## Easter Maps with Intentional Empty Spaces

Look, I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but we will all be changed... (1 Corinthians 15:51).

For the first time in the 15th and 16th centuries, **mapmakers began to draw maps with intentional empty spaces. It was the first admission that they did not know what was out there**, prompted by what they were learning through expeditions of discovery about what really was out there. **Prior to this time, maps simply left unfamiliar areas out or filled them with imaginary monsters** (Quietly Courageous: Leading the Church in a Changing World, 29).

This method of demarcating spaces by incorporating monsters also characterizes maps and accounts of distant places from the ancient world to the Enlightenment era. Old maps frequently depict hideous monsters in the unexplored regions of the known world

(<https://historycollection.com/where-the-wild-things-werent-a-dozen-map-monsters-from-history/>).

Ancient mapmakers "may have been motivated by what art historians call **horror vacui, the artist's fear of leaving unadorned spaces on their work**. Chet Van Duzer, a historian of cartography, has found dozens of maps on which cartographers appear to have filled the empty spaces on their maps with non-existent mountains, monsters, cities, and other gratuitous illustrations" (<https://www.nationalgeographic.com/history/article/maps-history-horror-vacui-art-cartography-blank-spaces>).

The desire to fill or remove empty spaces on our maps, in our world, and within our souls reflects our anxiety and uneasiness at not knowing everything. It also reflects our determination to solve the mysteries of our existence. We want to move from mystery to mastery of our lives. Here is how the writer of Ecclesiastes names this condition:

God has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end (Ecclesiastes 3:11).

We live with multiple unsolved mysteries in our Christian faith:

- Trinity ("God in three Persons, blessed Trinity!"; Father/Son/Holy Ghost)
- Sacraments (baptism and communion; sacraments are even called Mysteries in the Eastern Church)
- Resurrection

**Holy Week and Easter bring us face to face with the mysterious depths of sin, death, grace, and love.** The drama of Holy Week reveals the betrayal and violence against Jesus for revealing God's loving presence and judgment to the world. Resurrection then is the ultimate mystery we live with and learn from. It resists final explanations which for me is a sign of hope. We cannot account for everything in the world through our human understanding alone. God joins us in this existence through Jesus Christ who has died, is risen, and will come again. May the mystery of Holy Week and Easter bring you closer to God and bring us closer to each other as we travel together using the maps of resurrection and hope and love through Jesus Christ.

## Hello, Church Family!

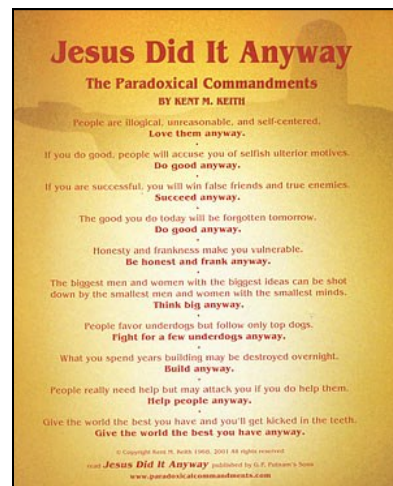
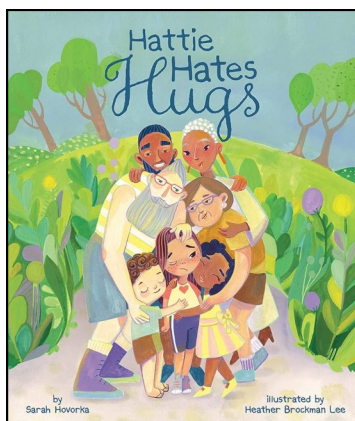
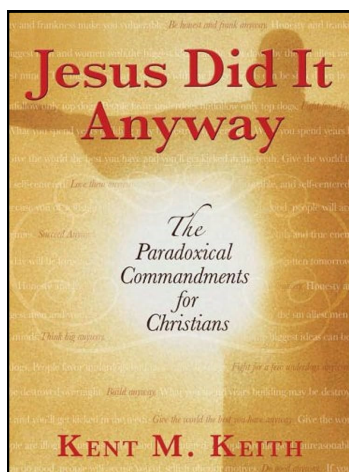

# Leadership Board Recordings

Nov. 27, 2023

Members present: Sally Armstrong, Pete Blinkilde, Julie Brown, Linda Custer, Eric Januzelli, Kirk Perry, John Raven, Pastor Jeff Williams, and Tammy Youmans  
Guests: Linda Leroux, Frank McLachlan, Mike Pfaff

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. by Chair Linda Custer. Julie Brown provided an opening prayer.

1. City Church departure

- a. City Church's last service will be Dec. 17. CC members will remove equipment and furniture between Dec. 17 and Dec. 31.
- b. Linda Custer met with Pastor Tim and clarified the ownership of several items: the HH1 and HH2 microphones and the three floor boxes in the state will remain at FUMC.
- c. Mike Pfaff videotaped a walk-through with CC, documenting all items CC would be removing. He produced a technology map, showing generally what equipment FUMC will need and the associated costs. He and Pastor Jeff will research the specifics and provide the list to the office.
- d. One of the two lost coffee pots for the kitchen was found.
- e. CC has received several physical keys. Although the keys will open an entry door a current key code must still be used to not set off the building alarm. Key codes will be changed when CC departs.
- f. Technology fundraising
- g. The needed equipment will cost about \$25,000. Since CC will depart Dec. 17 funds are needed quickly. Several Leadership members indicated that church members expressed an interest in contributing to the upgrade. It was understood that most of the funds should be raised before ordering equipment. Eric motioned and Sally seconded that members who contribute at least \$250 will have plaques with their names placed on the technology booth in the back of the church. Motion passed unanimously.
- h. Sally motioned and Kirk seconded that the Christmas Eve offering be designated for the technology upgrade. Motion passed unanimously.
- i. Pete motioned and Kirk seconded to approve the Oct. 23 Recordings. Motion passed unanimously.
- j. Kirk motioned and Sally seconded that, beginning Jan. 7, 2024, the FUMC worship time change from 9:15 a.m. to 10 a.m. The later start time will allow choir and tech team members - who must be at church about one hour before service - to arrive later. The new time will also allow time for a Bible study prior to service. Motion passed unanimously.
- k. A letter will be sent to the congregation on Nov. 28 describing the tech upgrade and change in worship time.
- l. Decorating for Advent and Christmas was discussed. Sally will talk to the United Women in Faith and Pete will speak to the Tuesday Men's Group about finding and installing decorations.
- m. The parsonage carpets will be cleaned Dec. 1. Pastor Jeff will take the remainder of his 2023 vacation Dec. 6-15 and Dec. 26-30.

The Board's next meeting will be Jan. 22, 2024 at 7 p.m.

Pastor Jeff provided a closing prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 8:04 p.m.

# Leadership Board Recordings

Jan. 4, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. by Linda Custer and Julie Brown provided an Opening Prayer.

1. Faithful AVL technology invoices

- a. On Dec. 20, 2023, the owner of Faithful AVL provided Pastor Jeff an oral estimate of \$7,000 for technology installation. The actual bill was \$11,761.
- b. On Jan. 3, 2024, Linda emailed the owner to discuss the extra cost, specifically the Emergency/Holiday rate of \$225/hour. The owner called back and spoke to Pastor Jeff. The owner indicated the high rate was due to the compressed time schedule, which included Christmas Eve. Also, the labor rate would have been lower if the church had purchased the equipment from Faithful instead of from Sweetwater.
- c. Billing analysis showed that Faithful AVL had to provide services beyond installation. After a part was returned to Sweetwater, Faithful provided a substitute (\$1,599), plus additional cables (\$1,297) and an extra lift rental (\$440), making the installation-only cost \$8,425.
- d. Sally motioned to approve the Faithful invoices. John seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board's next meeting will be Jan. 22 at 7 p.m.

Pastor Jeff provided a closing prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 7:41 p.m.

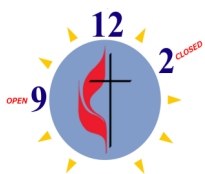
