INVITATION TO LENTEN DISCIPLINE

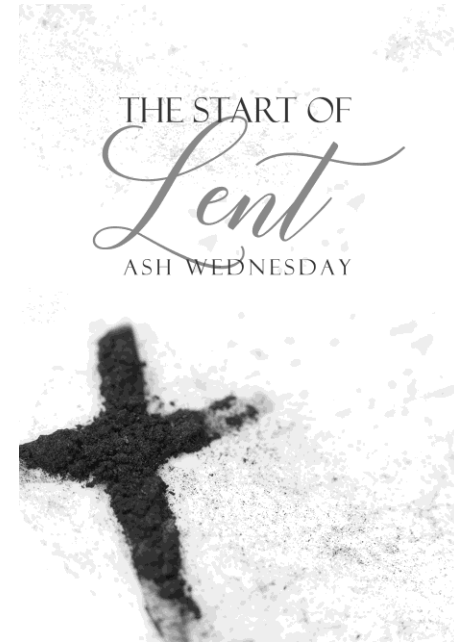
