Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I write this, I am in Chicago attending the Covenant pastors' Midwinter Conference. It is a great time to see old friends and classmates and also to meet new friends and colleagues. It is a time of being refreshed, encouraged and challenged in our faith by insightful speakers and uplifting worship. It is also a good time to be reminded of the larger ministry of the Church. There are discussions about how to build more congregational engagement in missions, a celebration of 80 years of ministry by Covenant World Relief, and even stories of ministry outside the Covenant.

One such story was about a Vacation Bible School in Malawi, Africa. The Bible school was held at an Anglican church, staffed by Baptists and Pentecostals and organized by Presbyterians. What was amazing is that 80 of the kids were Muslim. The local tribal chieftains, who are Muslim, had sent the kids because they wanted their kids to learn to be more caring for others like the Christians were.

This story shines a light on some important truths. First, it is a reminder of the global mission of the Church. As Jesus told the disciples in Matthew 28, we are to "go and make disciples of all nations." Second, it shows that our theological differences do not need to prevent us from serving together. Our ministries are more effective when we work together. Finally, when people see God's love lived out in the Church they are drawn to it. As Jesus said in John 13:35, "...everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

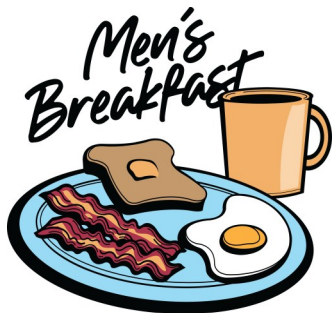


