Together with Christ at the Right Time

Pete Blinklidle shared a brief review of recent pastors in his October 8 sermon. He spoke about having the right pastor at the right time for the needs of the Church. It was a review he did genuinely and with integrity.

I responded on the pastor side of things that being a pastor does not make sense apart from a congregation. MY being a pastor does not make sense apart from Beverly, my wife. Her love and grace and ministry are amazing. Our compatible vocations (medical social worker and pastor) are also a blessing.

As a congregation you shape what kind of pastors we are as we cooperatively figure out what works best in this time and place. Together we discover what gifts we bring and what gifts are needed. Which means in one sense you also are the right congregation at the right time for me.

As we enter November with All Saints' Day I see Pete's phrase in an expanded way to understand that **saints are the right people at the right time for God's purposes**. It is a wonderful time to remember and give thanks like we do in this worship prayer:

*Everlasting God, this day revives in us memories of loved ones who are no more. What happiness we shared when they walked among us. **What joy when loving and being loved, we lived our lives together.***

And isn't this a helpful and inspiring way to think about the birth of Jesus? Right person at the right time for God's purposes for the world that God loves?

But **when the fullness of time had come**, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children (Galatians 4:4-5).

With Christ God makes the time right all the time. Sometimes we show up for each other with gifts of mercy or compassion to listen to grief and pain. Sometimes we show up for each other with gifts of joy and peace to rejoice in healing or restoration or forgiveness. By faith we understand that what God does with us right here in Greenville is what God does all over the world. And we have the encouragement of the writer of Colossians to act accordingly:

Conduct yourselves wisely toward outsiders, **making the most of the time**. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt so that you may know how you ought to answer everyone (Colossians 4:5-6).

May God bless us to be the right people at the right time with Christ during this All Saints - Thanksgiving - Advent - Christmas season. Praise God from whom all time and blessings flow.

She has recently completed training in Spiritual Direction and will share that approach to spiritual life with us. Here is her introduction:

I'm excited to join the Thursday Morning Adult Bible Study class for two sessions in November. On November 16, we will explore an experience of the ancient Christian practice of Lectio Divina, which is a way of approaching scripture with hearts and ears ready to listen to what God is saying to us through God's word. On November 30, we will expand our theme of Holy Listening to practice listening to how God speaks through our hearts, through each other, and through the natural world. Both sessions will be experiential and conversational.

November 26th

United Methodist Student Day was the original Special Sunday created by United Methodist Church Sunday Schools who collected offerings to help advance education for their children. The fund was originally established in 1872 as the Children's Fund. Today United Methodist Student Day Sunday has the same purpose, calling upon the denomination to support their students as they prepare for life by adding knowledge to their faith. The funds received from the offering go into the United Methodist Student Loan Fund to underwrite scholarships for United Methodist students. Currently, there are over 70 scholarships available for United Methodist students.




He Gets Us/Lucado



Lucado looks at how Jesus lived while he was here on earth. Did he have fun? Was he ever lonely or stressed?



Leadership Board Recordings

Leadership Board Recordings
Aug. 28, 2023

Members present: Wendy Bates, Julie Brown, Linda Custer, Cindy Hill, Chuck Hill, Eric Januzelli, Jeff Loding, John Raven, Pastor Jeff Williams, and Tammy Youmans

Members absent: Steve Homich and Chris Nelson

Guests: Sally Armstrong, Cheryl Bailey, Bob Brundage, Elaine Baxter, Virginia Curtis, Central Bay District Superintendent John Kasper, Frank McLachlan, and Kirk Perry

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. by Chuck Hill and Chuck provided an Opening Prayer.

Check in with City Church: No representative was present. John Raven, Pastor Jeff, Eric Januzelli and Linda Custer will meet with City Church representatives on Sept. 7 to discuss the 2024 lease arrangement.

2. The Recordings of July 24 were approved. Linda Custer motioned and Cindy Hill seconded.
3. Disaffiliation: At the Aug. 27 vote, 38 of the 94 members present (40.4 percent) voted to disaffiliate. Since the vote did not meet the 60 percent threshold, FUMC will remain in the United Methodist Church. As a result of the vote, the following members resigned from the Board and withdrew their membership: Wendy Bates, Steve Homich, Cindy Hill, Chuck Hill, Jeff Loding and Chris Nelson. Organist Jim Wise and staff member Art Byington (effective 8/31/23) also resigned. Chuck Hill said he would remain Leadership Chairman until Sept. 25 or until a new chairman is named, whichever comes sooner.

Financial update: Eric Januzelli said it will be difficult for FUMC to continue if giving falls 40 percent. It will be important to note year-over-year giving figures at upcoming Leadership Board meetings. Prior to the disaffiliation vote, the number of households contributing at least \$500/year was 72, representing 105 individuals. FUMC had been the beneficiary of a donor-advised fund (valued at \$403,553 as of July 31) housed at the Greenville Area Community Foundation. Jeff Loding - the fund's donor - said the church will be removed as beneficiary of the fund.

5. Membership classes begin Sept. 10 and Sept. 12 and will run three weeks ending Oct. 1, World Communion Sunday

Pastor Jeff schedule: Sermon Planning Retreat Sept. 12-14. Leading with Depth clergy coaching cohort from Sept. 21, 2023, to May 16, 2024. Renewal Retreat Oct. 6-15.

Pete Blinkilde preaching Oct. 8, Pastor Craig preaching Oct. 15.

The Board's next meeting will be Sept. 25 at 7 p.m.

John Kasper provided a closing prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 7:53 p.m.
