All Saints Presbyterian Church | Austin, TX

All Saints Presbyterian Church's Columbarium & Memorial Garden provides a special place for interment of (depositing) cremated remains of church members, pastors, and their family members. The Columbarium contains 576 niches (compartments), each with the capacity for up to two (2) urns of one (1) person each. The memorial wall contains an additional 154 memorial plaques available for engraving to remember those buried elsewhere.

Eligibility for Interment

- Interment in the Columbarium is restricted to the cremated remains of members, pastors, former members, and former pastors of All Saints, as well as their parents, spouses, and children. The Senior Pastor may grant eligibility to others who are meaningfully connected to All Saints.

Fees for Interment

- The one-time fee to reserve a niche in the Columbarium is \$4,000 (plus \$107 in card transaction processing fees if applicable). The fee includes the right of interment in the reserved niche, up to two urns, inscription on the niche, and ongoing care for the Columbarium. The fee does not include the cost of cremation. In the Austin area, direct cremation cost is around \$1,000, excluding optional services (e.g. visitation). All Saints may change the niche fee, but incumbent niche reservation owners will not be reimbursed any difference nor assessed additional costs if the fee changes. Each niche may accommodate up to two urns. Those who elect to reserve only one half of a shared niche (thereby leaving room for the ashes of another unrelated person) may do so for \$2,500 (plus \$67 in card transaction processing fees if applicable).

Eligibility for Memorialization

- Remembrance on the memorial wall is restricted to members, pastors, former members, and former pastors of All Saints, as well as their parents, spouses, and children. The Senior Pastor may grant eligibility to others who are meaningfully connected to All Saints. A memorial plaque is meant to memorialize one individual or one married couple.

Fee for a Memorial Plaque

- The one-time fee for a memorial plaque in the Memorial Garden is \$1,000 (plus \$27 in card transaction processing fees if applicable). The fee includes the plaque and its inscription, as well as ongoing care for the Memorial Garden. All Saints may change the fee, but those who have already paid the fee will not be reimbursed any difference nor assessed additional costs if the fee changes.

Financial Assistance

- Anyone desiring to reserve a niche or memorial plaque, but without the means to pay the fee, may appeal to any deacon for help from the Benevolence Fund. Disbursements from the Benevolence Fund are subject to consideration by the deacons per their standing practices for Benevolence Fund disbursements.

Reserving a Niche

- We are now officially accepting niche reservations. Once the niche reservation fee has been paid in full (minus any deposit prepaid), you may select a specific niche to be reserved. The attached one-page niche reservation form will be your way of documenting the details for All Saints to keep on file; in exchange you will receive a niche reservation certificate for your files. Just leave the niche selection section blank for now -- that is best finalized on site and in person.



THE COLUMBARIUM INTERMENT SERVICE

A service for the interment of ashes is similar to a graveside burial service at a cemetery. **If you have any questions not addressed in this packet, please contact the All Saints Funeral Coordinator at funerals@allsaintsaustin.org.**

ALL SAINTS FUNERAL COORDINATOR

The All Saints Funeral Coordinator is available to assist the family and friends of the deceased throughout the entire process with those things related to the service or facility use. The coordinator will communicate primarily with the family and the officiating pastor.

CEREMONY

- The ceremony for an interment is brief. Included with this packet is an example of an interment service.
- Typically, two family members will assist with the reading of the scriptures. If no family members or friends are available, the pastor or other All Saints staff person can serve as scripture reader.
- If desired, a hymn can be sung prior to the benediction at the end of the service. A few common selections are listed below.
 - Be Thou My Vision
 - The Doxology
 - Amazing Grace

THE URN AND ASHES

Prior to the service, the cremains of the deceased should be placed in an urn provided by All Saints (designed to fit the columbarium niches). If the interment is to take place soon after the cremation, All Saints can provide the urn to the crematorium. If another urn is already being used, a qualified All Saints staff person will gladly assist in transferring the cremains to the All Saints urn and placing it in safe-keeping until the time of the interment service.

Immediately prior to the service, the urn containing the cremains is placed on a small table in front of the appropriate columbarium niche. During the service, the pastor will place the urn in the niche; and, following the service, the engraved nameplaque will be put in place and the niche sealed.

FLOWERS

There is a place either on the concrete bench or on the table with the urn for an arrangement of flowers. The family can bring these or can arrange for a florist to deliver them on the day of the interment. If they are to be delivered, please ask the florist to contact All Saints to arrange for someone to be present to receive them and put them in place.

INVITATION

Minister: My friends, we have come together to entomb the ashes of our brother/sister, N. In doing this we recall that our bodies bear the imprint of the first creation when they were fashioned from dust; but in faith we remember, too, that by the new creation we also bear the image of Jesus who was raised to glory. We gather today in confident hope that one day God will raise us and transform our mortal bodies:

CALL TO WORSHIP

Minister: I am Resurrection and I am Life, says the Lord. Whoever has faith in me shall have life, even though he die. And everyone who has life, and has committed himself to me in faith, shall not die for ever.

As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives and that at the last he will stand upon the earth. After my awaking, he will raise me up; and in my body I shall see God. I myself shall see, and my eyes behold him who is my friend and not a stranger. For none of us lives to himself, and no man dies to himself. For if we live, we live unto the Lord; and if we die, we die unto the Lord.

All: *Whether we live, therefore, or die, we are the Lord's.*

Minister: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord;

All: *Even so says the Spirit, for they rest from their labors.*

Minister: The Lord be with you.

All: *And with your spirit.*

Minister: Let us pray. O God, who by the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ destroyed death, and brought life and immortality to light: Grant that your servant N, being raised with him, may know the strength of his presence, and rejoice in his eternal glory who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God forever and ever. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Minister: In peace, let us pray to the Lord:

Almighty God, who has knit together your elect in one communion and fellowship, in the mystical body of your Son Christ our Lord: Grant, we beseech you, to your whole Church in paradise and on earth, your light and peace.

Grant that all who have been baptized into Christ's death and resurrection may die to sin and rise to newness of life, and that through the grave and gate of death we may pass with him to our joyful resurrection.

Grant us grace to entrust N to your never-failing love; and to believe that you have received him/her into the arms of your mercy, and that you remember him/her according to the favor which you bear unto your people.

Minister: Grant us, with all who have died in the hope of the resurrection, to have our consummation and bliss in your eternal and everlasting glory, and, with N and all your saints, to receive the crown of life which you do promise to all who share in the victory of your Son Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

THE COMMENDATION AND COMMITTAL

Minister: O God, whose blessed Son was laid in a sepulcher in the garden: Bless, we pray, this resting place, and grant that he whose ashes are placed here may dwell with Christ in paradise, and may come to your heavenly kingdom; through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: *Amen.*

Minister: All that the Father gives me shall come to me; and him that comes to me I will in no way cast out.

All: *He that raised up Jesus from the dead will also give life to our mortal bodies, by his Spirit that dwells in us.*

Minister: Therefore my heart is glad, and my spirit rejoices; my flesh also shall rest in hope.

All: *You will show me the path of life; in your presence is the fullness of joy, and at your right hand there is pleasure for evermore.*

Minister: In sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to Almighty God our brother/sister N; and we commit his/her body to the grave; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust.

The Lord bless him/her and keep him/her, the Lord make his face to shine upon him/her and be gracious unto him/her, the Lord lift up his countenance upon him/her and give him/her peace. Amen.

Minister: Let us pray.

All: *Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.*

Minister: Grant eternal rest to N, O Lord; where the world of dust and ashes has no dominion. Confirm us in our hope that he/she will be created anew on the day when you will raise him/her up in glory to live with you and all the saints for ever and ever. Amen.

Alleluia. Christ is risen.
All: *The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia.*

Thou my great Father, and I Thy true son; Thou in me dwelling, and I with Thee one.

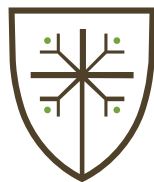
Riches I heed not, nor man's empty praise, Thou mine inheritance, now and always:
