

What is a miracle?

A normal dictionary would tell us that a miracle is “an effect or extraordinary event in the physical world that surpasses all known human or natural powers and is ascribed to a supernatural cause.”

However, the dictionary at my house defines it quite differently, and my children are “miracle” workers.

For example, a few years back, I noticed that there was a significant dent on the rear fender of my wife’s car. So, I “interrogated” my children who had been told clearly not to ride their scooters in the garage. Of course, they all denied that they had anything to do with the dent. So, the only logical explanation for the mysterious dent is – it’s a miracle!

Recently, one of the thank-you cards on our dining table was missing. My wife and I searched the entire kitchen area but couldn’t locate it. All kids claimed that they had never seen it. However, the next morning, the missing card inexplicably appeared on my placemat. Again, all my children denied knowing what had happened. Unless my dogs had played a trick on us, the only logical explanation is – it’s a miracle!

That’s right, miracles happen at our home all the time – toys left in the middle of the backyard, but no one would admit that they have taken them out, a big water puddle on the kitchen floor but no one had spelled anything, flashlight switch was broken, the refrigerator door handle was sticky, scissors were missing from the drawer, and the list goes on and on. Strange, isn’t it! Who says “miracles” are few and far between?! At my house they happen all the time!

For some reason, my children think that if no one admits what has happened, or mom and dad cannot figure out who was guilty, then they are not responsible for their faults at all.

Miracles Happen

Isn’t that similar to how Adam responded when God confronted him about what he had done? Instead of admitting that he was wrong, he blamed others, “The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate.”

My cousin once told me, “Kenny, you need to outsmart your children!” A very good piece of advice, but it is easier said than done, isn’t it! Now I’ve learned that when a “miracle” happens at my house, I would

gather all of my children and let them tell me who is responsible for it. If no one would admit, they just have to stand where the “miracle” is until someone finally confesses it. So far, this strategy has been working.

However, when God confronted Adam and Eve, He didn’t have to guess and use any strategy. Our God is an omniscient God. He knows the thoughts of man. (Psalm 94:11). When God said, “Where are you and who told you that you were naked,” God wasn’t interrogating Adam and trying to find out what had really happened but simply giving him the chance to admit his sin. Sin doesn’t go away because we deny what had happened. They have to be dealt with. The wages of sin is death. (Romans 4:23)

Here is the real miracle: that even after the Fall of Adam and Eve, even after you and I have disobeyed God over and over again, God still loves us. He even sent His Son Jesus to us, who humbled himself, took our human form, and was born in a manger. He loved us so much that He took our sin on Himself and died for us on the cross. Because of what Jesus Christ has done, those who believe in Him have eternal life and become children of God.

God, thank You for this true miracle for us. Amen.

- Finally, I got a job at a bakery; I kneaded dough!









Siouxland Hispanic Ministry

During the first week of August, I had the opportunity to attend the National Hispanic Convention in Orlando, Florida. This was my first since the convention takes place every three years. It was wonderful to be in the company of nearly 300 Spanish-speaking LCMS Lutherans scattered all throughout the United States. The convention theme was **"Todos Somos**

Uno En Jesucristo" ("We Are All One In Jesus Christ") following Galatians 3 where Paul makes it clear that:

- All who have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ (3:27). We are therefore...

- God's sons and daughters, through faith in Christ (3:26). Because of that...
- Before God, there is now no Jew, Gentile, slave, free, male or female, "for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (3:28). And...
- If we are Christ's, we are all the true offspring of Abraham heirs according to the promise (3:29). Talk about four verses that are jam-packed with amazing theology, huh?!

In this passage, Paul is teaching Christianity's central (and unique!) doctrine of justification: We are all equally sinners and we are all equally saved by grace through faith in Christ. This gives every believer equal access to God and equal status before God—quite a countercultural message in a world that perpetually strives for division, hierarchy,

and more "rights" than the next person! As children of God, we are truly equal in this sense. Todos Somos Uno En Jesucristo.

Sadly, in a sinful world, even the most beautiful of Gospel realities can be twisted and abused. Many would use this same passage from Galatians to argue that all distinctions between people have been abolished—this is not true! Anglos and

Hispanics continue being different; men and women continue being different; your gifts and my gifts continue being different. Rather than erasing or ignoring these differences, we give thanks to God for them! After all, how could the body of Christ function if every member were only a hand or a foot (1 Corinthians 12)? Variety is the spice of life as they say, and a world without it would certainly be bland! Far from tasteless monotony and uniformity, John's vision even of heaven itself reveals A great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before


the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb! (Revelation 7).

There are plenty of distinctions between us—which we celebrate!—and yet, we are all clothed in the same white robes cleansed by the blood of the Lamb. That is where true unity is found—in Jesus and His Word! That is what makes every believer from different tribes and languages cry out together: **"Todos Somos Uno En Jesucristo."**

After ten years of hard work, the new Lutheran Hymnal (Himnario Luterano) is finally available! Each convention

participant received a hymnal as a gift from the Lutheran Heritage Foundation. I have already requested a shipment of 15 to be used here in South Sioux City. I look forward to teaching our members how to use their own hymnal devotionally at home and during the Divine Service on Sundays. We thank God for all those who participated in the production of this wonderful resource.

Our next quarterly Siouxland Hispanic Ministry meeting will be **Tuesday, Sept. 6** at 6:30 pm. Add it to your calendar and come join us at Hope Lutheran in South Sioux City. - *Pastor Paul Flo*

Dear supporters and friends, July was rather quiet and after the bustle surrounding my trip to India it was nice to enjoy some time off from travel and to begin prepping for fall. But here it is... August...and our fall semester is rapidly approaching! We will begin our second official year of the English Studies program at the Rīga Luther Academy later this month.

Our initial cohort of students will be continuing their studies while a second cohort of students will begin theirs.

In Rīga, Rev. Dr. Cory Rajek and Rev. Jerry Lawson will be joined soon by Rev. Dr. Quintin Cundiff and his family as they deploy this month.

As for me, I will be teaching from the "Sheboygan Branch

Office" as I did last year and will also be continuing service as chaplain of our on-line Monday vespers. Right now, I am working on TH200- Introduction to Scripture for our new students, most of whom are from Pakistan. We look forward to orientation and the initial seminars in a couple of weeks.

Something else in the works is an invitation to serve the Asia Region just after New Year's 2023 as their retreat chaplain. Most of our international regions

hold an annual retreat for their missionaries, their families, and the regional leaders to gather for spiritual renewal, fellowship, and regional business. But like so many other annual events, COVID prevented most regions from holding a retreat for the last two

years. The Asia Region will be gathering in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. I am honored to be asked to lead the retreat in worship, to present the Scripture topic (Job), and to offer confession and absolution.

I have had the opportunity to be in the Asia region before, having taught short courses in the Philippines, Hong Kong, and Bangladesh. But,

growing up in the 1960s and 70s, I would never have thought I would be visiting Cambodia! I am very excited about meeting our LCMS Asia mission workers and learning about their diverse ministry.

God-willing, all these plans will go forward and be blessed by Him for the sake of forming pastors via Rīga and nurturing our Asia workers in their service of the Gospel at the retreat. Thank you for your role in making it possible for me to serve in these ways. - Charles Cortright


