Upcoming RHCA events

RHCA Members and residents of Rose Hill are invited to join their neighbors in support of our first responders at the annual Night Out gathering starting at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, August 7, 2012 in the Nichols' front yard at 6416 Rose Hill Drive. This is a program where communities gather all across the nation to show their support for the police, fire and rescue, and sheriff's departments who are on duty 24/7 to respond to emergencies. In Rose Hill, we try to assemble a large crowd in an effort to show our commitment to a safe community. Police, fire and rescue, and sheriff's deputies will be on hand to meet and greet and answer questions. RHCA provides hot dogs with all the trimmings, lemonade or iced tea and all the paper products. Residents are asked to bring a side dish or dessert suitable for summer weather. Come and meet your neighbors and our first responders.

The Tuesday, June 26 RHCA meeting is the last one until fall. Our next regular meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 25 at 7 p.m. in the community room of the John Marshall library. Meetings are also scheduled for Tuesday, October 23 and Tuesday, November 27, both at 7 p.m. at the library. There will NOT be a meeting in December.

Good Neighbors

Recently, there have been a large number of complaints about properties not being maintained, overcrowding of people and cars, overgrown grass and weeds, junk cars, loud noise and general disrespect for the neighbors and the property values in Rose Hill. Many are being investigated by the County. RHCA will continue to forward complaints to the property agency. Residents are reminded that there are County laws covering disrepair, overcrowding, parking of inoperable vehicles on both the street and on private property, health issues, loud noise, operation of and parking for a commercial non-manufacturing business in a residential neighborhood, parking on the front lawn, etc. It may take time, but eventually violations will be cleaned up. If there are potential violations on your property, or you are not sure, it would behoove you to look into it before a citation, that may result in a fine, is issued. Rest assured that your neighbors and RHCA are interested in maintaining property values for all. Commercial businesses are not discouraged as long as they do not attract workers or customers to the site and there is no more than one small commercial vehicle per address. Residents are reminded to keep their grass cut because if it reaches a certain height, the County will cut it and place a lien on the property for payment. Don't park on the grass in your front yard. You are entitled to a driveway that is not more than 25 percent of your lot width. That will allow two cars side by side. Residents along Rose Hill Drive from the Library to Telegraph Road are reminded that parking is NOT allowed on the grass strip between the sidewalk and the street. We thank everyone along the way in that area for keeping the grass cut. Residents also are reminded that no more than TWO yard sales are allowed at any one property within one year. Finally, everyone is reminded that Rose Hill is still governed by covenants, which restrict certain uses. They are listed on our website, myrosehill.com. RHCA reminds property owners that the covenants, while not County law, can be enforced by the Court. They cover such things as sheds, fences, etc. Go to myroshill.com and click on covenants. The RHCA Constitution and Bylaws also are on the web site.

Services for Moe Haupt

Funeral services with full military honors will be held for long-time Rose Hill resident Moe Haupt at 3 p.m. on Thursday, June 28 at Arlington Cemetery. Friends are asked to arrive at the administration building at Arlington by 2:30 p.m. Moe served two tours on the USS Iwo Jima during the Vietnam War as a helicopter pilot for the United States Navy and survived a near-fatal incident in 1960 after being pulled unconscious from the burning wreckage. Following a long recovery from serious injuries, he went on to serve 16 more years before retiring in 1976. He then worked for the National Aviation Business Association specializing in noise abatement procedures before retiring in 1999. Moe and his wife Alice have been active in Rose Hill for many years. He served as president of the Highland Park pool and spent countless hours as a coach, umpire and fan of area youth baseball. He played baseball in high school and college and never lost his love for the game. Moe and Alice have been active in the Rose Hill Elementary PTA in support of their five boys and Rose Hill Civic Association where Moe organized last year's Veteran's Day display on Rose Hill Drive. His good humor and wit will be missed, especially at the fish fry Tuesday night.

Civil War Trails Marker

The good news is that the Civil War Trails marker about Mosby's Rose Hill Raid on September 28, 1863 has been approved and constructed. The bad news is that the language on the marker in its proposed location misrepresents where the raid took place. The Civil War Trails committee plans to place the marker on Rose Hill Drive in front of the Library. The language indicates that Mosby raided the house that stood ON THIS SITE. Actually, the house stood at the end of what is now May Boulevard, some distance from the library and was accessed in those days from Telegraph Road. Months ago, RHCA advocated placing the marker on the actual location of the house and the James family at 6412 May Boulevard agreed to an easement to make that happen. A directional sign would be placed on Rose Hill Drive at May Boulevard. Without any discussion, the decision was made to put it at the library with the inaccurate language. In the spirit of historical accuracy, RHCA has asked

that the sign language be changed or preferably, the marker be placed where the house once stood.

May Boulevard School

The Rose Hill Academy is open at the former Kindercare site. The school serves children six weeks of age through kindergarten and will be adding a grade a year up to third grade. There also is a school-age summer camp and after-school care for area public school students. Rose Hill Academy is sponsoring a tee-ball team in the Pioneer League made up of its own youngsters known as the Rose Hill Rockhounds. The school is under the auspices of the Luther Learning Communities. Its website is llcschools.org and the phone number is 703-822-0411. The school moved to our community from the Fort Hunt area. It will operate under the same rules and regulations RHCA negotiated with Kindercare. Apparently the church that also planned to use the site has not yet made a decision to move forward. If it does, Special Exception approval will be needed and there will be public meetings with RHCA as well as public hearings before the County planning Commission and Board of Supervisors. We'll keep you advised.

Rock-A-By Road Development

A preliminary plan to develop three houses on 1.5 acres at the end of Rock-A-By Road has been submitted to the County. The property is zoned R-3 (the same as the rest of Rose Hill) and is a by-right development as long as it meets County requirements. Under the plan, the existing cul de sac at the end of Lark Lane will be removed and relocated on the new development site. RHCA is concerned about access to the other lots on the end of Rock-A-By Road as the plan seems to cause them to be landlocked. We have asked for an explanation and hopefully will have answers in time for the June 26 meeting. In the past, we have been successful in blocking access to Bee Street through a narrow right of way. That now appears to be the only method of access for the remaining lots on Rock-A-By if the three houses are constructed as planned.

Citizens Police Academy

The Fairfax County Police Academy is

accepting applications for its Fall Citizen's Police Academy to be held in September and November, 2012. The first nine classes will be held between 6:30 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Thursday nights starting September 13. The final class will be held on Saturday, Nov. 17 from 8:00 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. Sites will rotate among various police facilities around Fairfax County, including Annandale, Chantilly, Fairfax, Mount Vernon and Reston. Participants must attend at least eight of the 10 classes. Classes are limited to 40 participants and you must register by June 30. Call Ms. Tracey A. Ryan, Director of the Citizen's Police Academy, at 703-280-0713 (voice mail) to obtain additional information and an application. Class members will get a chance to drive a cruiser on a training course, visit the jail and fire a weapon at the police firing range. You also can ride along with an officer on duty. The classes are FREE. If you miss this one, get in touch with Ms. Ryan and get on the list for the spring 2013 academy.

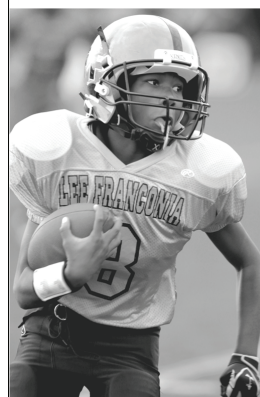


