Deacon Ministry

Each year, our church chooses men to serve as deacons. The Greek word for deacon means, “one who serves,” or “servant.” Deacons assist the pastoral staff by ministering to the physical and spiritual needs of the congregation and taking care of widows, a role that we trace to the early church in Acts 6. At Ramoth, we also serve as the board of directors, a role that oversees the physical needs of the church, as well. We are servant leaders and representatives of the congregation. As directed in our church by-laws, we will nominate men to serve as deacons on June 1st, and vote on those nominees on August 17th. This year, seven men will be rotating off the deacon body. In our by-laws, Ramoth wisely limits deacons to a three-year term of service and mandates at least one year off the deacon body before being eligible to serve again. This policy allows our deacons at least one year of rest from what can often be a very demanding three-year commitment. The term limit also brings new men to the body with fresh ideas and new perspectives. This is vital for a healthy, growing Ramoth Baptist Church to meet the needs of our diverse congregation.

Paul lists the qualifications for deacons in 1 Timothy 3:8-13. Deacons are to be worthy of respect, sincere, not indulging in much wine, honest, holding the deep truths of the faith with a clear conscience, the husband of one wife, and manage their household and children well. What is interesting about this list is that they are observable character attributes, not a list of skills or occupations, or even spiritual gifts. The church certainly needs men with a variety of skills, occupations, and spiritual gifts, but the most important thing is that they are men of character.

Pray about who you will nominate and vote for. Pray for our deacons and the work they do. Pray that God would bring forth men who meet these qualifications and are willing to serve during this pivotal time in Ramoth’s history.

We wait until some bad news is given before we change the path we are on.

Now look at 1 Timothy 4:8.

⁸For bodily discipline is only of little profit, but godliness is profitable for all things, since it holds promise for the present life and for the life to come.

As much as we would like to be healthy and get a good report from the doctor, we are ignoring another aspect of our life. The eternal aspect. We all live forever. Some of us in Heaven and some of us in Hell, but we all live forever. Many of us simply do not think of our eternal health in the same way as we do our physical health.

We get unwelcome news and then we change something. God wants us to change everything. He wants us to be a new creation in Him. Here’s the bad news. We are all dead in our sin. We are all bound for hell. We have no way to change our daily routine to fix what is broken.

Here’s the good news. Jesus has already done the work for us. He died and arose for our sin. By accepting Him as Lord and Savior, we not only improve our spiritual health, but change it completely. We become a new creation in Christ.

Look at 2 Corinthians 5:17.

¹⁷ Therefore if anyone is in Christ, ^[a]he is a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.

The sinful person is gone. The sin has been forgiven. The dead in sin has become the alive in Christ! We begin to change. We change everything. We change how we love God, how we love others, how we live our lives, and Who we live for. We change our goals, our values, and our desires. We no longer live for the world, but we now live for a life that is yet to come. Our eternal life becomes just as real as this present life.

Have you accepted Christ as Lord and Savior? Have you included prayer and bible study in your daily routine? Have you become a new creation in Christ? Have you begun to change? I hope you have, but if you haven’t, there is still time, at least, right now.

Refuge Ministry

In the name of our Heavenly Father, I greet you and bless you, brothers and sisters. We have had quite the kick-off to Spring, and it is quickly preparing us for an amazing Summer. We will have lots of things going on in the church, around the church, through the church and with the people of the church. All of which, might cause some people to ask the question, "How are all of these things possible?" The answer is simple...we have trusted God in all things and in those things, God has blessed us.

This is the process that all believers should be familiar with using in their lives. It is biblically sound instruction for our lives and the things that we are to consider. **Proverbs 3:5-6** declares the following, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding;⁶ in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." This promise to make straight the path, is an indication of how God wants to work in our lives.

It is in this ministry of reconciling that we are called to an even greater process. That process is act of obedience to the word of God. For once we have been reconciled to Him, we are immediately under His authority and direction. Once again, we find this notion to be biblically based. We find this assertion in **Deuteronomy 28:1-2**, "If you fully obey the Lord your God and carefully follow all his commands I give you today, the Lord your God will set you high above all the nations on earth. ² All these blessings will come on you and accompany you if you obey the Lord your God." The context here, is that we as obedient believers, following God's commands, will be blessed.

That blessing is part of yet another process. The process of loving others and blessing them because we have been blessed. This fulfills the sentiment of **Luke 6:27-36**. This passage speaks of how we are to love even our enemies and to show grace and mercy to those who are in need. The Ten Commandments – 6th Commandment – Thou shalt not kill (No murder).

Let's first establish the value of life. We are made in the very image of God. He made us to have a relationship with Him. **Genesis 2:7** says, *Then the Lord God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being.* Not only were we the only creation formed by the very hands of God, but His very *breath of life* was breathed into our body. Scripture undergirds this in **Gen 9:4** where it tells us that the "...life, that is, its blood." We know that the oxygen our blood carries throughout our body is what gives us the very life to live.

Your further great value is evidenced by the very life and death of Jesus that purchased your salvation with the shedding of His blood on the cross for the atonement of our sins. We were/are worth the sacrifice of God's own Son in order that we might be redeemed.

Now, we come to the 6th Commandment. This Commandment in Exodus is not the first time we have seen this principle. In **Genesis 9**, Noah has just finished his yearlong voyage on the Ark. He is now re-establishing man's dominion on the earth. Among the instructions God gives Noah, He says in **Genesis 9:6** "*Whoever sheds man's blood, by man his blood shall be shed, for in the image of God He made man.*" This statement and the 6th Commandment are specific statements and not meant to be just a general prohibition against all forms of life-taking. The word translated "kill" comes from a very rare Hebrew word translated as murder. Murder and kill carry very different definitions. Murder would be defined as: *The killing of another person without justification or excuse, especially the crime of killing a person with malice aforethought or with recklessness manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life.* Kill would be defined as: *to deprive of life.*

These definitions lead us back to the intent of the 6th Commandment and **Genesis 9:6**. Because human life is sanctified in God's eyes, the deliberate taking of life is murder. This spells out the punishment for the murderer – the forfeiture of his life. Right after the 6th Commandment is given, Exodus 21:12,14 that further defines what would be considered punishment for the offender. "*He who strikes a man so that he dies shall surely be put to death.....But if a man acts with premeditation against his neighbor, to kill him by treachery, you shall take him from My altar, that he may die.*"

Now for the positive side of this commandment. We are to protect life. There are three ways we can protect the life of our family. Physical Life: As fathers, we are to act as the physical protectors of our family. From the unborn to those nearing the end of life, we must keep guard against those who would come against our family. Be aware of who they associate with. Spiritual Life: We are responsible for teaching, building and maintaining the Spiritual health of our family. Our battle for the souls of our family is against the Evil One, Satan. He is a murderer. He comes to interfere wherever he can. "*The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.*" **John 10:10** Finally, Eternal Life: Only Jesus gives us Eternal Life. John 10:27-28 says, *My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand.* Are you sure your family knows the Savior and knows they have Eternal life. Nothing is more important. Nothing is more thrilling, than to lead or see your loved ones come to Christ. Lead on, men, lead on.
