NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:

Passports, visa/ETA, vaccinations (if required), laundry, lunches not on the tour menu (food outside of the contracted menu will be billed prior to leaving the hotel or restaurant), excursions not listed, telephone/international data, mini-bar, alcohol, other beverages, airport transfers on non-qualifying flights, portage at airports, excess baggage fees, additional airline fees after registration, travel insurance, and all other items not explicitly mentioned.

PAYMENTS & FEES:

A non-refundable deposit of **\$500** per person is due upon registration, with a second deposit of **\$500** per person required within 21 days thereafter. Credit cards are only accepted for the initial **\$500** deposit; subsequent payments must be in check, ACH transfer, bill payment, or wire transfer; all payments are required in US Funds.

Final payment is due no later than July 3rd, 2026.

Registrations after 120 days require full payment and may incur a \$300 late fee if received 119-90 days before departure. **Failure to make final payment by 90 days prior to departure results in automatic cancellation, forfeiture of the \$500 deposit, and potential additional fees.**

imagine Tours and Travel, LLC (hereafter referred to as *imagine*) reserves the right to impose a surcharge if the dollar declines by more than 2% against the destination currency based on booking date (12/01/25).

GROUP SIZE & SUPPLEMENTS:

Tour pricing assumes a **minimum group size of 20 passengers**.

Smaller groups may incur supplements:

- \$150 per person (19-16 travelers)
- \$195 per person (15-14 travelers)
- \$295 per person (13-12 travelers)

Tours with fewer than 12 travelers may be canceled due to insufficient participation.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy (two people sharing a room). Single rooms may be smaller than double rooms and, when available, incur **an additional supplemental charge of \$1,079 for the basic itinerary**. Roommates are assigned if available; otherwise, single-room occupancy may apply. Roommates may be assigned as late as 120 days prior to departure when applicable.

ITINERARY & CHANGES:

imagine reserves the right to adjust itineraries due to airline schedule changes. Changes requiring extra nights incur \$195 per person per night (\$295 for single rooms). You will be notified in writing of said changes when possible. Meals for additional overnights are not included. Changes and/or deviations from the program and/or departure city listed by the passenger must be provided in writing no later than 120 days prior to departure.

All deviations are subject to a \$250 administrative fee plus applicable airline fees. All tours are made final at 90 days prior to departure.

No changes (including additions) may be made after this time.

LAND ONLY:

Land Only price is \$3,860 per person, excluding international flights.

Land Only passengers may be responsible for transfers and/or additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights. Passengers changing from the regular tour (with group airfare) to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$195 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS & SEATING:

The ITINERARY

Day 1 – Saturday, October 31: Depart U.S.A.

Tour members meet for our flight to Israel. After dinner is served, it's time to sit back, relax, and enjoy the on-board entertainment to prepare for this exciting adventure of a lifetime.

Day 2 – Sunday, November 1: Arrive in Tel Aviv

In Tel Aviv, we proceed through customs and security and meet our agent who assists us to our motor coach. We have a short drive to our hotel in the Tel Aviv area in time for dinner and overnight.

Day 3 – Monday, November 2: Caesarea, Megiddo, Mt. Carmel, Nazareth Village, Cana, Galilee

This morning, we depart for the Galilee to visit Biblical sites at Caesarea Maritima, where Peter proclaimed the Good News to the Roman Centurion (Acts 10). We also see Megiddo and Mt. Carmel, where Elijah confronted the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). Time permitting, we will stop at the Druze Village for a short lunch break (not included). Then we continue to Nazareth (Jesus' childhood home) and tour the Nazareth Village, a replica of what Nazareth would have looked like at the time of Jesus. Afterwards, we venture to Cana, the location of Jesus' first miracle (Jn 2:1-11) and the Mt. of Precipice (Lk 4:16-30), overlooking the Jezreel Valley (Jdg 4-5) and Mt. Tabor (Josh 19:22; Jdg 4:6-16; 8:18-21; Mt 17, etc). We then arrive in Tiberias for dinner and overnight near the Sea of Galilee.

Day 4 – Tuesday, November 3: Galilee, Mt. of Beatitudes, Capernaum, Boat Ride, Bethsaida, Jordan River

Nothing compares to watching the sun rise over the Sea of Galilee! We begin today at Tabgha, the traditional site of Jesus feeding the 5000 (Mt 14:13-21; etc) and the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter (Jn 21:1-24), where Jesus restored Peter. We then spend time reflecting and worshiping at the Mt. of Beatitudes (Mt 5-7; etc) and then head to Capernaum, Jesus' base for His early ministry. Afterwards, we board a replica wooden "Jesus Boat" to set sail on the Sea of Galilee. For those interested, our lunch stop includes the option of ordering the special St. Peter's Fish (not included). After lunch, we head to Gadara where Jesus healed the demoniac (Mt 8:28-34; etc) and, time permitting, Bethsaida (2 Sam 3:3, 13:37-38; Jn 1:44; Mk 8:22-26), before making our way to the Jordan River. Here we'll have the opportunity to renew our baptismal vows before we end our day. Dinner and overnight are back in Tiberias.

Day 5 – Wednesday, November 4: Golan Heights, Caesarea Philippi, Tel Dan, Beit Shean, Jerusalem

After breakfast, we travel north to the Golan Heights (Dt 3:13, 4:43; Josh 13:29-31, 20:8; Chr 6:71) for a beautiful view of northern Israel's landscape. Then we head to Caesarea Philippi where Peter confessed, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Mt 16:13-20). We embark on a short nature hike to Tel Dan to see the altar of Jeroboam (1Kgs 12:26-30). Next, we visit Beit Shean, one of the best preserved Decapolis Roman cities, where King Saul and his sons' bodies were hung from the city walls after the Philistines defeated them (1 Sam 31:8-13). Finally, we ascend to the majestic city of Jerusalem in time for our special "Shabbat of a Lifetime" dinner. Afterwards, we check into our hotel in Jerusalem for overnight.

Day 6 – Thursday, November 5: Mt. of Olives, Palm Sunday Road, Garden of Gethsemane, Western Wall, Temple Mount, Via Dolorosa, Southern Steps, Church of the Holy Sepulchre, Bethlehem

We begin today on the beautiful Mt. of Olives (2 Sam 15:30; 1 Kgs 11:7; Ezk 11:23; Zech 14:4; Mt 21:1-11, 24, 26:36-39; Acts 1:9-12; etc) to behold the famous, breathtaking panorama of the Holy City. Our pilgrimage proceeds down the Old Palm Sunday Road to the ancient olive grove at the Garden of Gethsemane. Then we continue to the Church of the Agony (Church of All Nations) where

tradition says Jesus prayed before his arrest (Mt 26:36-39; etc). We enter Jerusalem through the Zion Gate and proceed to the Western (Wailing) Wall, the holiest site in Judaism. Beyond the wall lies the 35-acre temple area purchased by King David (2 Samuel 24:18-25), which is called the Temple Mount (Gen 22:2; 1 Kgs 6-7; 2 Kgs 25; Ezr 1, 3, 4, 6; Mt 24; etc). This area is the third holiest shrine in Islam, housing both the El-Aqsa Mosque and the magnificent Dome of the Rock. From the temple area we make our way to St. Stephen's Gate (Acts 7:54-60) to walk the Via Dolorosa (Mt 27:24-26, 31-35; etc) – including St. Anne's Crusader Church, Pools of Bethesda (Jn 5:1-9), the Pavement, where Jesus stood while being tried by Pilate (Jn 19:13), Ecce Homo Arch (Jn 19:5), and the ancient Cardo. We continue to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, traditional site of Christ's crucifixion, burial, and resurrection (Mt 27:33, 52-53, 60; etc), and then conclude our day with a short walk to the original steps that Jesus climbed as he entered the Temple area. We finish off our sightseeing around Bethlehem, as we pass by Rachel's Tomb (Gen 35:19-20; 48:7; Mt 2:18) on the outskirts, and then visit the Church of the Nativity (Mic 5:2; Lk 2:1-7) and Shepherds' Field (Lk 2:8-15; Ruth 2:2; Gen 35:21). We have dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 7 – Friday, November 6: Yad Vashem, Shrine of the Book, Model City, City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Pool of Siloam, St. Peter Gallicantu, Shabbat of a Lifetime Dinner

After breakfast, we visit Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Museum. Together we'll walk through the Children's Memorial before we have some time to explore the remainder of the museum on our own. Next, we'll visit the Shrine of the Book Museum to see the Dead Sea Scrolls and the fascinating 1:50 scale model of Jerusalem as it would have appeared in Jesus' time. Next, we drive to the City of David, and then we go on a short walk to Hezekiah's Tunnel (2 Chr 32:2-4,30; 2 Kgs 20:20), conditions permitting. Be sure to bring a flashlight and water shoes to walk through the tunnel. Anyone wanting to stay dry can walk through Hezekiah's shaft. If time permits, we will visit the newly excavated Pool of Siloam (Neh 3:15; Jn 9:1-7) and the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu (Mk 14:30).. In the evening participate in the special event of Shabbat of a Lifetime dinner. Overnight is in Jerusalem

Day 8 – Saturday, November 7: Qumran, Ein Gedi, Masada, Dead Sea for Swim/Float, Jericho

After breakfast, we drive to Qumran, the settlement of the Essenes, the first century sect which authored the Dead Sea Scrolls. From there we head to Ein Gedi where David hid from King Saul (1 Sam 23:29, 24:1-2; also 2 Chr 20:2, Songs 1:14). We then travel south along the western shore of the Dead Sea toward Masada where we ascend by cable car up to King Herod's astonishing fortress. Afterwards, we make a special stop at the Dead Sea for a short swim or float. Time and conditions permitting, we'll include a visit to Qasr El-Yahud, the newly excavated site where tradition holds that John the Baptist baptized Jesus (Mt 3:13-17; etc). If time permits, we will also include a short visit to Jericho (Josh 6:1-20; Lk 19:1-10). Dinner and overnight are in Jerusalem.

Day 9 – Sunday, November 8: Jerusalem, Elah Valley, Jaffa, Farewell Dinner


In the morning, we have a day at leisure in Jerusalem. We have time to explore the city at our own discretion, this will be a great opportunity for shopping and exploring the local markets. Afterwards, we depart the city for the Elah Valley to see the brook where David slew Goliath (1 Sam 17). Afterwards, we head back into the city for our special Farewell Dinner! Our final overnight is in Jerusalem.

Day 10 – Monday, November 9: Return Home, Arrive in U.S.A.



Day 10 – Monday, November 9: Allenby Bridge, Jordan: Madaba, Machaerus, Petra

This morning we depart Israel for Jordan via the Allenby Bridge, where we meet our agent and are assisted through security and customs. We board our motor coach to Madaba (Num 21:30; Josh 13:9), the Moabite town of the Bible to see the Ancient Holy Land Map. Next, we travel to Machaerus (Mukawir). Perched on a 700-meter-high hill southwest of Madaba are the ruins of the fortress of Herod the Great. Machaerus is where John the Baptist was beheaded by Herod Antipas (Mt 14:1-12; Mk 6:17-29). We continue south to Petra, "the Red Rose City." Dinner and overnight are in Petra.

Day 11 – Tuesday, November 10: Petra, Amman

After breakfast, we visit Petra, a 2000-year-old Nabatean city and one of the New Seven Wonders of the World. We'll walk about a half-mile through the narrow passageway with cliffs on either side, called the "Siq". At the end of the Siq appears Petra's Treasury, a massive royal tomb carved out of the solid mountain rock. Time permitting, we will see Jabal Harun, aka Mt. Aaron or Mt. Hor (Num 20:22-29; 33:37-41), where Aaron is buried. We then leave in the afternoon for Amman. Dinner and overnight are in Amman.

Day 12 – Wednesday, November 11: Amman, Mt. Nebo, Allenby Bridge, Israel: Jaffa, Tel Aviv Airport

This morning we travel to Mt. Nebo (Num 27:12-14) to view the Holy Land from where Moses stood (Deuteronomy 32:48-52; 34:1-6), a breathtaking view across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea to the Mt. of Olives and the roof tops of Jerusalem. We then return to the Allenby Bridge for our return to Israel. After our border formalities, we arrive back in Israel and continue with a visit to Jaffa, aka Joppa (Josh 19:46; 1 Kgs 5:6; 2 Chron 2:16; Ezra 3:7; Jonah 1:3; Acts 9:36-43, 10:10-48). Then we have dinner and an evening transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for our return flight back to the U.S.A.

Day 13 – Thursday, November 12: Arrive in U.S.A.

We arrive home in the U.S.A. At the close of an unforgettable tour, we take home wonderful memories of the Old and New Testament, a renewal of our faith, and a greater understanding of the life of our Lord.

While we do our best to ensure that all items listed in your itinerary are included, there are times when conditions beyond our control may affect your program or itinerary, including but not limited to air carrier changes, delays, weather, political climate, time constraints, or changes made by your tour leader and tour guide.
