President's Message

County Budget, Real Estate Taxes,

March 22nd Meeting

The Rose Hill Civic Association will discuss the upcoming County Budget and the tax increase proposed to support it at the Tuesday, March 22 meeting starting at 7 p.m. in the community room of the John Marshall Library. Members are encouraged to bring their thoughts and suggestions so RHCA can communicate a unified position to the Board of Supervisors. Of course, everyone has the right to respond individually. The County Executive and Board of Supervisors are proposing a four-cent per \$100 value of real estate tax increase this year. That translates to an average of more than \$300 per property countywide. Those of you who received an increased property evaluation can expect to pay more. The County continues to face a deficit based on projected spending. It should be noted that the School Board has requested an increase in excess of the Board of Supervisors' proposal. Schools account for more than 50 percent of spending in Fairfax County. We will have information available that describes proposed spending for all of the County agencies. Your comments and questions will form the basis of our response to the Board of Supervisors. Please come and participate in this grass roots discussion of County

no one can say they were not informed when cited for a property or vehicle violation. RHCA serves its members by forwarding complaints to the proper county or state agency. Our goal is to protect everyone's property value by keeping our community a safe, clean and enjoyable community in which to live.

Elections of Officers

The Rose Hill Civic Association Bylaws call for an election each March. Only members of the Association can vote. On behalf of the current officers, we urge you to get involved and consider becoming an officer. Each of us will happily turn over the reins without a whimper to anyone who will take on the chore. We will, however, continue on if there are no takers. We do need to fill the position of secretary. It entails keeping track of the approvals voted by the membership and helping the current officers with the day-to-day operation. We could use help in maintaining our membership and e-mail lists. Please contact any of the current officers if you are willing to help.

More Houses Coming Into Rose Hill

Another developer is going to try to consolidate and build as many as 12 houses on the Rock-A-By Lane property. The six-acres border Rose Hill Drive on the west, Willowood Lane on the east and Bee Street on the north. It currently is accessed by Lark Lane. The property is zoned R-3, the same as the rest of Rose Hill, so the developer can build by right if he satisfies all the County ordinances. In addition, there are a number of easements on the property for utilities and access to existing homes that will have to be dealt with. This is another in a long line of attempts to build more houses on the property. The owner of the silo property on May Boulevard plans to tear down the current structures and build 12 houses. That will be the end of the silos and their historic presence that makes Rose Hill and Franconia unique. We haven't heard of any activity on the two acres on Telegraph Road that borders Cottonwood Drive on the west and Rose Hill Drive on the north. It is bisected by a 40-foot storm drain easement and a water line crosses the property. It also contains marine clay, making development difficult and a nightmare for future and surrounding residents. The aforementioned parcels also are zoned R-3. That means

there will be no public hearing on the proposed development. Adjacent property owners hopefully will be notified on any plans to develop. If you are next to any of them and get a notice, please notify me so I can monitor the plans to at least make sure all the rules are followed. Given recent experience, we can't be sure the County staff will understand the issues and enforce the rules. Today, several years after the new homeowners moved into Rose Hill Reserve, we still are working to make sure the County enforces the rules. During the last big snow, the streets in Rose Hill Reserve weren't on the schedule to be plowed, apparently because no one had told VDOT that they were no longer the developer's responsibility. Thanks to Candy Watts, the Rose Hill Reserve HOA president, that situation was quickly resolved. Candy attends our RHCA meetings, so she knows how to make sure the rules are enforced! That's why it is important to have strong community associations.

At the March Lee District Land Use meeting, the landslides at Rose Hill Reserve were once again a part of a discussion involving a new development proposal behind Island Creek on Beulah Street. The proposed development had earlier been turned down by the committee, but was brought back for a second try. This time it passed by one vote. Given the marine clay issues on the site, and our problems here in Rose Hill, I voted against the proposal. The developer's engineer tried to gloss over the issues that caused the slides in Rose Hill Reserve and the long-time problems Rose Hill and many other Lee District residents have experience with foundation problems. I corrected his misinformation, but it wasn't enough to carry the day. I guess one has to have experienced the problems with marine clay first hand in order to understand its volatility. The big problem for me is the current County staff's failure to fully recognize the problems that can be caused by marine clay. The County engineers think there is a solution for every problem, but Mother Nature has other ideas. I will continue to voice concern about building on marine clay. The damage by shifting marine clay soil has been costly for many of you.

Spring Warning

Spring begins Sunday, March 20, and with it comes (if they haven't already started to arrive) the hucksters who want to trim your trees, resurface your driveway, repair winter damage and all sorts of chores. Make sure whomever you hire is PROPERLY LICENSED AND INSURED. Ask for a copy of their CURRENT Fairfax County license and an insurance certificate that clearly shows you will be protected from liability. Do not give anyone any money until a job is complete and you are satisfied with the product. The same goes for landscapers. There are plenty of companies operating in an around Rose Hill that are reputable performers. Give our local businesses the opportunity to do any work you might need. They have local reputations at stake and available should anything go wrong. The con artists spring forth this time of year. Don't let them find easy marks in Rose Hill

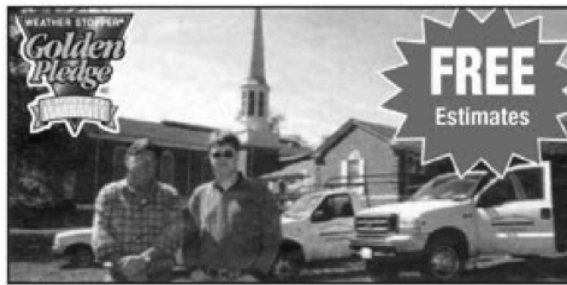

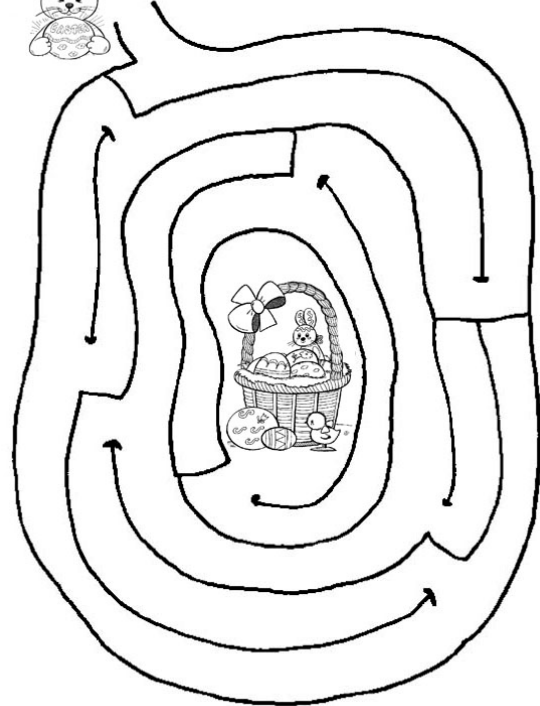
