

President's Message

RHCA Will Try to Figure Out Local, State, and Federal Taxes at Tuesday, March 26 Meeting

It may be impossible, but we will try to figure out the new Federal taxes that went into effect on January 1, 2013, the proposed new state taxes that are part of the new Virginia transportation plan and update you about the current County budget deliberations that will determine the local tax rate at our March 26 RHCA meeting. It all begins at 7 p.m. at the John Marshall library.

Anyone with knowledge of the new federal taxes is invited to attend and pass on the information. The cost won't become evident until next year, but it would be nice to know what is already law that will affect our taxes for 2013. It appears there are new taxes now in force or are on the horizon of which we need to be aware. For example, the Social Security payroll tax already has returned to 6.2 percent after two years at 4.2 percent. And the threshold for payment has increased to \$113,700.

Although the Virginia transportation bill has been passed by the state House and Senate, it has not yet been signed by the Governor. The bill is drastically different from what the Governor first proposed and he has the option to make amendments which then must be ratified by the legislature. We won't know the

final outcome until early April.

We do know that the Virginia bill as proposed will raise the sales tax to six (6) percent on all purchases other than food in Northern Virginia. There also is a transfer tax on the sale of houses, the formula for which fluctuates depending on the price of the house. The tax on gas changes at the pump, but taxes are added at the wholesale level which no doubt will be passed on at the pump. Vehicle registrations and tags also are slated to increase. We'll try to figure out all of the proposed new taxes. Anyone who can help is invited to join the conversation.

At the County level, the Board of Supervisors and the public is evaluating a budget proposed by the County Executive for the fiscal year beginning July 1 that would add two cents per hundred of assessed value for each property. The rate for FY 2014 would be \$1.095 per hundred as opposed to \$1.075 last year. The average tax per household would total \$5,099.56, an increase of \$262.45.

Those attending the March 26 meeting will receive pie charts outlining where the money comes from to support the county and another outlining the proposed expenditures. Of course, nothing is final until the Board of Supervisors adopts a budget on April 30. On behalf of RHCA, I already have voiced concern about the continued inadequate level of patrol officers who protect our community. The County executive boasts that he is increasing the number of officers this year, but they all will be assigned to Tysons Corner and the new Metro Silver line. Nothing for stations such as Franconia. The rest of the county has yet to see any restoration of the dozens of patrol officer positions cut in recent years. The thin blue line is too thin out here on the cul de sacs! At the same time, RHCA has questioned the millions

of carryover (unspent) funds included in the school budget while the salaries for school resource officers are charged to the police budget. The schools receive 52.6 percent of its funding (1 billion, eight hundred eighty-nine million, three hundred fifty six thousand and three hundred and eighty dollars) from the total disbursed by the County.

Come and learn the new federal and state tax rates and where your local tax dollars are being spent. After all that, we'll join together for some nourishment for the soul. We'll need it!

We're a little behind in the number of RHCA members as compared to where we were at this time last year. By far our largest expense is the printing of the Rambler. Our dues, set at \$10 by our bylaws, don't produce adequate income to pay the printing bill. That's why we ask for donations. For example, the Rambler delivered to your doorstep costs more than \$4 per issue. The yearly cost is more than \$35 per household. We deliver it to everyone so all are aware of community issues and county rules and regulations. If you have any questions about our finances, our books are open and can be viewed by any member at a mutually agreeable time arranged with our treasurer. Come to a meeting, keep up with local issues and then share stories with friends both old and new during our social hour. RHCA operates on a shoestring, but we need your help. We have an army of volunteers who deliver the Rambler and serve as members of the important Neighborhood Watch program.

Neighborhood Watch

Thanks to John Thibeau for installing

many of the new Neighborhood Watch signs now posted at each entrance to Rose Hill. Donny Krause installed the one in front of Rose Hill Elementary and Rick Ballard put up the one at Rose Hill Drive and Telegraph Road. Visitors are now totally on notice that Rose Hill has an active, ongoing Neighborhood Watch program. The signs were provided free by the Fairfax County Police through the cooperation of Officer Jim Reid at the Franconia station. We still need watchers on several streets, including Apple Tree Drive and Leewood Drive. Volunteers also are welcome on any street as the more we have the less territory all have to cover. We ask that you keep an eye out in your area for suspicious activity and report it to the police. Call 911 if you see a crime in progress. Call the non-emergency number at 703-691-2131 for anything or anybody that seems out of place. If a vehicle is involved, try to get a license plate number and description. We also ask our Neighborhood Watch volunteers to report street light outages, zoning or parking violations and look out for their elderly neighbors. You don't have to give your name to report suspicious activity or violations, but you can report it in the name of RHCA. We want the police and county personnel to know Rose Hill will not tolerate activity that puts our community in danger, disrupts our community or diminishes the value of our property. RHCA will provide you with numbers to call. Again, as a member of Neighborhood Watch, you can report it in the name of RHCA. We ask EVERYONE to keep an eye on Rose Hill Elementary School and John Marshall Library on each trip past them on Rose Hill Drive.

Springfield Assaults

Although there have been NO incidents in Rose Hill, we want to make sure everyone is aware of the sexual assault incidents in the Springfield area. All but two have taken place on the west side of Interstate 95, including one in a community next to Lee High School. And the others were just west of the Interstate. As of this writing, there have been 23 recorded incidents of women being groped by a suspect described as a Hispanic male between 5 feet, 6 inches and 6 feet. He has facial hair and wears a baseball cap and blue jeans. Police have heightened patrols in the area in an effort to apprehend the suspect. They have asked anyone with any information to call

the non-emergency number at 703-691-2131. The suspect approaches women from behind in broad daylight and gropes them before fleeing. Some attacks have happened to joggers, others to shoppers and even mothers visiting local elementary schools. Police are reminding joggers and those walking to travel in pairs. Although police patrols have increased in the Springfield area, this is another reason why we need additional officers on the street. The best way to deter crime and assaults such as these is to have a visible police presence and a strong Neighborhood Watch program. The County has cut the number of police patrol officers in recent years and has resisted calls to restore them. Although this year's budget calls for extra police to handle Metro's new Silver Line and growth in Tysons Corner, it does nothing to increase the number of patrol officers in the rest of the county. RHCA will continue to be vocal in insisting that public safety should be our top priority. Lets be safe, not sorry.

Election of Officers

Our annual election of officers will take place at the March 26 meeting. The current president, vice president and treasurer have agreed to continue to serve. Only members are eligible to vote. The list of those who are eligible is listed in this issue of the Rambler. Although they are not officers, RHCA owes a debt of gratitude to Jim Sapp, who maintains our website and e-mail list, and Richard Downey, the Rambler editor. Jim no longer lives in Rose Hill, but he keeps in touch through the website, donating his time and the cost of licensing the site on the web from his home on the eastern slope of the Rockies in Colorado. Jim lived in Rose Hill for more than 30 years. Richard grew up in a Rose Hill home that was very community oriented and is continuing the tradition.

R-3 Zoning Means Residential

Residents are reminded; especially newcomers and absentee landlords, that Rose Hill is a RESIDENTIAL community and commercial uses of more than a small nature are NOT permitted. We also are part of a residential parking district that allows only ONE small commercial truck per property. Home businesses are allowed as long as customers

do not visit the site. Child care operations are OK as long as they maintain certain limitations and are licensed by the Commonwealth of Virginia. Property owners also are required to abide by certain zoning restrictions involving occupancy, trash accumulation, noise, parking, animals and various other restrictions found in the Fairfax County zoning ordinance. RHCA is committed to protecting the property value of all who live in Rose Hill and will report alleged violations to the County upon a question or complaint by a neighbor. For minor violations, we notify the homeowner in the hope that it is just an oversight and will be corrected. And, residents of Rose Hill Drive are reminded that the grass strip between the road and the sidewalk belongs to the Commonwealth of Virginia and parking on it is prohibited. We greatly appreciate the community effort to keep the grass cut on the strip in front of each house!

It blends both modern and historic sites, informing local citizens and visitors about the Franconia area. 
