President's Message

Rose Hill Civil War Trails Marker, Recalling Mosby's 1863 Raid to be Featured at April 2013 RHCA Meeting

The Virginia Civil War Trails marker calling attention to Confederate raider John Singleton Mosby's capture of the aide to President Lincoln's designated governor of the "Restored State of Virginia" in Rose Hill on September 28, 1863 (150 year ago!) has been installed on Rose Hill Drive at the John Marshall Library. The marker will be previewed at the Tuesday, April 23 meeting of the Rose Hill Civic Association beginning at 7 p.m.

This marker puts Rose Hill on the map during the Sesquicentennial of the Civil War (1861-65). As far as we know, it is the only one in the Lee Magisterial District. It is the result of the hard work by Don Hakenson on behalf of the Franconia Museum with the support of Supervisor Jeff McKay and the Fairfax County Sesquicentennial Commission and the Fairfax County History Commission.

On that night long ago, Mosby and his men rode into Rose Hill and captured Colonel Daniel Dulany at the Rose Hill manor house, located at the end of what now is May Boulevard. One of Mosby's raiders was young French Dulany, the son of Colonel Dulany. The full story of the raid is depicted on the marker and will be narrated by Hakenson, a renowned Mosby historian, on April 23. You won't want to

miss Don's performance! He also is the author of numerous books on Mosby, all of which will be available for sale.

Weather permitting, the presentation will be held outside at the marker with a reception to follow in the community room of the John Marshall Library. Snacks and lemonade or iced tea will be available. While in the community room, take a look at the painting by famed Civil War artist John Paul Strain that hangs just inside the door to the right. The painting was purchased through contributions by Rose Hill residents and is displayed in the community room. All of the donors' names are listed with the painting, along with a description of the raid.

Plan to join us for this historic presentation. Young history buffs are especially welcome.

Vehicle Break-ins

We have had several break-ins of vehicles at night in Rose Hill lately. Mostly the thieves are breaking into small trucks or SUVs looking for tools. Too many have been successful. In several cases, the vehicles have been vandalized without anything being taken. Broken windows or damaged side mirrors seems to be the favorite target. This seems to be a problem throughout the Franconia area in recent years. Please make sure your vehicle is securely locked at night. It would be a good idea to take valuable tools or other expensive items inside at night. GPS systems are among the items of choice. Make sure any vehicle that contains valuable or important items is parked in the driveway close to the house. Leave the outside light on all night. A motion detector lighting system would be a good investment as thieves are not attracted to lights. If you

have an incident, please report it to the non-emergency number of 703-691-2131. If you see a suspicious vehicle, try to get a description and license plate number. If you see a crime in progress, call 911. Please keep your eyes open for any suspicious vehicles or persons in Rose Hill and do not hesitate to make a report. The more Neighborhood Watchers we have in Rose Hill, the greater the odds that a criminal will be apprehended in the act or information leading to an arrest will be provided. We recently have added additional Neighborhood Watch signs at the entrances to our community. Let's make sure they mean something!

Storm Drain Reminder

The Lee District Association of Civic Organizations provides a reminder that storm drains flow unfiltered directly into our streams, the Potomac River and the Chesapeake Bay. They do NOT connect with the sewerage treatment plant. Nothing is removed from the water. That means pet waste, yard debris, fertilizer, motor oil, pesticides and trash have the potential to make their way to the Bay, which is slowly becoming inundated with pollution. Please take care to avoid dumping any of the above items into the storm drainage systems. Storm water drains are normally found in the street. However, there also are a number of yard inlets in Rose Hill. Most of the runoff from Rose Hill goes into either Pike Branch and on to Cameron Run and the Potomac or Dogue Creek along the golf course, through Huntley Meadows Park and on to the Potomac. Please be careful not to use the storm drains as a dumping system.

They're Back!

Periodical cicadas, after 17 years of living underground, are due to raise their ugly heads this year. We haven't seen any since 1996! The cousins of katydids and crickets will fill the air, munch on trees and shrubs and cover the patios, sidewalks and roads. The deafening sound of the chirps really is the love song of the males as they prepare to mate. The cicadas will rise from the dirt when the ground temperature reaches 64 degrees. If they appear this year as expected, you'll be raking cicadas rather than leaves. They are that thick on the ground. It is estimated that there can be as many as one million or more in a single acre. Insecticides are not usually effective in killing the invaders. If you have fruit trees or low bushes, it is suggested that you cover them with some netting to prevent the cicadas from getting to the bark. Those that appear this year will lay eggs, then die off. Their offspring will reappear in 2030! Infestations last four to six weeks. In the meantime, the birds and squirrel will have a feast. Maybe they will be joined by sea gulls munching their way inland.



A Not-So-Tender Reunion





On September 28, 1863, Confederate Maj. John S. Mosby raided the house that stood nearby on the bluff at the end of May Boulevard. The day before, Mosby and eight of his men rode from Fauquier County toward Alexandria, where Mosby planned to capture Francis H. Pierpont, the provisional governor of the Restored Government of Virginia.

Mosby expected to find Pierpont at the City Hotel, known today as Gadstyx's Tavern, but was disappointed to learn that Pierpont had gone to Washington City. Mosby and his men burned a railroad bridge within sight of Forts Ellsworth and Lyon, then rode along Telegraph Road to the Rose Hill Plantation to surprise the governor's aide, Col. Daniel F. Dulany. One of Mosby's Rangers, French Dulany, was Col. Dulany's son. Anne S. Fobel, a Rose Hill neighbor, wrote in her diary that a "party of Mosby's boys came very unexpectedly to Rose Hill, and took off Col. Dulaney. One of them was his own son. ... This boy's first greeting to his father when

"The Colonel sarcastically remarked to his son that he had an old pair of shoes he had better take, as he reckoned they were darned scarce in the Confederacy, whereupon the son holding up his leg which was encased in a fine pair of cavalry boots just captured from a sutler, asked the old man what he thought of that." — Maj. John S. Mosby, October 1, 1863

he rushed into the room where his father was in bed [was] ... 'How do Pa—I'm very glad to see you,' and the father's answer sitting up in bed, with proper dignity, 'Well sir, I'm d-sorry to see you.' But they took him down to Richmond nevertheless."

Dulany was imprisoned, exchanged, and survived the war. His son, however, was mortally wounded in 1864. The house burned in 1895.
