Leftover Snow Drifts

Thanks to everyone who assisted their neighbors during the January snow storm. Special thanks to our volunteer delivery people who made sure the January Rambler arrived even though the meeting was canceled. Remember, activities are automatically cancelled or postponed when schools are closed. Here in Rose Hill, we need to do better in the sidewalk clearing department. There were too many addresses on streets with sidewalks where they weren't shoveled within a reasonable amount of time. It's not the County or State's responsibility. It's Ours! If you know of a neighbor who can't shovel for one reason or another, please try to help. It helps if the sidewalks are clear so people can get to the store. Walking in the snow-covered street is dangerous and should be avoided. Many people continue to complain that snow plows block their freshly shoveled driveways as they continue to plow in an effort to clear the entire street. Most of the snow removal people are private contractors for VDOT and they must get paid by the hour. One told me he had been working for 24 straight hours. All in all, they do a good job, but it continues to be exasperating to see your driveway blocked when you just finished shoveling and your back hurts. Finally, be sure to check on your senior citizen neighbors and others who may need help when it snows.

Lighting Updates

We missed the exceptional display at the Rice household, 6431 Carriage Drive. The lights weren't on the night the judges made their rounds because of a malfunctioning timer. We've added them to the 2015 list. The Rices added more deer outside this year and no doubt had one of Rose Hill's best displays. Also on Carriage Drive, we misidentified the homeowners at 6511. Bill and Sally Dankers live there, just as they have for many years. And, over on Driftwood Drive, we are advised by a neighbor that the lights were on at the Ericksons at 6223 and they deserved to be mentioned.

IRS Scams

The 2015 Tax deadline is less than two months away, so

it's a good time to remind everyone that the scammers are on the prowl. The first thing to remember is the IRS will NOT call or e-mail you unless they are responding to your specific message. Incidents of tax identity theft, telephone scams and internet phishing attacks increase greatly this time of year. If you have any questions about any contact from someone who claims to be with the IRS, contact the IRS Identity Protection Specialized Unit at 1-800-908-4490. Or, contact [IRS.gov/identity theft](https://www.irs.gov/identity-theft). Scammers will use stolen Social Security Numbers to file tax returns in an effort to gain fraudulent refunds. Also remember that the IRS does not demand payment with debit cards and does not issue funds to a credit card. Report any suspicious activity.

Vehicle Emissions

Virginia has a new on-road emissions inspection program in Northern Virginia called RAPIDPASS. The system allows a motorist to drive through an on-road system to complete their emissions inspection. You may have noticed the one set up on Telegraph Road northbound between Split Rock Road and Rose Hill Drive. Upon notification of a successful test, motorists can pay for the test on line and then proceed with their vehicle registration renewal. For details, go to rapidpassvirginia.com/VaPublic/Home/HowItWorks. This program raises many questions, so make sure you understand how it works before you use it so you don't get caught with expired tags. For me, I'll get my vehicles inspected the old-fashioned way so I get a receipt on the spot that says Pass and I can mail in my renewal!

Following Jeb Stuart – Phase II

The Franconia Museum will sponsor Both Sides Tour XVI, Phase II of Confederate cavalry leader Jeb Stuart's route to Gettysburg on Saturday, April 30. The all-day motor coach tour leaves the Franconia Museum, 6121 Franconia Road at 8:15 a.m. Sharp! The tour begins at Rowser's Ford on the Maryland side of the Potomac and stops in Rockville. It continues through Sykesville, Westminster and Eldersburg in Maryland, Hanover, Hunterstown and Gettysburg in Pennsylvania. Lunch is included. The tour finishes at the East Cavalry Field in Gettysburg where Stuart battled Federal horsemen led by Generals David Gregg and George Armstrong Custer. Tour guides are Don Hakenson and Carl Sell of the Franconia Museum and Ben

Trittipoe, President of the Stuart-Mosby Historical Society. Edna Mitchell and Mary Smith from Rose Hill have been on all of the previous tours, including the one last fall that tracked Stuart's route from Fauquier County, Middleburg, Upperville, Buckland in Prince William County, Fairfax Court House and finally the Potomac crossing from Virginia to Maryland at Rowser's Ford on the Fairfax-Loudoun line.
