carnally minded person thinks he knows all the answers, but the spiritually minded person doesn't claim to know anything. It takes the Holy Spirit to reveal this, because carnality doesn't want it to be known. The revelation of God is not revealed to the carnal mind. God's revelation comes to the child-like, sanctified heart that has given everything over to dying daily.

Thousands and thousands of people have pursued to become sanctified and yet they find themselves critical. It is because they do not die and deny self constantly to be led by God. This comes only by revelation. Even when you read this, it will require the

Holy Spirit, because the carnality in us does not want to accept it. The revelation will come through the sanctified heart that loves as Jesus loves. The sanctified heart is the heart that is submissive, praying, dying daily and following Jesus.

We do not attain this by anything we can do. It is only by the grace and mercies of God that this can be.



Dear Ones of the Lord Jesus Christ,

We want to thank all the members of our staff for their devotion and work. It is such a gift to all of us. We give God praise, glory, and thanks for those who are praying on behalf of our physical and financial needs.

We want to thank Harmony Press for the printing and mailing of the monthly newsletters. Their help has been invaluable.

We want to include a message that the Lord helped me share with the dear ones at Parker City Christ Fellowship a few weeks ago.

You'll find the scripture in the fourth chapter of St. John. We read that "Jesus must needs go through Samaria." What other scripture of the synoptic writings ever said such a thing? Why did Jesus need to go through Samaria? The Jews had nothing to do with the Samaritans. There were no dealings or understanding between them. We read that Jesus had to go through Samaria. That is a region from Jerusalem to Galilee. John and Jane (Langdon) and Richard and Mary (Moore) were with me there on the second day of January in 1970. We were privileged to be at the very place where Jesus was in this scripture.

Why did Jesus need to go there? The Jews weren't interested in it, but God was. It was the Good Samaritan that didn't pass by on the other side. The Levite and the priest did, but the Samaritan didn't. What is in the Samaritans? What is in your heart and mine that God sees?

Jesus had sent the apostles to a village to get some provisions. While He was waiting for their return, the scripture tells us that He was tired and sat down at a well. In just a little while a woman came to get some water from the well.

Jesus knew everyone and knew what was in them. When this woman came, He knew her, but He didn't scold her. I want you to notice that the woman didn't come

until Jesus was at rest. Jesus had everything this woman needed and she didn't realize it.

She was drawing water from the well that Jacob and Joseph drank from hundreds of years before. Jesus was resting and she was drawing. What was the difference? What was the connection?

As she drew the water, Jesus asked the woman to give Him a drink out of her cup. The great Son of God asked this lowly woman, this adulteress, for a drink from her cup. What kind of faith was that? What kind of love was that?

How startled do you think she was? Here was a Jew that was so kind to her and would ask her for a drink of water. What do we have in our cup that Jesus would want to drink? Have you ever thought of that? You have a cup too. Has he asked you for a little bit of what you have? Are other people waiting to drink from what you have?

This weary stranger was talking to this unknown person of the community, but He didn't pass her by. He was thirsty for what she had. Are you gentle and kind with people? Do you get after people because they fail or don't perform as you think they should? Do you have kindness in your cup or do you have criticism?

There she was with her water and Jesus spoke to her, "If you knew who it was that speaks to you, you would have asked of him, and he would have given you living water." The woman was now more puzzled than before. She replied that this man didn't have any water with Him. How could He give her water to quench her thirst so she would never be thirsty again?

He had the water of everlasting life and she wanted it. Jesus then told her to go call her husband. The way to the water was for her to call her husband. What does Jesus tell us to do?

The woman replied that she had no husband. Jesus told her that she is right, for she had five husbands. I don't know how long they talked, but He told her everything she had done in her life. How

astonished do you think she was? She didn't understand why He would take time to speak with her, a Samaritan. She was amazed that He would tell her that He had something that would satisfy everything she needed. Then He told her everything she had ever done.

Here was an adulteress and Jesus was treating her as if she were the finest person in the community. That is just like Jesus, isn't it? She was so astonished. In verses 25 and 26 we read, "The woman saith unto him, I know that when Messiah is come, he will tell us all things. Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am he."

This is something worth noting. He told nearly everyone He met, "Don't tell anybody who I am." Yet, He told this adulteress who He was and she believed Him! She was so excited that she went back to the city and told all the people, "I've met a man who told me everything I had ever done. He must be the Christ!" Surely the water was springing up inside her by this time! She wanted everyone to come and see Him. This should give us something to rejoice about. She brought them all out to meet Jesus.

When you know Jesus, you want everyone else to get in on it. When I was saved, I wanted everyone in the world to have what I had and I tried to get them to get it.

Jesus stayed with these people for two days. They had such a great revival. When Jesus is with us there is great revival and joy. Can we bring this same joy and glad tidings to other people?

Before I close, I wanted to share some scriptures with you as we approach this Christmas time.

Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. Isaiah 7:14


