CONTEXT OF JEREMIAH 17 and 29

The context of Jeremiah 17:5-8 is a sharp prophetic warning to the Kingdom of Judah during a period of national crisis and impending exile. During this difficult time, Judah was tempted to rely on political alliances and military strength to save themselves from the Babylonian Empire, rather than trusting in God.

CONTEXT OF JEREMIAH 17 and 29

Judah has a choice:
Trust in the FLESH or Trust in the LORD.


23 "...Obey me, and I will be your God and you will be my people. Do everything as I say, and all will be well with you."



3. **REFRESH** yourself daily in the river of living water that is Jesus Christ himself

JEREMIAH 17 (ESV)

⁷ “Blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD,
whose trust is the LORD.

⁸ He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out
its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for
its leaves remain green, and is not anxious
in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit.”

21 “God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.






2 CORINTHIANS 3 (ESV)
