


Called to *Live* and to *Love* as the Body of Christ.



ADVENT | CHRISTMAS | EPIPHANY | LENT | EASTER | PENTECOST

THE SEASON: The season between Pentecost Sunday and Advent, and between the Day of Epiphany and Lent, is known as Ordinary Time. This term comes from the word "ordinal," which means "counted" or "ordered" and is a period where we, as a church and individuals, settle into the rhythms of discipleship - worship and witness, service of neighbor and care for self, fruitful labor and refreshing rest.

THE COLOR: The color for this season is traditionally green, symbolizing growth. Even as the early church grew in their depth of devotion and breadth of outreach after the Spirit's outpouring at Pentecost, the Church today presses toward greater spiritual maturity through her worship and mission during this period. Ordinary Time is anything but mundane or static for a Christian - it is a season of personal renewal and missional movement, a time of growth in prayer and in service, in learning and in teaching.

Celebrant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,

in the breaking of bread and in the prayers?

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin,

repent and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you proclaim in word and deed the Good News of God in

Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as

yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect

the dignity of every human being, rich and poor, sick and well, born

and unborn, Christian and non-Christian?

People: I will, with God's help.

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATES

Celebrant: Let us now give thanks to God and pray for those who are to

receive the Sacrament of Baptism. Almighty and everlasting God, we give you thanks, for in your great mercy you did save Noah and his family in the Ark from perishing by water; and also did safely lead the children of Israel, your people, through the Red Sea; signifying thereby your holy Baptism, and by the Baptism of your well-beloved Son Jesus Christ, did sanctify the River Jordan, and all other waters, to the mysterious washing away of sin; In your infinite love, we pray that you will look mercifully upon these, your covenant children.

People: Sanctify them and wash them with your Holy Spirit.

Celebrant: We pray that they, being delivered from your wrath, may be received

into the Ark of Christ's Church, and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in charity, may so pass through the waves of this troublesome world, that finally they may come to the land of everlasting life, there to reign with You, world without end, through

Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Celebrant: I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the

Holy Spirit. Child of the covenant, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit

in baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. Amen.

PRAYER FOR COVENANTAL BLESSING

Celebrant: Merciful God, in baptism you call us each by name, promising your

covenant love. Watch over your servants, Tory, Jake, and Carlisle. Deepen their understanding of the gospel; sustain them in your Holy Spirit; keep them in the faith and communion of the Church. Teach them to love others for Christ's sake, send them into the world as your witnesses, and bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory;

through Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.

RECEPTION OF NEWLY BAPTIZED

Celebrant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People: We receive you into the household of God. May you confess the faith of Christ

crucified, proclaim His resurrection, and share with us in His eternal priesthood!

OLD TESTAMENT READING

JEREMIAH 31:31-34

"Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah... I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people. 34 And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

EPISTLE READING

I JOHN 2:15-27

Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16 For all that is in the world—the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life—is not from the Father but is from the world. 17 And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever.

18 Children, it is the last hour, and as you have heard that antichrist is coming, so now many antichrists have come. Therefore we know that it is the last hour. 19 They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would have continued with us. But they went out, that it might become plain that they all are not of us. 20 But you have been anointed by the Holy One, and you all have knowledge. 21 I write to you, not because you do not know the truth, but because you know it, and because no lie is of the truth. 22 Who is the liar but he who denies that Jesus is the Christ? This is the antichrist, he who denies the Father and the Son. 23 No one who denies the Son has the Father. Whoever confesses the Son has the Father also. 24 Let what you heard from the beginning abide in you. If what you heard from the beginning abides in you, then you too will abide in the Son and in the Father. 25 And this is the promise that he made to us—eternal life.

26 I write these things to you about those who are trying to deceive you. 27 But the anointing that you received from him abides in you, and you have no need that anyone should teach you. But as his anointing teaches you about everything, and is true, and is no lie—just as it has taught you, abide in him.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Celebrant: We praise you, O Lord that you, rich in mercy, and infinite in goodness, made us in your own image, freed us from everlasting death, and provided our redemption in your only and well-beloved Son, whom out of love you gave to be made man, like us in all things but sin, to receive the punishment of our transgression in his body, to satisfy your justice by his death, and through his resurrection to destroy him who was the author of death; and so to bring again to the world the life from which the whole offspring of Adam was exiled.

And so, at the commandment of Jesus Christ our Lord, we present ourselves at this, His table.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

People:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Celebrant: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these

your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit, make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the

world.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is

yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

People: Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come,

Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

Celebrant: Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us;

People: Therefore, let us keep the feast.

Celebrant: The peace of Christ be with you.

People: And also with you.

INVITATION

Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance

that Christ died for you, and feed on him by faith, with thanksgiving.

1. WAIT FOR AN USHER

An usher will release each row. If you're not sure where to go, your usher will direct you.

Grape juice is located in the cups of the center ring of each wine/juice tray.

4. CHILDREN

Children who have been interviewed at All Saints or by the ruling body of another church are welcome to partake of communion. Younger children may also come forward with parents to receive a blessing.






5. MOBILITY IMPAIRED
