



CAMPER GUIDELINES

GENERAL DRESS GUIDELINES

- Shorts should come no higher than the middle of the thigh.
- Skirts/dresses should come at least to the top of the knee while standing.
- Anything skintight does not count as covered but may be worn as a base layer. Styles designed for the waterfront, athletic events/exercise, or bedtime should be worn at the appropriate time.
- Tank tops, clothing with shoulder straps, tight shirts or shorts, low necklines in front or back, and styles leaving the midriff bare or exposing undergarments should not be worn.
- Evening chapel is an opportunity to clean up and dress up. Long pants, dresses/skirts, collared shirts, and nicer tops would be acceptable.
- At the lake, guys should wear trunk-type suits, and girls should wear one-piece suits. (Two-piece swimsuits showing any midriff must be covered with a colored shirt.) If the top of a girl's swimsuit is not lined or has a low neckline in front or back, a colored shirt must be worn over it. (Campers should be covered while traveling to and from the lakefront.)
- PBC reserves the right to ask any camper to change his/her clothing if, in the estimation of the staff, the clothing is inappropriate (for the occasion or otherwise).

GENERAL CONDUCT GUIDELINES

- Physical contact between unmarried couples is not allowed.
- An open lifestyle of moral sin is not permitted.
- Tobacco, vaping, alcohol, or illegal drugs are not permitted on the grounds.
- Electronic devices, including phones, are not allowed for youth campers.
- Repeated complaints, insubordination, or behavior that poses physical or spiritual harm shall be reason for dismissal or denial of registration.
